Food and beverage establishments must:

• Limit the number of patrons in indoor Continued on page 4

areas to 25 percent of the food or beverage establishment's indoor capacity, excluding the food or beverage establishment's employees;

- Limit seating to a maximum of eight (8) customers per table (unless they are from a family from the same household) and arrange seating to achieve a minimum distance of six feet (6 ft) between parties;
- Require customers to only consume food or beverages while seated;
- Require patrons to wear face coverings while inside the indoor premises of the food or beverage establishment, except when eating or drinking at their table;
- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that customers be seated in order to place orders;
- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that wait staff bring food or beverages to seated customers
- Keep doors and windows open where possible and utilize fans to improve ventilation.
- Members sign in when entering the dining/ bar area in order for tracking if necessary.

At this time there will be no seating at the bar. When there is no waitress on duty you may order a drink from the bartenders.


Meeting - Thur. Feb. 18, 2021

Die "Venus von Willendorf"

"illendorf deutschsprachigen Österreich an der Donau. in der Nähe der Stadt Krems. Die Venus von Willendorf wurde 1908 bei Arbeiten an einer Eisenbahnlinie gefunden. Sie ist 11.1 cm groß und ist aus einem oolitischen Kalkstein geschnitzt, der nicht in der Gegend der Fundstelle vorkommt. Es wird angenommen, dass die Figur während des europäischen Oberpaläolithikums oder der "alten Steinzeit" geschnitzt wurde, einer Zeit der Vorgeschichte, die um 30.000 v. Chr. begann. Eine Vielzahl von Daten wurde vorgeschlagen. Nach einer 1990 überarbeiteten Analyse der Stratigraphie des Ortes, an dem die Statuette entdeckt wurde schätzt man. dass sie zwischen 24.000 und 22.000 v. Chr. geschnitzt wurde. Neuere Schätzungen drücken das Datum leicht auf etwa 28.000 bis 25.000 v. Chr. zurück. Bei einer erneuten Untersuchung der Stratigraphie am Standort im Jahr 2009 schätzten die Forscher, dass das Alter der archäologischen Schicht, in der die Figur gefunden wurde, etwa 30.000 Jahre vor unserer Zeit liegt. Ähnliche Skulpturen, die erstmals im 19. und frühen 20. Jahrhundert entdeckt wurden, werden in der Archäologie traditionell als "Venusfiguren" bezeichnet, da die weit verbreitete Überzeugung besteht, dass Darstellungen von nackten Frauen mit übertriebenen sexuellen Merkmalen einen frühen Fruchtbarkeitsfetisch darstellen, vielleicht eine Mutter Göttin. Der Hinweis auf die Venus ist metaphorisch, da die Figuren viele tausend Jahre vor der mythologischen

Figur der Venus liegen. Einige Wissenschaftler lehnen diese Terminologie ab und bezeichnen die Statuette stattdessen als "Frau von" oder "Frau aus Willendorf". Christopher Witcombe (Art History Professor) kritisiert den Begriff: "Die ironische Identifizierung dieser Figuren als 'Venus' erfüllte bestimmte Annahmen zu der Zeit über das Primitive, über Frauen und über den Geschmack." The "Venus from Willendorf"

illendorf is located in German-speaking Austria on the Danube, near the city of Krems. The Venus of Willendorf was found 1908 by a railroad workman.

She is 4.4 inches tall and carved from an oolitic limestone, which is not local to the area. The figure is believed to have been carved during the European Upper Paleolithic, or "Old Stone Age", a period of prehistory starting around 30,000 BCE. A wide variety of dates have been proposed. Following a revised analysis of the stratigraphy of the site where the statuette was discovered, carried out in 1990, the figure was estimated to have been carved between 24,000 and 22,000 BCE. More recent estimates push the date back slightly to between about 28,000 and 25,000 BCE. In a 2009 reexamination of the stratigraphy at the site, researchers estimated that the age of the archaeological layer in which the figurine was found is about 30,000 years before our time. Similar sculptures, first discovered in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, are traditionally referred to in archaeology as "Venus figurines", due to the widely held belief that depictions of nude women with exaggerated sexual features represented an early fertility fetish, perhaps mother goddess. The reference to Venus is metaphorical since the figurines predate the mythological figure of Venus by many thousands of years. Some scholars reject this terminology, instead referring to the statuette as the "Woman of" or "Woman from Willendorf." Christopher Witcombe (Art History Professor) criticizes the term: "The ironic identification of these figurines as 'Venus' pleasantly satisfied certain assumptions at the time about the primitive, about women, and about taste." Hildegard von Bingen - Saint

ildegard von Bingen, also known as Sibyl of the Rhine, was born in Bockelheim to a noble family in 1098. Hildegard was educated at the Benedictine Cloister near Bingen until age 18. She then became a nun at the Monastery of Saint Disibodenberg. Having seen visions at an early age, she was encouraged to write them down. With the help of a scribe, since women were not taught to write, and the encouragement of Pope Eugene III, Hildegard completed several books on topics ranging from philosophy to poetry. Seventy-seven of her lyric poems, each with a musical setting, are compiled in Symphonia Armonie Celestium Revelationum, which reflects her belief that music is the praise that we give to God. Some say that her soothing music has influenced New Age music today. Hildegard von Bingen also wrote about natural healing, which promoted the use of herbal medicine to treat medical ailments. Her medical advice led to her position of advisor and physician to German Emperor Frederick Barbarossa. Hildegard described the



preservative qualities of hops when added to a beverage like beer, and the relaxing, calming effect that hops provide to induce sleep. Von Bingen died in 1179 at the age of 81. Many speculate that her daily drink of well-hopped beer may have led to her long life. Hildegard von Bingen was canonized and named a Doctor of the Catholic Church by Pope Benedict XVI in 2012.
