DID YOU KNOW THAT THE DEUTSCHER CLUB HAS AN AED?



An AED or automated external defibrillator is a portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the life-threatening cardiacarrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation and pulseless ventricular tachycardia, and is able to treat them through defibrillation,

the application of electricity which stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an effective rhythm. The AED can be used by anyone with no medical training as everything is fully automated.



DER RATSKELLER

ir alle haben schon wenigsten einmal unseren Ratskeller im DC benutzt. Sei es für Festlichkeiten, Versammlungen oder kulturelle Ereignisse. Es ist ein gemütlicher Raum mit viel Charm und Charakter.

deutschsprachigen Ländern kann man den Rastkeller in vielen Orten besuchen. Angefangen hat er als "Weinkeller" im Rathaus der Städte und weil dort die "Männer des Rates" gerne Erholung vom täglichen "Rat geben" suchten, wurde dieser Raum Ratskeller genannt. Der Bremer Ratskeller in der Stadt Bremen in Deutschland, erbaut 1405, ist einer der ältesten und wurde zunächst als Weinhandel benutzt. Heute wird der Begriff Ratskeller in vielen Ländern gebraucht und gibt uns ein wohliges Gefühl. Er muss nicht nur in einem Rathaus liegen. Jede Bar, Taverne oder Restaurant kann einen Ratskeller haben.

In englischer Sprach wird er oft als Rathskeller geschrieben; wohl, weil man vom Wort Ratte (Rat) abstand nehmen wollte. In NYC gab es schon im 19. Jahrhundert Einrichtungen mit dieser Schreibweise. Beim nächsten Besuch in unserem Ratskeller, schaue Dich um und entdecke Schönheiten, die Dir bislang nicht aufgefallen sind.

THE RATSKELLER

We all have, at least once, visited our Ratskeller at the DC. Perhaps for festive activities, meetings or cultural events. It is a cozy room with lots of charm and character.

In German speaking countries you will find a Ratskeller in almost every town or village. It started as a "Wine cellar" in the basement of City Halls, so that the council men "who gave advice" (der Rat) had a place to relax. Therefore, it became the "Ratskeller". The Bremer Ratskeller in the town of Bremen in Germany, erected in 1405, is one of the oldest Ratskeller still in existence. It was first used as a wine trading place. Today the term Ratskeller is being used in many countries

and it gives us a feeling of comfort. It's not necessarily located in the City Hall basement. Many Bars, Taverns or Restaurant can have a Ratskeller.


In the English language the word Ratskeller is often

spelled with an added letter, the h, "Rathskeller". Perhaps one wanted to get away from the word "rat." During the 19th century in NYC one could find



establishments with this spelling. Next time you visit our DC Ratskeller, look around and you may find some beautiful details you haven't seen before.

Adolf and Rudolf Dassler – Sneakers

udolf Dassler born 1898 in Herzogenaurach, Germany. His brother Adolf was born two years later in 1900. Adolf apprenticed as a baker but decided to follow his father as a cobbler. His interest in sports gave him the idea to craft shoes to enhance an athlete's performance. Using scraps of discarded army materials and spikes from a local blacksmith, Adolf designed a sporting shoe that began to get noticed. Brother Rudolf joined Adolf in the shoe manufacturing business in 1923, and together they started

Gebrüder Dassler Sportschuhfabrik, the Dassler Brother's Sports Shoe Factory. This innovative spiked shoe caught the attention of the German Olympic Track and Field coach, Joseph Waitzer, who ordered Dassler sport shoes for the German National Team in 1928. By the mid 1930's, the Dassler brothers were a household name throughout Germany where the 1936 Olympics took place. Adolf, or Adi, gave Jesse Owens, the famous American track star, a pair of Dassler track shoes. Owens wore the shoes and won four gold medals. Shoe sales soared. During the war years, the brothers' relationship with one another fractured. The company was divided in 1948, and two new shoe companies were formed. Adolf renamed his company based on his name, Adi Das, Adidas. Rudolf used his name and formed Ruda, then changed it to sound more athletic, Puma. When the brothers died, their sons led the businesses, making peace with a friendly soccer match in 2009, and the knowledge that they both had global sports equipment companies.




