


ANIMAL CRUELTY LAWS PROTECT FERAL CATS TOO

Cruelty to animals includes:

- Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly inflicting unnecessary physical injury on any animal
- Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly subjecting any animal to cruel mistreatment
- Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly subjecting any animal under the person's custody or control to cruel neglect or abandonment.





Penalties: Persons violating Arizona Revised Statute 13-2910, Cruelty to animals, by harming feral cats are guilty of a Class 6 Felony or a Class 1 Misdemeanor. Penalties include:

| | <u>Felony</u> | <u>Misdemeanor</u> |
|---------------|-----------------|--------------------|
| Probation: | Up to 3 years | Up to 3 years |
| Fines: | Up to \$150,000 | Up to \$2,500 |
| Imprisonment: | One Year* | Up to six months |
