Cling On **Rrushes**

How to Care for Your Cling On Brushes. . .

When you first get your Cling On Brush let it absorb water before using it for the first time by soaking it in water 20 minutes. This is done so you get the proper flex. Remove excess water by spinning the handle between your hands or by wiping it back and forth on a paper towel and it is ready to use.



When painting, re-wet the brush as necessary by misting it with a spray bottle. Keeping the brush damp will prevent paint from hardening on the bristles and minimize the brush strokes

When you're finished painting just keep them hanging in water (NOT touching the bottom of the container). The bristle filaments are specially treated to release the paint. The next day almost all the paint will have left the brush. Then just wash and rinse, spin out the remaining water and you're ready to paint again or store the brush. The important thing here to remember is the bristles tips (about 1/2 inch) must be allowed to hang in the water BUT NOT touch the bottom.

Ideally Cling On brushes should be stored in something in an downward position and must NOT touch the bottom. By storing your brushes this way they will stay in perfect shape for a very long time and be Note: never remove strings as they keep bristles tight.
