

Ojibwe Language Immersion Elementary Teacher (Ojibwe-speaking Teacher)

Job description

Bdote teachers will provide core academic instruction in the Ojibwe language to be a combined classroom of K/1st,2nd/3rd, 4th/5th, 6th/7th, and 8th grade students. Teachers will be responsible for implementing the place-based, language immersion curriculum that is aligned with Minnesota Academic Standards and that has been developed and/or adapted specifically for Bdote. Teachers will oversee and administer regular assessments of student academic progress and their developing language fluency. Teachers will work as a team to create a learning environment where cooperation, high expectations, and creativity are central to the student's educational experience.

Teachers will:

- 2. Drive Results Ensure high standards for student behavior, performance, and attendance
- 3. Instruction
 - a. Deliver well planned and meaningful lessons
 - b. Use data to inform instruction
