FOR YOUR SAFETY

With the reopening comes some restrictions and procedures. They are as follows:

Food and beverage establishments must:

• Limit the number of patrons in indoor areas to 25 percent of the food or beverage establishment's indoor capacity,

excluding the food or beverage establishment's employees;

- Limit seating to a maximum of eight (8) customers per table (unless they are from a family from the same household) and arrange seating to achieve a minimum distance of six feet (6 ft) between parties;
- Require customers to only consume food or beverages while seated;
- Require patrons to wear face coverings while inside the indoor

premises of the food or beverage establishment, except when eating or drinking at their table;

- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that customers be seated in order to place orders;
- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that wait staff bring food or beverages to seated customers
- Keep doors and windows open where possible and utilize fans to improve ventilation.
- Members sign in when entering the dining/bar area in order for tracking if necessary.
- An ATM will be located outside for your convenience.

At this time there will be no seating at the bar. When there is no waitress on duty you may order a drink from the bartenders. Please then return to your seat. Please keep the wait line for drinks to no more than three people at a time.

We will not require reservations at this time unless we see a high trend in numbers for dining nights.

Please be mindful of your fellow members. In the case there are members waiting to enter the dining/bar area for dinner or drinks please keep in mind the amount of time that you have spent in the clubhouse in order to let everyone enjoy the clubhouse.

At this time, there are no restrictions placed on guests that you bring into the clubhouse. When signing them in, please have them add their phone number in case tracking is necessary.

A NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD ON MEMBERSHIP CARDS

The Deutscher Club Executive Board kindly asks that all our members have their membership cards on them at all times when visiting the club for member or public events.



If asked by an employee or staff member to show your membership card, we request that you politely do so. This is not meant as a slight toward you personally, we are a large club with a rotating staff and Board, and not everyone always know each other.

It is very important for members to have their membership card on their person as it is required by law and keeps us in compliance with the New Jersey Alcoholic Beverage Commission. Not doing so risks penalties for our club and possible loss of our liquor license.

Der Tannenbaum

Ein üppig geschmückter Tannenbaum gehört unbedingt bei uns zu einem gelungenen Weihnachtsfest dazu. Wussten Sie, daß die Wurzeln dieses schönen Brauchs in vorchristlicher Zeit liegen? Bei dem alten germanischen Julfest am 21. Dezember - der Wintersonnenwende - holte man Zweige von Tannen und anderen Immergrünen als Symbol der Unsterblichkeit in die Häuser und schmückten sie mit Äpfeln und Nüssen, die als Fruchtbarkeitszeichen galten. Viele Jahrhunderte lang bekämpfte die katholische Kirche diese Bräuche, weil sie an die alte heidnische Religion erinnerten. Aber vergebens - das Volk hielt an seinen geliebten Ritualen fest. Die erste schriftliche Erwähnung eines Christbaums stammt aus dem Jahre 1419. Die Freiburger Bäckerschaft hatte einen Baum mit allerhand Naschwerk und Früchte geschmückt. Aber erst ab dem 16. Jahrhundert hielt der Christbaum vermehrt Einzug in die bürgerlichen Häuser, wo man ihn mit Süßigkeiten und Äpfeln behängte. Die Äpfel wandelten sich später zu Christbaumkugeln: Um 1830 wurden die ersten Exemplare aus Glas geblasen. Herzogin Dorothea v. Schlesien soll um 1611 die Erste gewesen sein, die ihren Weihnachtsbaum mit Kerzen geschmückt hat. Die Erfindung von Paraffin und Stearin im 19. Jahrhundert machte Kerzen schließlich auch für einfache Bürger erschwinglich. Zu dieser Zeit setzte sich der hell erleuchtete Weihnachtsbaum, wie wir ihn heute kennen, flächendeckend durch.

The Christmas Tree

A lushly, decorated pine tree absolutely belongs to a successful Christmas celebration. Did you know that the roots of this beautiful tradition lay in the pre-Christian times? On the old Germanic "Yule Feast" on December 21st - the Winter Solstice - people took branches from pine trees and other evergreens into their homes as a symbol of immortality and decorated them with apples and nuts, which were believed to be fertility symbols. For many centuries, the Catholic church tried to ban these traditions, because they were too reflective of the old pagan traditions. But to no prevail - the people held on to their beloved rituals. The first written evidence of a Christmas tree came in the year 1419. In the city of Freiburg, the Bakers Guild had decorated a pine tree with all kinds of sweets and fruits. But it wasn't until the 16th century that a Christmas tree became more common in middle-class houses, where sweets and apples were hung on the tree. The apples later changed to Christmas ornaments - around 1830, the first glass-blown ornaments appeared. Around 1611, Duchess Dorothea von Schlesien was supposed to have been the first person to use candles on the Christmas tree. The invention of Paraffin and Stearin in the 19th century, made the use of candles on the tree more affordable for the average citizen. At that time, the brightly lit Christmas tree known to us today, became a nationwide phenomenon. Pötschke Verlag



Adolf Gaston Eugen Fick – Contact Lenses

dolf Gaston Eugen Fick was born in Marburg, Germany in 1852. His parents died when he was five years old. Fick was raised by his uncle, and namesake, a physiologist who researched vision. Taking after his uncle, Adolf Fick studied medicine at Wurzburg Academy where his uncle taught. He continued his education in Zurich, Marburg, and Freiburg. In 1886, Fick married Marie Wislicenus, moved to Zurich, practiced as an ophthalmologist, and began his research into contact lenses. Earlier scientific investigations into the nature of light and lenses were led by Leonardo da Vinci who suggested submerging the eye in a bowl of water, Rene Descartes who thought connecting glass tubes with liquid to the eye would improve vision, and Thomas Young who suggested wax and water for an eye mold. In 1887, Fick constructed, and fitted the first contact lens by designing a contact shell to rest on the less sensitive tissue around the cornea. The first test subjects were rabbits, then himself, and lastly, a small group of volunteers. Fick's lenses were large, heavy blown



glass circles 18-21 mm in diameter, and could only be worn for a few hours. It was considered the first successful model of contact lenses. Adolf Fick died in 1937. Last year, the worldwide market for contact lenses was worth 13 billion U.S. dollars.
