CASPAR DAVID FRIEDRICH -MALER DER ERHABENHEIT

In diesem Jahr jährt sich der Geburtstag von Caspar David Friedrich zum 250. Mal. Sie haben vielleicht noch nie von Caspar David Friedrich gehört; aber es ist wahrscheinlich, dass Sie eines seiner Gemälde gesehen haben. Für viele Kunstliebhaber gilt Caspar David Friedrich als der größte Maler seiner Zeit. Er war einer der ersten bildenden Künstler der deutschen Romantik, einer Bewegung, in der Künstler in ihren Werken den Schwerpunkt auf Natur, Emotion und Spiritualität legten. Caspar David Friedrich (FRIEDRICH) wurde am 5. September 1774 in Greifswald, einer kleinen Hafenstadt an der Ostsee, als sechstes von zehn Kindern geboren. Sein Vater, ein wohlhabender Kerzen- und Seifenhersteller, soll seine Kinder im lutherischen Glauben nach den Prinzipien des Pietismus erzogen haben. Als er aufwuchs, musste FRIEDRICH eine Reihe dramatischer Ereignisse durchleben. Einige Kunstkritiker führen die allgegenwärtige Melancholie in den Werken von FRIEDRICH auf diese Kindheitsereignisse zurück, natürlich könnten auch andere Gründe dazu beigetragen haben. Im Jahr 1790 begann FRIEDRICH privaten Unterricht zu nehmen, in Zeichnen bei Johann Gottfried Quistorp und in Literatur bei Thomas Thorild. Thorild lehrte FRIEDRICH zwischen dem geistigen "inneren Auge" und dem weniger nutzbringendem physischen "äußeren Auge" zu unterscheiden. Quistorp und Thorild waren beide Professoren an der Universität Greifswald. Im Jahr 1794 schrieb sich FRIEDRICH an der Königlich Dänischen Akademie für Malerei, Bildhauerei und Architektur in Kopenhagen ein, einer der renommiertesten Kunsthochschulen seiner Zeit. Dort setzte er seine Ausbildung bei namhaften Künstlern wie Christian August Lorentzen und Jens Juel fort. Im Jahr 1798 ließ sich FRIEDRICH endgültig in Dresden nieder. Der Durchbruch als Künstler gelang ihm 1805, nachdem er einen von Johann Wolfgang von Goethe veranstalteten Kunstwettbewerb gewonnen hatte. Im Jahr 1808 vollendete FRIEDRICH sein erstes wichtiges Ölgemälde, "Das

Kreuz im Gebirge". Dieses Gemälde löste eine öffentliche Kontroverse aus, weil eine Landschaft in einem religiösen Kontext verwendet wurde. Die entstandene Kontroverse bereitete FRIEDRICH breite öffentliche Aufmerksamkeit. Nachdem der preußische Kronprinz zwei seiner Gemälde gekauft hatte, wurde er 1810 in die Berliner Akademie gewählt und 1816 wurde FRIEDRICH in die Sächsischen Akademie aufgenommen. FRIEDRICH war einige Jahre lang relativ erfolgreich, er wurde sogar vom russischen Königshaus gefördert. Seine Karriere

begann darunter zu leiden, als das öffentliche Interesse an Kunstwerken der Realismus- und Naturalismusbewegung zunahm. In diesen Jahren war er weiterhin produktiv, bis er 1835 einen Schlaganfall erlitt, der seinen rechten Arm teilweise lähmte. Nach einem zweiten Schlaganfall im Jahr 1838 konnte er nicht mehr arbeiten und war vollständig auf die Unterstützung von seinen wenigen noch verbliebenen Freunde angewiesen. FRIEDRICH starb am 7. Mai 1840 in Armut. Heute

gilt Caspar David Friedrich als Ikone der deutschen Romantik und als Maler von internationaler Bedeutung. Zu Ehren seines 250. CASPAR DAVID FRIEDRICH – **PAINTER OF SUBLIMITY**

This year is the 250th anniversary of Caspar David Friedrich's birthday. You might not have heard of Caspar David Friedrich, but chances are you have come across one of his paintings. Many art lovers consider Caspar David Friedrich (FRIEDRICH) as the greatest painter of his time. He was one of the first visual artists of German Romanticism, a movement where artists emphasized nature, emotion and spirituality in their works. FRIEDRICH was born on the 5th of September 1774 in Greifswald, a small port city on the Baltic Sea, as the sixth of ten children. His father, a prosperous candle and soap maker, was said to raise his children in the Luther-

an faith following the principles of pietism. Growing up, he had to live through a series of traumatic events. Some art critics attribute the ever-present melancholy in his work to these childhood events, of course other reasons could have contributed to this as well. In 1790. FRIEDRICH started to take private lessons in drawing with the Johann Gottfried Quistorp, and in literature with Thomas Thorild. Thorild taught FRIEDRICH to distinguish between the spiritual "inner eye" and the less beneficial physical "outer eye". Quistorp and Thorid both had professor positions at the University of Greifswald. In 1794, FRIEDRICH enrolled in the Royal Danish Academy of Painting, Sculpture, and Architecture in Copenha-

> gen, one of the most prestigious art colleges at that time. There he continued his training with well-regarded artists like Christian August Lorentzen and Jens Juel. In 1798, FRIEDRICH settled permanently in Dresden. His breakthrough as an artist happened in 1805, after he had won an art competition organized by Johann Wolfgang von Goethe. In 1808, FRIEDRICH completed his first major oil painting, "Cross in the Mountains". This painting caused a public controver-

sy because of using a landscape in a religious context. Nevertheless, this dispute brought him widespread public attention. In 1810, after the Prussian Crown Prince had bought two of his paintings, he was elected to the Berlin Academy and in 1816 he became a member of the Saxon Academy. For a few years FRIEDRICH was relatively successful, he even was sponsored by the Russian Royal family. His career started to suffer when the public became more interested in art works belonging to the Realism and Naturalism movements. He continued to be productive during these years until he suffered a stroke in 1835, partially paralyzing his right arm. In 1838, after he had a second stroke, he was not able to work any longer and was fully dependent on the support from the few friends he still had left. FRIEDRICH died on May 7th, 1840, in poverty. Today Caspar David Friedrich is considered an icon of the German Romantic movement, and a painter of international importance. In Honor of his 250th Birthday several museums in Germany feature special exhibitions of his work. If you happen to visit Germany in 2024, take some time to go and see one these exhibitions. JOHN ERNST STEINBECK

John Ernst Steinbeck was born in Salinas, California in 1902. Steinbeck's paternal grandfather, Johann Adolf Grossteinbeck, shortened the family name to Steinbeck when he arrived in the United States in 1858. The family farm in Heiligenhaus, Mettmann, Germany is still named Grossteinbeck. John Steinbeck grew up working on local ranches during the summer and being encouraged to read and write by his schoolteacher mother. After attending Stanford University without graduating, he left California for New York City to pursue his writing but returned home without getting any of his work published. Steinbeck's luck changed when his first novel, Cup of Gold based on the pirate Henry Morgan's life and death was published in 1929. Thirty-one more novels followed including the acclaimed Tortilla Flat, which won California's Commonwealth Club's gold medal. Other works include Of Mice and Men, Grapes of Wrath, East of Eden, Cannery Row and The Pearl. Many of Steinbeck's writings were made into films for which he sometimes wrote the scripts. In 1940 he won the Pulitzer Prize for Literature for *The Grapes of Wrath*. In his later years he traveled cross-country in a camper with his dog writing Travels with Charley: In Search of America. During World War II, John Steinbeck served as a correspondent for the New York Herald Tribune newspaper. In 1945, he won the Norwegian Haakon VII Medal of Freedom for his literary contributions to the Norwegian resistance movement. In 1962, Steinbeck received the Nobel Prize for Literature "for his realistic and imaginative writings". John Steinbeck died of heart disease in his home in NYC in 1968 and was buried in his hometown Salinas, California. -Barbara Streit


