Application for Temporary Land Use Permit

The Alaska Department of Natural Resources, Division of Oil and Gas (Division) received a Land Use Permit application on May 13, 2025, from STaX Capital Partners, LLC (StaX) requesting authorization to use up to 30 acres of available pad space at the Franklin Bluffs pad for Phase 1 of a power generation project in support of Bitcoin mining. The Franklin Bluffs pad is approximately 35 miles south of Deadhorse, along the Dalton Highway. STaX plans to place 10 megawatt mobile gas turbine generator sets to power 50 megawatts of modular Bitcoin mining pods at the pad. The Phase 1 project is temporary and will serve as a proof-of-concept for potential future development.
