



Ojibwe Language Immersion Elementary Teacher (Ojibwe-speaking Teacher)

Bdote's Vision: All students will develop a love of life-long learning, language and cultural fluency, the skills and education to determine their own future, and commitment to give back to family, community and nation.

Bdote's Mission: To develop culturally aware, successful, high performing students by providing them with an academically rigorous education that is place-based and rooted in the languages and cultures of indigenous peoples.

Job description:

Bdote teachers will provide core academic instruction in the Ojibwe language to be a combined classroom of K/1st, 2nd/3rd, 4th/5th, 6th/7th, and 8th grade students. Teachers will be responsible for implementing the place-based, language immersion curriculum that is aligned with Minnesota Academic Standards and that has been developed and/or adapted specifically for Bdote. Teachers will oversee and administer regular assessments of student academic progress and their developing language fluency. Teachers will work as a team to create a learning environment where cooperation, high expectations, and creativity are central to the student's educational experience.

Teachers will:

1. Prove the Possible – Student achievement through indigenous language immersion is our number one job.
2. Drive Results – Ensure high standards for student behavior, performance, and attendance
3. Instruction-
 - a. Deliver well planned and meaningful lessons
 - b. Use data to inform instruction
 - c. Build relationships and community with students and families
 - d. Exhibit a high degree of professionalism in all elements of this position
 - e. Serve as a positive model of our mission
4. Perform other duties as required and assigned – Teachers must demonstrate knowledge and support of Bdote's vision and mission, core values, standards, policies and procedures, operating instructions, confidentiality and code of ethical behavior

Mindset Required:

- Believe that working as a part of a team is more effective than working alone
- Possess a strong work ethic, self-awareness, resilience, humility

- A minimum of 2 years teaching in a high-need school with demonstrated student results
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills and ability to build trust with colleagues
- Growth mindset
