FROM THE BLOOD DRIVE COMMITTEE

The Deutscher Club of Clark sponsors two blood drives annually. Our Spring 2023 Blood Drive will be Sat-

Local and national blood supplies remain critically low. Besides our two blood drives VITALANT, RED CROSS and any major hospital system collect blood year-round in an effort to maintain blood for our everyday requirements. Each day hospitals require blood for scheduled and emergency operations. Trauma patients require blood every day. Newborns and moms may need blood. Our hospitals must have a supply.

Collected blood only has a use-life of six weeks. After three weeks blood is less effective in delivering oxygen-rich cells through the body and is less able to flow through the body's smallest capillaries.

NJ Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program

TRENTON - The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs announced that the application period for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)



is now open for residents across the state for the 2022-2023 heating season. The program helps low- and moderate-income households with their heating bills and provides emergency heating system services and emergency fuel assistance. As a result of increases in federal income limits, families with higher incomes are now able to apply and urged to do so.

Residents are also reminded that assistance is available for past-due energy, water, and/or sewer bills and encouraged to apply for assistance to cover these arrears. Eligible households can visit the DCAid portal at www.nj.gov/dca/dcaid to submit an application for assistance. The DCAid portal also checks to see what other benefits the applicant may qualify for. People who do not have access to computers or the internet can call 1-800-510-3102 to be directed to one of the community action agencies partnering with DCA to assist them with starting, completing, and submitting an application online. A list of the community organizations providing such assistance is available at www.nj.gov/dca/divisions/dhcr/offices/agencydirectorylist.html on the DCA website.

"Heating and energy costs are expected to increase this fall and winter for people across the nation, including New Jersey. This is why it is now more important than ever to apply for help to pay upcoming heating bills and to address past-due utility bills," said Lt. Governor Sheila Y. Oliver, who serves as DCA Commissioner. "LIHEAP is not just for people with lower incomes. Moderate-income families are also eligible for assistance.

Reach out if you need assistance. DCA is here to help."

The LIHEAP application period began October 1, 2022 and will end June 30, 2023. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis and assistance is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis so applicants should not wait to apply.

Die Weihnachtspyramide

Eine Weihnachtspyramide ist einer der beliebtesten Dekorationsartikel in der Weihnachtszeit. Der Ursprung dieser Pyramiden geht, wie so Vieles in Europa bis ins Mittelalter zurück, und ihr Anfang kam aus dem Erzgebirge, wo auch heute noch viele dieser Kunstwerke gebaut werden. In den dunklen Vorweihnachtstagen war es üblich immergrüne Zweigen und etwas mehr Licht ins Haus zu bringen. Kerzen halfen da mit extra Licht und das Grün aus der Natur erinnerte an die Tage des Frühlings und des Sommers. Da es im Winter keine Arbeit für die Bergleute gab, beschäftigten sie sich in den langen, dunklen Winterszeiten mit Schnitzereien, denn Holz gab es reichlich im Gebirge. Trotz grosser Armut, bekamen dann die Kinder auch Weihnachtsgeschenke. Traditionelle Volkskunst verfertigte ein Drehgestell um das Kerzen aufgestellt sind, deren warme Luft nach oben steigt und eine Art Propeller, ein Flügelrad, in zwei oder mehreren Etagen zum Drehen bringt. Die Drehung durch Kerzenwärme ist der Fördertechnik von Schachtanlagen im erzgebirgischen Bergbau entnommen. Diese Kunstarbeiten wurden dann von den Herstellern mit grossem Erfolg verkauft. Auch heute noch sind diese Weihnachtspyramiden sehr begehrt und dienen in vielen Heimen als weihnachtliche Dekorationen. Die kleinen Pyramiden sehen magisch aus, wenn mit der Wärme der Kerzen die Figuren langsam in Bewegung kommen und sich im Kreis drehen. Nicht nur sind diese Pyramiden für das Heim gedacht, in manchen Dörfern und Städten erscheinen sie als Prunkstück, riesengross, in der Mitte des Marktplatzes, auf dem Weihnachtsmarkt zur Adventszeit, was in letzter Zeit eine grosse Attraktion für die Touristen wurde. Durch die Erscheinung in ca. 1830 von Kerosin, dass das Rapsöl der Kerzen ersetzte, konnten die Drehscheiben in grösserem Mass mit Motoren gebaut werden. Meterhohe bewegte Weihnachtspyramiden gibt es inzwischen weltweit, allein in Deutschland, mehr als vierhundert. Die Karussellen stellen Krippenfiguren, biblische Tableaus und Weihnachtsfiguren wie Engel auf den verschiedenen Etagen dar. Ursprünglich wurden Im 18.Jahrhundert in Deutschland,

Italien, England und in den USA die Weihnachtspyramiden an der Decke befestigt. Diese Deckenpyramiden sind auch heute noch erhältlich für Haushalte mit wenig Platz oder kleinen Kindern und Tieren. Auf jeden Fall kann eine Weihnachtspyramide Ihre Advents-und Weihnachtszeit verschönern.



The Christmas Pyramid

A Christmas pyramid is one of the most popular decorative items at Christmas time. The origin of these pyramids, like so much in Europe, goes back to the Middle Ages, and their beginnings came from the Ore Mountains, where many of these works of art are still built today. In the dark days leading up to Christmas, it was customary to bring evergreen branches and a bit more light into the house. Candles helped with extra light and the green from nature reminded one of the days of spring and summer. Since there was no work for the miners in winter, they occupied themselves with carving during the long, dark winter months, for wood was plentiful in the mountains. Despite the great poverty, the children also got Christmas presents. Traditional folk art made a rotary stand around which candles are placed, the warm air from which rises and makes a kind of propeller, an impeller, rotate in two or more tiers. The rotation by candle heat is taken from the conveyor technology of shaft systems in mining in the Ore Mountains. These works of art were then sold by the manufacturers with great success. Even today, these Christmas pyramids are very popular and serve as Christmas decorations in many homes. The small pyramids look magical when, with the warmth of the candles, the figures slowly start to move and turn in circles. Not only are these pyramids intended for the home, in some villages and towns they appear as a showpiece, gigantic, in the middle of the market square, at the Christmas market during Advent, which

has recently become a major attraction for tourists. With the introduction of kerosene in the 1830s, replacing rapeseed oil in candles, turntables could be built on a larger scale with motors. Meter-high Christmas Pyramids can be found worldwide, with more than four hundred in Germany alone. The carousels display nativity figures, biblical tableaus, and Christmas figures such as angels on the various levels. In the 18th century in Germany, Italy, England and the USA, the Christmas pyramids were originally attached to the ceiling. These ceiling pyramids are still available today for homes with limited space or small children and pets. In any case, a Christmas pyramid can enhance your Advent and Christmas season.

Charles Feltman – Hot Dogs

Charles Feltman was born in Germany in 1841. In 1856, Feltman came to New York City where he put his knowledge of baking to use. By 1867, he had established his own bakery, and used a



pushcart to deliver his baked goods to Brooklyn customers. Coney Island beaches were popular where streets were lined with saloons and hotels. The demand for Feltman's baked goods was strong. Feltman realized an opportunity. He had knowledge of frankfurters from his homeland, so he outfitted his pushcart with a charcoal heater to warm his sausages, added assorted breads to his cart, and pushed his wagon along the sand dunes to sell to the beach goers. In 1864, Feltman came up with the idea of inserting a frankfurter into a specially elongated bun. This food could be held in your hand while on the beach, on a carousel, or taking a stroll on the street. Feltman named his new food creation "Coney Island red hots". The red hot became all the rage. In the first year 3,700 sausage sandwiches were sold. Each year sales increased, and soon the sandwiches were referred to as "hot dogs", possibly due to their resemblance to the German dachshund dog. Feltman, and later his sons, increased his business to include nine restaurants, a roller coaster, a carousel, a ballroom, an outdoor theater, a hotel, a beer garden, a bathhouse, a pavilion, a Tyrolean village, two huge bars, and a maple garden. By the 1920's Feltman's Ocean Pavilion served 5 million customers a year. One of Feltman's workers was a man named Nathan Handwerker, who in 1916 started his own hot dog business a few blocks away. Nathan charged less than Feltman's for a hot dog. Nathan's business also received an unexpected boost when a new subway stop was installed across the street. Charles Feltman's family sold the business in the 1940's. In 1962, the property became Astroland Park. One of Feltman's original kitchens remained until 2010 when everything was demolished.
