Bdote Learning Center is a year-round K-5 Ojibwe/Dakota immersion school in South Minneapolis. The mission of Bdote Learning Center is to develop culturally aware, successful, high performing students by providing them with an academically rigorous education that is place-based and rooted in the language and cultures of indigenous people.

Bdote is committed to unleashing the brilliance in every student, but especially those students from groups that have historically been failed by the education system. Toward this end, the school has incorporated many innovative features designed to enhance student learning, and build strong connections with families and the community including the following:

- ✓ Place-based education that immerses students in learning through the local history, culture, geography, environment, and people of the area and provides learning beyond the walls of the school

Bdote's Vision: All students will develop a love of lifelong learning, language and cultural fluency, the skills and education to determine their own future, and a commitment to give back to family, community, and nation.

Job Description:

Bdote teachers will provide interdisciplinary, core academic instruction in the Dakota language to 6th - 8th grade students. Teachers are responsible for implementing place-based, language immersion curriculum that is aligned with Minnesota Academic Standards. Teachers will oversee and administer regular assessments of student academic progress and their developing language fluency. Teachers will work as a team to create a learning environment where cooperation, high expectations, and creativity are central to the student's educational experience.

Teachers will:
