# **O** DAY CAMP IN THE PARK

In mid-October, we had the incredible opportunity to hold a youth day camp at Lusaka National Park, bringing together 75 young people from diverse backgrounds for a day of worship, teaching, and fun. Thirty youth from Grace and Truth Ministries and 45 youth from the streets of Lusaka came together for a life-changing experience that will be remembered for years to come.

We arranged for two buses to transport the kids—one to pick up the youth from the church, and the other to collect the young people from the streets. The buses were packed to the brim, with kids sitting on each other's laps and even hanging out of the windows! The excitement and energy were palpable as the journey to the park began.

Upon arriving at the park, the youth were thrilled to drive through and witness the wildlife. The beautiful surroundings set the perfect tone for the day ahead. We then gathered at a scenic picnic area to begin our program.

The day kicked off with a time of worship and prayer, which quickly led into a teaching session where we shared the Word of God and the message of salvation through Jesus Christ. It was an incredible moment as almost every single youth prayed the sinner's prayer, clearly grasping the depth of the gospel and the significance of salvation. It was evident that these young people were not just hearing the message, but responding with open hearts, acknowledging that Jesus is the way.

After the teaching session, we distributed scriptures and clothing to each of the youth—gifts that were received with much joy and gratitude. The youth then had the chance to engage in a variety of activities, from football (soccer) to drama and other team-building exercises. For some, the peaceful atmosphere of the park was an invitation to take a well-deserved nap amidst the serenity of nature.

In the afternoon, Chad and Reverend Muke took the opportunity to connect with the youth one-on-one. They listened to testimonies of God's transformative work in the lives of these young people as a direct result of the ministry efforts. Many shared stories of how they had encountered God in their lives, finding hope, healing, and a new sense of purpose through the ministry's outreach.

It was truly inspiring to hear how God is working in the lives of these youth—bringing healing, hope, and salvation to those who often face great challenges in life. The day was a reminder of the power of God's love and the importance of ministry that reaches out to the most vulnerable in our communities.

As the day came to a close, there was a deep sense of unity and joy among the youth, knowing that they had encountered God in a powerful way and had made new friends who shared their faith. We are so grateful for all who made this day possible and for the hearts of the youth who participated.

We look forward to more opportunities like this to see lives changed and youth empowered to walk boldly in their faith. Thank you for your continued support in this ministry—together, we are making a lasting impact!

## **2** TRANSFORMING LIVES ONE SUNDAY AT A TIME

Since June 2024, Grace and Truth Ministries has embarked on a new outreach initiative that has been nothing short of transformative for both the children involved and the church community itself. Every Sunday morning, the church rents two buses and heads into the heart of Lusaka's Cairo Road area, offering a free ride to street kids and inviting them to join the church service and enjoy a hot meal afterward.

At first, the journey was filled with struggles. The street kids, who are used to being ignored or treated with indifference, were understandably skeptical. Compassion was a foreign concept to them, and many were hesitant to accept the offer of help. But as word spread that free food was being offered, 15-20 kids started showing up each Sunday. The church family welcomed them with open arms, providing as much food as they could and offering love and care that these children had rarely, if ever, received before.

This initiative has required a huge shift in how the church operates. Imagine inviting 20 kids off the streets every week to join your Sunday service—this small church, which can only hold around 100 people,

had to adjust to a whole new way of doing things. But despite the challenges, they welcomed the opportunity to serve these kids with open hearts.

Three months later, the program has grown exponentially. What began with a handful of children now sees 60 kids showing up consistently every week, with the buses packed to overflowing. The church has had to stretch its capacity to accommodate this growing group, and while they are thrilled with the impact, they are also limited by the size of their building.

This growth has been a testimony to the power of God's love in action. During a recent trip to Lusaka in October, Chad had the privilege of witnessing firsthand the profound relationship that has developed between the kids and the church leadership. As Chad and Reverend Chris Muke were driving down Cairo Road, they saw children running up to Pastor Chris, calling him "Papa" and hugging him tightly. It was a moment that brought tears to Chad's eyes, as he saw the deep, genuine love that Pastor Chris has for these kids.

There is something incredibly powerful about the way God is moving through this ministry. These children, who once lived in isolation and neglect, are now finding hope, love, and community in the arms of Grace and Truth Ministries. And this is only the beginning. The church is eager to reach even more children, but they need your prayers and support as they continue to navigate the challenges of growth.

But praise God, just look at her now! The transformation is nothing short of miraculous, and we are overjoyed to share her progress with you. The photo below shows Blessing, now wearing new clothes and beaming with a big smile. We are thrilled to report that Blessing is no longer living on the streets. Through the love and support of Grace and Truth Ministries, she has been reunited with her mother—a reunion that, at first, seemed impossible.

You may be wondering how this happened. Blessing's initial decision to leave home was due to her mother's severe struggles with alcohol and other challenges. Life had become unbearable for Blessing, so she sought refuge on the streets. But God had a plan. In a beautiful turn of events, Blessing not only returned to her mother but also brought her mother to church. Together, they have been attending

every Sunday for the past couple of months, and their lives are being transformed. Blessing's courage to restore her family has brought hope not only to her but also to her mom.

In late October, Chad had the opportunity to sit down with Blessing during the youth day camp, where he was able to hear firsthand about her progress. And here's even more good news: Blessing has been registered for school! She is set to begin her studies at the start of the next semester in January, a bright new chapter in her life that will set her on a path toward a brighter future.

This is truly a story only God could write. From a street child with no hope, to a young girl reuniting with her mother, attending church, and preparing to go back to school—it is a testament to God's grace and the power of a community of believers coming together to love and care for the least of these. We are so excited for Blessing's future and deeply grateful for your prayers and support that make stories like hers possible.

#### **4** STORY: LEADER JOE

Joe's story is nothing short of powerful—a true testimony to the transforming, redeeming power of God. It's a living example that no one is beyond the reach of God's grace, and that no matter how far someone has fallen, God can always turn their life around.

Joe has played a crucial role in supporting the ministry. He actively promotes the church and encourages street kids to come, giving them a sense of hope and belonging they never had before. He helps organize, manage, and lead the youth, bringing structure and leadership to the outreach.

During the recent youth day camp, we had the privilege of spending time with Joe and hearing his heart for the young people he serves. His passion for getting these kids off the streets and into a better life is evident in everything he does. Joe has become a father figure to nearly 200 kids living on the streets, offering help when they are in desperate need—mostly for food. While his heart is pure, and his desire to help these kids is sincere, Joe has been faced with a difficult dilemma: in order to meet their needs, he has, at times, resorted to seeking money through ungodly ways. His most heartfelt prayer is for the means to support these kids in a way that honors God.

In response to this need, the ministry team felt God's leading to bless Joe with seed money to start his own business—one that would allow him to raise money in a way that aligns with his faith and values. After much prayer and discernment, Joe shared his dream of owning a shoe business. He's always had a passion for shoes and saw it as an opportunity not only to provide for himself but also to sustain his ministry to the street kids.

So, in a step of faith, Reverend Chris Muke and Joe went shopping at a few local shoe wholesalers to purchase the initial stock of shoes to kickstart Joe's new business venture. With the new shoes in hand, Joe is now officially the owner of his very own shoe shop!
