We have planned the hikes for the next few months so that you can get them on your calendar. We meet at **9:50** in the parking lot (details to be provided





Fußball Kultur im Kohlenpott

Mein letzter Beitrag zur DCC Bulletin war ein kleiner Einblick in Deutschland's "Schatzkammer", das Ruhrgebiet. Heute nun wird von einem wichtigen Teil in der Kohlenpott Geschichte berichtet, der Fußball. Allen Klischees vom Ruhrgebietsfußball als "Sport der einfachen Arbeiter" zum Trotz – wie überall in Deutschland fasste auch hier das britische Spiel zunächst in

den höheren Schulen Fuß. Typisch für die Anfänge des Fußballs in Deutschland ist die Gründung des FC Witten 1892: Der erste Fußballverein des Ruhrgebiets wurde von Schülern des Wittener Realgymnasiums ins Leben gerufen. Fußball war zunächst ein Vergnügen des gehobenen Bürgertums. Menschen, die hard und viel arbeiten wie die Bergleute, müßen einen gesunden Ausgleich haben. Das war, und ist, der Fußball.



Viele Vereine im Ruhrgebiet gab es durch Jahrzehnte und sind ein wichtiger Bestandteil im Leben der Menschen. Ein besonderer Fußballverein, FC Schalke 04, ist ein professioneller Sport Verein und liegt im Stadtteil Schalke in der Großstadt Gelsenkirchen. Dieser wurde im Jahre 1904 gegründet, daher die Nummer 04 im Namen. Das Prunkstück, die Kampfbahn Glückauf, das alte Stadion des Vereines aus seiner goldenen Zeit in den 1930er und 1940er Jahren, steht heute unter Denkmalschutz. Der Name Glückauf zeigt die Symbiose von Bergbau und Fußball. Bergleute begrüßen sich mit dem Wort Glückauf und ist bis heute ein Bestandteil der Begrüßungsform. Viele andere Städte im Ruhrgebiet haben erfolgreiche Fußball Ligas und noch heute ist dieser Sport ein wichtiger Teil des alltäglichen Lebens. Und nicht nur im Ruhrgebiet sondern in ganz Europa. Soccer Culture in the Kohlenpott Region

My last contribution to the DCC Bulletin was a small look inside Germany's Schatzkammer (Treasury), the Ruhr area. Today, an important part in the Kohlenpott history is this article's subject, football (soccer). Despite all the stereotypes of football in the Ruhr area as a "sport of the common workers" - as everywhere in Germany, the British game initially gained a foothold in the

secondary schools. Typical of the beginnings of football in Germany is the founding of FC Witten in 1892: The first football club in the Ruhr area was brought into being by students from the Witten secondary school. Football was initially a pleasure for the upper middle class. People who work hard, like miners, must have a healthy balance. That was and is, Football. Many clubs in the Ruhr area have

existed for decades and are an important part of people's lives. A special football club, FC Schalke 04, is a professional sports club and is in the Schalke district of the city of Gelsenkirchen. It was founded in 1904, hence the number 04 in the name. A showpiece, The Glückauf arena, the club's old stadium from its golden age in the 1930s and 1940s, is now listed on the registry of historical buildings. The name Glückauf shows the symbiosis of mining and football. Miners greet each other with the word Glückauf and is still a greeting used today. Many other cities in the Ruhr area have successful soccer leagues and this sport is still an important part of everyday life today, not just in the Ruhr area, but throughout Europe. The UEFA 2020, European Championship, televised around the world, had millions of viewers, proof that this sport has not yet passed away.

Manfred von Richthofen – The Red Baron

aron Manfred von Richthofen was born in 1892 into an affluent family in Breslau, Germany (now Wroclaw, Poland). He spent his time hunting and playing sports before enrolling in military school at age 11. After eight years as a cadet, he was commissioned as a lieutenant in the 1st Uhlan Cavalry Regiment of the Prussian Army. As a member of this unit during World War I, Richthofen fought in Russia, Belgium and France. When the military changed to trench warfare, cavalry fighting stopped. Richthofen then joined the infantry, but in 1916, he transferred to the Imperial Air Service as an observer on reconnaissance missions, and in time, he became a combat fighter pilot. By

1917, Richthofen's shooting precision had downed 16 enemy planes. Manfred von Richthofen was presented the "Blue Max", Germany's most important military medal. Next came the command of a fighter squadron, which included his younger brother Lothar, and the painting of his Albatros D III fighter plane a blood red color. This paint gave him the nicknames "the Red Baron", "the Red Battle Flier", and "the Red Knight". That same year, Richthofen became the most feared flier when he scored 52 Allied planes hits. In April of 1918, Richthofen was shot down by either Australian machine gunners on the ground, or a Canadian pilot. Manfred von Richthofen's total of 80 aerial victories proved to be the most



of any pilot during WWI. His mysterious death, and his legend, became the subject of many books, films, songs, comic strips (Snoopy), and television programs that continue to this day.
