

Oft sind es Bier-Wein-oder Wasserkrüge, Becher, Vasen, Teller, Wappen und andere bemalte Schmuckstücke für besondere Anlässe. Diese Keramik stammt aus ganz bestimmten Gegenden: in Deutschland aus dem Westerwald und in Frankreich aus dem Elsass. In den Städtchen im Westerwald Gebiet (nordöstlich von Koblenz) trauten die Töpfer schon seit Jahrhunderten ihren Nachkommen ihr geheim gehaltenes Kunsthandwerk an. Der französische Teil dieser Industrie wurde im ersten Teil des 18. Jahrhunderts von ausgewanderten Töpfern des Westerwalds gegründet. Archäologische Funde bestätigen, dass schon keltische Stämme getöpfert haben und verbreiteten ihre Waren, denn die Region lag an der Salzstrasse und in der Nähe des Rheins und machten so Fernhandlung zur Hauptverkehrsader Europas. Eine ganz spezielle Erde muss vorhanden sein, um diese Keramik zu Stande zu bringen. Nur wenige Gegenden sind weltweit bekannt in denen Tone in vergleichbarer Quantität und Qualität vorkommen. Der weiße Ton ist auch als "weißes Gold" bezeichnet, denn er ist hochelastisch und nahezu frei von Verunreinigungen, und gab der Gegend den Namen "Kannenbäckerland": Der Ton wird zuerst mit der Hand geformt, meistens an einer Töpferscheibe, und dann wird das unglasierte Stück zum Trocknen auf Regalen gestellt. Die Ware wird mit Farbe handdekoriert und wieder zum Trocknen aufbewahrt. Die Technik der Salzglasur geschieht im Töpferofen, nachdem eine Hochtemperatur, meistens 1.093 Grad Celsius erreicht ist, werden Salzkörnchen in den Ofen geworfen. Das Salz evaporiert in der Hitze und haftet am Quarz im Ton. Die Glasur, die geformt wird, ist sehr hart, beinahe wie Glas, mit einem Hochglanz und manchmal mit einer getüpfelten Oberfläche, ähnlich einer Orangenschale.

Das meiste Steingut hat eine graue Farbe von der Tonerde und die blaue Farbe kommt von einem Metall, Kobalt, das den berühmten, dunkelblauen Farbton den Keramikstücken gibt. Eine wunderschöne Erfahrung ist es, wenn man persönlich die Städtchen besuchen kann, wo man die Töpfer selbst in ihren Werkstätten besuchen und bei der

Kunstarbeit beobachten darf. Ich selbst habe mir ein solches Kunststück nach Hause schicken lassen: eine riesengroße, runde Vase, die in zwei Hälften geformt wurde und dann im Ofen miteinander verschmolzen wurden. Dass sie nicht auseinanderplatzten, war, wie mir der Töpfer versicherte, ein großes Wunder. Für mich, die beste Erinnerung aus dem Westerwaldbesuch. Auch heute sind diese Grau Blau Keramikstücke noch sehr von Sammlern begehrt. Im Westerwald, wie auch im Elsass gibt es herrliche Museen, die ganz stolz ihre Waren zur Schau stellen.



If you are visiting European or German-American families, take a look around and you will definitely see one or more gray blue ceramic pieces that adorn living rooms, kitchens and gardens. Often there are beer, wine or water jugs, mugs, vases, plates, coats of arms and other painted jewelry for special occasions. This ceramic comes from very specific areas: in Germany from the Westerwald and in France from Alsace. In the small towns in the Westerwald area (north-east of Koblenz). potters have entrusted their descendants with their secret handicrafts for centuries. The French part of this industry was founded in the first part of the 18th century by emigrated potters from the Westerwald. Archaeological finds confirm that Celtic tribes already made pottery and distributed their goods, because the region was on the salt road and near the Rhine, making long-distance trade the main traffic artery in Europe. A very special soil has to be present in order to produce



this ceramic. Only a few areas are known worldwide in which clay occurs in comparable quantity and quality. The white clay is also known as "white gold", because it is highly elastic and almost free of impurities and gave the area the name "Kannenbäckerland": The clay is first formed by hand, usually on a potter's wheel, and then the unglazed pieces are placed on shelves to dry. The pieces are hand-decorated with paint and stored again to dry. The technique of salt glaze is done in a pottery kiln, after a high temperature, usually, 2,000 degrees Fahrenheit is reached, grains of salt are thrown into the kiln. The salt evaporates in the heat and adheres to the quartz in the clay. The glaze that is formed is very hard, almost like glass, with a high gloss and sometimes with a stippled surface, similar to an orange peel. Most earthenware is gray in color from the clay and the blue color comes from a metal, cobalt, which gives the famous dark blue hue to the ceramic pieces. It is a wonderful experience when you can personally visit the small towns, where you can visit the potters themselves in their workshops and watch them do their artwork. I had such a masterpiece sent home for myself: a huge, round vase that was formed in two halves and then fused together in the oven. The potter assured me that it was a great miracle that they did not burst apart. This was the best memory from my visit to the Westerwald. Even today these gray blue ceramic pieces are still very popular with collectors. In the Westerwald, as in Alsace, there are wonderful museums that proudly display their goods.

Richard Wagner – Composer



Wilhelm Richard Wagner was born on May 22, 1813, in Leipzig, Germany into a theatrical family. Wagner's stepfather was an actor, poet and painter, his older sisters were opera singers. Wagner took piano lessons but failed to practice. Instead, he tried poetry and musical composition. He attended concerts,

and read plays by Shakespeare, Goethe, and Schiller. Attracted by University life, Wagner enrolled in Leipzig University. There he studied the work of Beethoven and wrote Symphony in C Major which was performed at the Leipzig Gewandhaus in 1833. Die Feen (The Fairies) followed and was performed by a troupe in Magdeburg where Wagner met his first wife Minna Planer. Financial issues arose, and Wagner relocated to Paris, but could not break into

the circle at the Opera. He did complete Rienzi Overture and Der fliegende Holländer (The Flying Dutchman). Returning to Dresden in 1842, Wagner completed Lohengrin and Tannhäuser which were met with cool reception since the public was unaccustomed to Wagner's style of opera music which included dramatic content. Wagner's next home was Zurich where his great composition, The Ring was finished. Unable to break his cycle of financial difficulties on his own, Wagner was saved by Louis II's generosity in 1864 and he returned to Germany. Wagner was able to produce great music. He built a theatre in Bayreuth based on donations from patrons in 1876. Success was finally achieved financially, musically, and romantically, having married his lover, the daughter of his friend Franz Liszt. Wagner died in 1883. His musical achievements are many. They include world famous operas, symphonies, marches, choral songs, and the invention of the orchestra pit for musicians. Richard Wagner's world-famous Bayreuth Festspielhaus still operates today presenting Wagnerian concerts and is supervised by Wagner descendants. Barbara Streit
