
RHEINISCHER SÄNGERBUND

Traum für Autoliebhaber – **Automuseen in Deutschland**

Der Deutsche Club veranstalten Spanner Veranstaltungen für Autoliebhaber, wie den BMW-, Mercedes- und VW-Biergarten. Ein Manko: Es gibt nicht genügend Autos zu bestaunen. Wer mehr Autos sehen möchte, sollte eine Reise nach Deutschland in Erwägung ziehen und die Museen der Automobilhersteller besuchen. Für alle Mercedes- und Porsche-Fans ist das Ziel klar: Stuttgart, Heimat der Unternehmenszentralen von Mercedes und Porsche und ihrer spektakulären Automuseen. Obwohl die beiden Museen an entgegengesetzten Enden von Stuttgart liegen, ist es möglich, beide an einem Tag zu besuchen. Informieren Sie sich auf der jeweiligen Museums-Webseite über aktuelle Sonderausstellungen und bestellen Sie dort ihre Tickets. Das Mercedes-Benz Museum zeigt rund 160 Fahrzeuge. Zu den Exponaten gehören eine Replik des ersten motorisierten Fahrzeugs, ein originaler Silberpfeil-Rennwagen aus den 1930er-Jahren und der berühmte 300 SL mit Flügeltüren aus den 1950er-Jahren. Insgesamt veranschaulichen die ausgestellten Fahrzeuge über 130 Jahre innovative Automobiltechnik. Das Porsche-Museum präsentiert über 80 Fahrzeuge und veranschaulicht damit die technologischen Meilensteine in der Entwicklung dieser Hochleistungsmaschinen. Neben Serienmodellen wie dem Porsche 356 oder dem 911 finden Besucher auch seltene Porsche Rennwagen. Mit etwas Planung lässt sich der Museumsbesuch mit einer Führung durch das Porsche-Werk kombinieren. Für eingefleischte BMW-Fans ist München natürlich das Hauptziel, denn dort befindet sich der Hauptsitz und das Automobilmuseum des BMW-Konzerns. Das Museum zeigt Beispiele aller BMW-Produkte, darunter Motorräder, Flugzeugmotoren und vieles mehr. Mit über 100 ausgestellten BMW-Fahrzeugen ist der Besuch für alle Autofans Johnenswert. Planen Sie bei Ihrem Museumsbesuch zusätzliche Zeit für die BMW Welt ein. Diese befindet sich in einem futuristischen Gebäude in der Nähe des Museums. Die BMW Welt zeigt alle aktuellen Automodelle der BMW-Gruppe, die aus BMW, Mini und Rolls-Royce besteht. Natürlich haben Audi und VW ihre eigenen Automuseen. Audi-Fans müssen nach Ingolstadt fahren, wo das Audi Automuseum integrierter Bestandteil des Audi Forums ist. Mit rund 100 ausgestellten Fahrzeugen veranschaulicht das Museum die Abfolge der Ereignisse, die zur Entstehung des heutigen Automobilherstellers Audi führten. Das AutoMuseum Volkswagen, das von einer gemeinnützigen Organisation betrieben wird, befindet sich in Wolfsburg, ganz im Norden Deutschlands. Das Museum verfügt über eine Sammlung von 130 verschiedenen VW-Modellen. Einige sind sehr selten, einige einzigartig – ein Muss für eingefleischte VW-Fans. Der VW-Konzern betreibt im Rahmen seines Erlebnisparks Autostadt in Wolfsburg ein Automuseum namens "Zeithaus". Das Zeithaus zeigt 260 historische Fahrzeuge von mehr als 60 Marken. Wegen all dieser Aktivitäten rund um Autos sollte Wolfsburg unbedingt auf der Wunschliste eines Autoliebhabers stehen.

Car Enthusiasts Dream – Car **Museums in Germany**

The Deutscher Club of Clark has some exciting events for car enthusiasts - the BMW, Mercedes and VW Biergartens. There is one shortcoming, not enough cars to look at. Anyone who would like to see more cars should consider a trip to Germany and visit the car manufacturers museums. For all Mercedes and Porsche fans the destination is clear: Stuttgart, home to the Mercedes and Porsche corporate headquarters and their spectacular car museums. Although the two



possible to visit both in one day. Check the respective museum web page to learn about current special exhibitions and to order tickets. The Mercedes Benz Museum has a collection of about 160 cars on display. Among the exhibits are a replica of the first motorized vehicle, an original silver arrow racing car from the 1930s and the famous 300SL with gullwing doors built in the 1950s. All together the cars on display illustrate over 130 years of innovative car engineering. The Porsche Museum has more than 80 cars on display, highlighting the technological milestones in the development of these high-performance machines. Next to regular production models like the Porsche 356 or 911 the visitors will find rarely seen, special Porsche racing cars. With some advanced planning it might be possible to combine the museum visit with a tour of the Porsche factory. For the hard-core BMW fans the main destination is of course Munich, home to the headquarters and car museum of the BMW corporation. The museum has examples of all BMW products on display; that includes motorcycles, airplane engines and more. However, with more than 100 BMW cars included in the exhibition, it's a worthwhile visit for all car fans. When visiting the museum, plan for extra time to see BMW World, located in a futuristic building close to the museum. BMW World displays all current car models of the BMW group, made up by BMW, Mini, and Rolls-Royce. Of course, Audi and VW have car museums of their own. Audi fans will have to travel to Ingolstadt, where the Audi car museum is an integrated part of the Audi Forum. With approximately 100 cars on display, the museum visualizes events leading to the formation of the current Audi car company. The Auto Museum Volkswagen, managed by a non-profit, is in Wolfsburg, all the way in the north of Germany. The museum has a collection of 130 different VW models. Some are very rare, a few are unique, a must see for die hard VW fans. The VW corporation runs a car museum named the "Zeithaus" as part of their Autostadt Adventure Park, found in Wolfsburg. The Zeithaus has an exhibition of 260 historic cars from more than 60 brands. With all these activities centered around cars, Wolfsburg certainly should be on a car enthusiasts bucket list.

MILTON S. HERSHEY — CHOCOLATIER

Milton S. Hershey was born in 1857 near Hockersville, Pennsylvania to Mennonites, Henry, and Veronica (Suavely) Hershey of German and Swiss descent. Hershey had a challenging time in school and dropped out after fourth grade. He tried an apprenticeship with a printer but failed and was fired. His mother next set him up with a local confectioner in Lancaster, PA where he stayed for four years and flourished. In 1876, Hershey set up his own candy shop in Philadelphia, but after six years, it failed. An attempt to manufacture his own candy in NYC resulted again in failure. Returning to his roots in Lancaster, after a short detour to Denver, and borrowing \$150 from his aunt, he finally had success making caramels with fresh milk, an innovation not used in the eastern part of the country. Hershey's Lancaster Caramel Company continued to make caramels in the 1890's until Hershey became interested in chocolate. In 1900, Hershey sold his caramel company for 1 million dollars and concentrated on perfecting his formula for chocolate bars. He went to Germany to learn and develop the formula known as the Hershey Process using milk that would not spoil. This process is still a trade secret to this day. In 1903, he built a factory on land that later became Hershey, PA. The Hershey Kiss was born in 1907 and became an instant success. Next, Hershey concentrated on enlarging his factory and building a town for his workers. Unable to have any children of their own, Hershey and his wife established the Hershey Industrial School and transferred

most of his assets, including the control of the company, to the school. In addition, the school renamed Milton Hershey School in 1951, also controls the Park, Hotel, Museum, Gardens, Theatre, and the Community Archives. A gift to the state of PA in 1963 enabled the construction of the Penn State Milton S. Hershey Medical Center. Among Hershey's other achieve-

ments were the contract during WWII for chocolate bar rations, production for war time tank parts and machines, a birthday (Sept. 13) celebrated as National Chocolate Day, and a stamp honoring Hershey as a philanthropist. Milton Hershey died in 1945 and is buried next to his wife and family members in the Hershey Cemetery.
