Er hat in den dreißiger Jahren des 19.Jahrhunderts für die Einrichtung von Sport- und Spielpätzen für Kinder in Leipzig gesorgt – eine seinerzeit revolutionäre Idee. Sie wurde dann von seinem Nachfolger, dem Lehrer Hauschild, fortgeführt. Dieser Lehrer gründete gemeinsam mit den Eltern einen Erziehungsverein, den man zum Gedenken an seinen Vorgänger "Schreberverein" nannte. Auf einem Grundstück legte man kleine Gärten an, um den Kindern auf diese Weise die Gartenarbeit nahe zu bringen. Doch die Anlagen verwilderten schnell, bis sie von den Eltern als Kleingartenanlagen weitergeführt wurden.

Schone 1869 gab es in Leipzig mehr als hundert dieser Gärten, die von nun an "Schrebergärten" genannt wurden, obwohl die Idee, die der Namenspatron ursprünglich gehabt hatte, einen etwas andere war. Trotzdem glaube ich, dass dem Gedanken,



Kindern sowie Erwachsenen Bewegung an der frischen Luft zu ermöglichen, mit der Gründung der Kleingärten immer noch Genüge getan wird. Zur gleichen Zeit entstanden übrigens in anderen Industriestädten ähnliche Anlagen, die man dort Armen- oder Sozialgärten nannte. Der Begriff "Schrebergarten" hat sich letztlich aber durchgesetzt.

The Schrebergarten

The "Schrebergarten"! The allotment concept is probably a term that every one of us is familiar with, but only very few people know where this description comes from. The name is not, as you might think, attributed to a gardener, but to a Doctor and Director of the orthopedic sanatorium in Leipzig, Daniel Gottlieb Moritz Schreber. In the 1830s, he provided for the establishment of sports and playgrounds for the children in Leipzig. This was a revolutionary concept at the time. This idea was continued by his successor, the teacher Hauschild. This teacher, together

with parents, established an Educational Association and to commemorate his predecessor named it "Schreberverein".

On a plot of land, they put small gardens lots, to allow the children to learn and do gardening. But these little gardens quickly grew wild and the parents took over, to use them as allotments, Kleingarten-Anlagen. By 1869 Leipzig had more than one hundred of these small gardens, which were now called "Schrebergärten", although the original idea, the namesake had in mind, was a different one. Nevertheless, I believe that the thought, to allow children as well as adults movement in the fresh air, with the establishment of allotments is still being exercised. Incidentally, at the same time in other industrial towns, similar plots called poor or social gardens, were established. But the term "Schrebergarten" has ultimately prevailed.

PS: An allotment garden, often called simply an allotment, or a community garden, is a plot of land made available for individual, non-commercial gardening or growing food plants.

Werner Forssmann and Cardiac Catheterization

erner Forssmann was born in Berlin in 1904. He graduated from the University of Berlin where he studied medicine in 1928. The following year he entered the University Medical Clinic to study anatomy. In 1929, while he was a surgical resident in a small hospital in Eberswalde, Forssmann became increasingly interested in finding ways to deliver drugs for cardiac resuscitation. After seeing a picture showing how a tube with a balloon on the end to read pressure changes was inserted into a horse through a vein, Forssmann became convinced that the technique would work on people. Against his superior's wishes, Forssmann experimented on himself. He inserted a thin catheter into the crook of his arm through a vein for a distance of about two feet until it reached the right side of his heart. He then went up two floors to the x-ray room, and with the help of a young radiologist, injected opaque material used for x-rays into the catheter. A photograph was taken showing the tip of the catheter in his right auricle. Forssmann then published a paper describing the technique and discussed the benefits. For his recklessness, Forssmann was fired. Disheartened, he gave up cardiology, and practiced urology instead. Forssmann's work paved the way, years later, for many heart studies. He was rewarded in 1956, much to his surprise, along with two Americans, Andre Cournand and Dickinson Richards who had modified his technique, with the Nobel Prize for Physiology or Medicine.
