Das Osterei

In wenigen Wochen werde viele Meschen in der Welt das Osterfest begehen. Zu diesem Festtag gehören viele Gebräuche in verschiedenen Arten und Ausführungen. Ein Gebrauch ist allerding ein fester Bestandteil bei diesem Festtag, das Osterei. Bunt und mit erfinderischen Mustern, gibt es wohl bei jedem der Ostern als einen Feiertag begeht. Ostereier zu verschenken, ist ein uralter Brauch, denn Eier gelten rund um die Welt als Symbol für Fruchtbarkeit. Schon bei den alten Ägyptern und den Chinesen wurden bunte Eier zum Frühlingsanfang verteilt. Dort und auch bei den Germanen und Griechen galt ebenso der Hase als Zeichen großer Fruchtbarkeit. Warum und seit wann der Hase aber in Deutschland und in andren Ländern die Eier bringt, bleibt ein wenig rätselhaft. Tatsache ist, dass "Meister Lampe" als Eierlieferant mindestens 300 Jahre auf seinem Rücken hat. 1682 schrieb ein Medizinprofessor einen Bericht, der einen elsässischen Osterbrauch mit eierlegendem Hasen beschreibt. Davor brachten - je nach Region - auch andere Fabeltier wie

Kranich. Hahn. Fuchs oder Lamm die bunten Eier. Letztlich hat sich der flinke "Meister Lampe" im Laufe der Zeit zum wahren Helden des Osterfestes entwickelt. Im Heimatland wird Ostern auch heute noch in verschiedenen Gegenden mit großartigen gefeiert, Dekorationen wobei das bunte Osterei die Hauptrolle spielt. Es gibt viele Techniken, um das Ei zum Kunstwerk zu erheben.

The Easter Egg

In a few weeks, many people in the world will celebrate Easter. This feast day includes many customs in diverse types and designs. However, one practice is an integral part of this feast day, the Easter Egg. Colorful and with inventive patterns, everyone who celebrates Easter as a holiday will have these little treasures. Giving away Easter eggs is an



ancient custom, because eggs are considered a symbol of fertility around the world. Even the ancient Egyptians and the Chinese distributed colorful eggs at the beginning of spring. There, as well as among the Germanic tribes and Greeks, the hare was also considered a sign of great fertility. But why and since when the hare delivers the eggs in Germany and other countries remains a bit of a mystery. The fact is that "Master Lampe", as an egg supplier, has at least 300 years on his back. In 1682, a professor of medicine wrote a report describing an Alsatian Easter custom with an egg-laying hare. Before that, depending on the region, other mythical animals such as cranes, roosters, foxes or lambs also delivered colorful eggs. Ultimately, the nimble "Master Lampe" has developed over time into the true hero of Easter. In the homeland, Easter is still celebrated today in various areas with great decorations, with the colorful Easter egg playing the main role. Hedy Lamarr – The Smart Beauty



Hedwig Eva Maria Kiesler was born in Vienna in 1914 into a prosperous family. She was privately schooled from



the age of four. By age ten, she could speak four languages, play the piano, and dance. At age sixteen, she attended Max Reinhardt's Berlin drama school and made her movie debut in Geld auf der Strasse (Money on the Street). In 1932, stardom and publicity followed Kiesler after she appeared nude in Extase (Ecstasy), a Czech film. Hedwig then married the Austrian munitions manufacturer Fritz Mandle. Finding Mandle controlling and associating with people that she did not like, she divorced him in 1937 and went to Hollywood. In Hollywood, she changed her name to Hedy Lamarr and signed a contract with MGM. Lamarr demonstrated skill as an actor in Tortilla Flat, White Cargo, Samson and Delilah and many other films in the 1940's. Besides her film career, Lamarr showed interest in science and technology that she had followed as a young girl with her father. As WWII was in full progress, Lamarr and a fellow musician named George Antheil developed a secret communication system intended for use as a radio guidance device for US Navy torpedoes. In 1942, they patented their device. Hedy is credited with her legal name at the time, Hedy Kiesler Markey. The technology they developed is like legacy versions of CDMA and Wi-Fi. It was not used until the 1960's when it was incorporated into Bluetooth and GPS. Hedy Lamarr became a naturalized citizen of the US in 1953. She was honored by a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame in 1960. Lamarr was married and divorced six times, had three children and spent her last thirty-five years in seclusion in Florida. Hedy Lemarr died in 2000 at the age of 85. Her ashes were scattered by her son in Austria's Vienna Woods in accordance with her wishes. Posthumous awards included naming of a quantum telescope on the roof of the University of Vienna for Hedy Lamarr, a google doodle and an asteroid named 32730 Lamarr. In 2014, Hedy Lamarr and George Antheil were inducted into the National Inventors Hall of Fame. Barbara Streit
