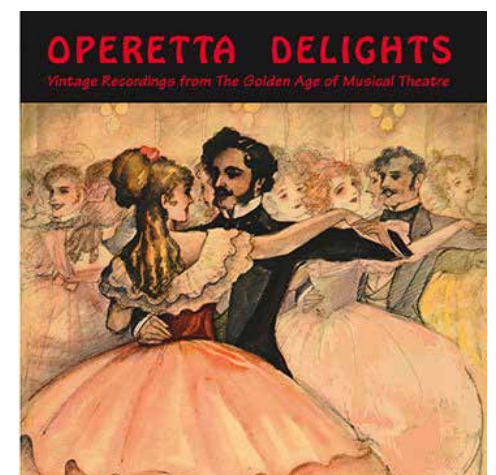

RÄTSEL

Es geschah im Jahr 1855 in Berlin, nach jahrelangen Verhandlungen, dass der Berliner Polizeipräsident Karl von Hinkeldey dem Drucker E.L. die erste Genehmigung erteilte, "Annoncier-Säulen" zu errichten, denn die umsichgreifende Wildplakatierung in der ganzen Stadt gab dem Stadtbild ein unfreundliches Aussehen. Die Berliner erkannten gleich den Vorteil dieses Werbemediums und den ersten 100 Werbesäulen folgten 50 mehr in 1865. Die Kunden konnten sich darauf verlassen, dass ihre Plakate ohne Überklebungen gesehen werden konnten. Die neuesten Nachrichten und auch allgemeine Neuigkeiten waren hier für alle kostenlos lesbar. Während der Kriegsjahre 1870/71 wurden hier die ersten Kriegsdepeschen veröffentlicht und diese Säulen funktionierten auch als Telefonkabelverzweiger oder Transformatorenstation durch Gebrauch des hohlen Innenraums.

Es gibt ca. 51.000 dieser Werbeträger in ganz Deutschland. In Wien werden die werbenden Hohlzylinder als Notausstieg vom gedeckt verlaufenden Wienflusses benutzt, die mit steinernen Wendeltreppen aus der Tiefe führen, um sie vor Unbefugten zu schützen. Sie haben eine Tür, die sich von außen nur mit einem Schlüssel, jedoch von innen auch ohne öffnen lässt. Andere Verwendungen dieser Reklamsäulen,



auch Pillar genannt, sind Terminals oder Telefone, die in deren Innenraum eingebaut sind. Seit 2015 hat Nürnberg öffentliche Toiletten installiert, die für eine geringe Gebühr von jedermann benutzt werden kann. So erfreuen sich auch heute noch die Werbeträger großer Beliebtheit, was mit dem Berliner Drucker E.L. angefangen hat. Sie tragen stolz seinen Namen. Wie heißen diese Säulen? Die Antwort irgendwo im Bulletin versteckt!

RIDDLE

It was in 1855 in Berlin after yearlong negotiations that the police president, Karl von Hinkeldey, first gave permission to the printer E.L. to put up announcement columns, because the generally wide spread use of indiscriminate placed up

ads gave the city an unfriendly appearance. The people of Berlin immediately recognized the advantage of this advertising medium and after the first 100 columns, 50 more followed in 1865. The customers could depend on the fact that their posters could be viewed without anyone posting something on top of them. The most recent news and general information was made available for all without cost to them. During the war years of 1870/71 the latest war-telegrams were published, and these columns functioned as telephone cable network or transformer stations by making use of the hollow interior.

There are about 51,000 of these advertisement pillars in Germany. In Vienna these hollow ad cylinders are used as emergency exits from the covered running Vienna River. Spiral stone staircases lead to the street level, and to protect them from unauthorized use, they have a door which can only be opened from the outside with a key but can be excited from the inside without one. Other uses of the ad columns, also called Pillars, are terminals or telephones, built inside. In 2015 Nürnberg installed public toilets, which, for a small charge can be used by everyone. So even today these advertisement carriers enjoy great popularity, all of which started with the Berlin printer E.L. They proudly carry his name. What are these pillars called? Answer hidden somewhere in this Bulletin. ~ Barbara Oberding

ALOIS ALZHEIMER

Alois Alzheimer was born in Marktbreit, Germany in 1864. Alzheimer excelled in science and attended the Universities of Berlin, Tübingen, and Würzburg where he graduated with a medical degree in 1887. The following year, Alzheimer started his residency at the Hospital for the Mentally Ill and Epileptics in Frankfurt and stayed seven years, eventually being promoted to senior physician. Alzheimer studied psychology and neuropathology, partnered with Franz Nissl, a distinguished neurologist, conducted investigations on the nervous system and published a comprehensive six-volume study



of the brain. In 1901, Alzheimer met Auguste Deter, a 51-year-old woman with strange behavior symptoms

and increasing short-term memory loss. When Deter died, Alzheimer had her patient records and brain brought to the University Psychiatric laboratory in Munich. He examined the brain in detail and found irregular plaques and tangles that indicated senile dementia. Later, this senile dementia was named Alzheimer's disease in honor of Alois Alzheimer. Alzheimer's work

in 1906 was remarkable in that his same investigative methods to identify the disease are used today one hundred and thirteen years later. Alois Alzheimer, a constant cigar smoker, died in 1915 of heart failure at the age of 51. *Barbara Streit*

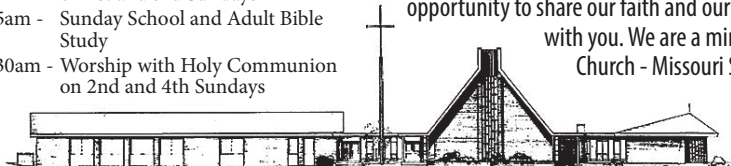
