To request an absentee ballot, please contact Karla G. Schwedt at kgschwedt@gmail.com or 908-377-9126. Absentee ballots may be mailed in or dropped off at the Deutscher Club.

To mail in or drop off, you will need 2 (or 3) envelopes.

- Complete your ballot and place it in the first envelope and seal it.
- Take the second envelope, write your name and membership number in the upper left corner. Insert your current membership card AND the first, sealed envelope that contains your ballot.
- If you would like your membership card mailed back to you, (instead of picking it up at the Club), you will need to insert a self-addressed, stamped envelope into the second envelope as well.

• Seal the second envelope.

To Drop Off your vote:

- Follow the directions above.
- To drop your vote off before January 9th, discuss with Karla Schwedt when you get your absentee ballot.
- To drop your vote off on election day, Sunday, January 9th, there will be a manned drop box in the Club lobby from 2:00-5:00 PM. Ballots must be dropped off no later than 5:00 PM on election day.

To Mail-In your vote:

- Follow the directions above.
- Address this second envelope to the Deutscher Club, 787 Featherbed Lane, Clark, NJ 07066 and mail it.
- The ballot must be received by the Club no later than Saturday, January 8, 2022.

Absentee ballots are counted immediately after the in-person votes are cast and entered into the vote count.

Kartoffelpuffer

Es ist mitten im tiefen Winter und manche Leute suchen nach etwas Warmen, das man essen und sich wohlfühlen kann. Natürlich fallen einem viele leckere Gerichte ein, die man recht schnell selbst zubereiten kann. Aber eines bringt immer Zufriedenheit und Wohlbefinden, die Kartoffelpuffern. Kartoffelpuffern sind nicht nur ein beliebtes Gericht für zu Hause, sondern auch ein beliebtes Straßenessen, bei lokalen Volksfesten und Feiertagsveranstaltungen wie Fasching, Karneval Weihnachtsmärkten. die Insbesondere deutschen Kartoffelpuffer wecken Erinnerungen daran, wenn man zu Omas Hause ging. Oma machte sie regelmäßig, wenn wir zu Besuch kamen. Während wir am Küchentisch saßen, stand Oma über dem Herd mit den knisternden Geräuschen und Gerüchen von gebratenen Kartoffelpuffern. Es dauerte nicht lange, bis Teller mit heißen Kartoffelpuffern auf den Tisch gestellt wurden und wir uns daran erfreuten. Oma wusste, große Mengen dieser Kartoffelpuffer herzustellen, weil die ganze Familie nicht genug davon bekommen konnte. Je nach Region Deutschlands sind Kartoffelpuffer auch als Reibekuchen, Reibeplätzchen, Reiberdatschi und Grumbeerpannekuche bekannt. Kartoffelpuffern werden aus geschälten Kartoffeln hergestellt, die roh fein gerieben werden (so dass sie schnell und gleichmäßig garen können). Die zerkleinerten Kartoffeln werden in einem sauberen Geschirrtuch ausgewrungen und dann mit Ei, fein geriebenen Zwiebeln und Mehl vermischt und anschließend in Öl hellgolden gebraten. Potato Pancakes

It's in the middle of the deep winter and some people are looking for something warm to eat and feel good about. Of course, many delicious dishes come to mind, which you can prepare yourself quite quickly. But one thing always brings satisfaction and well-being, the potato pancakes. Potato pancakes are not only a popular dish at home, but also a popular street food at local folk festivals and holiday events such as street fairs, carnival and Christmas markets. In particular, the German potato pancakes evoke memories of going to grandma's house. Grandma made them regularly when we came to visit. While we sat at the kitchen table, Grandma stood over the stove with the crackling sounds and smells of fried potato pancakes. It didn't take long for plates of hot potato pancakes to be put on the table and we enjoyed it. Grandma knew how to make large amounts of these potato pancakes because the whole family couldn't get enough of them. Depending on the region of Germany, potato pancakes are also known as grater cakes, grater cookies, Reiberdatschi and Grumbeerpannekuche. Potato pancakes are made from peeled potatoes that are finely grated raw (so that they can cook quickly and evenly). The crushed potatoes are wrung out in a clean tea towel and then mixed with egg, finely grated onions and flour and then fried in oil light golden. The result is a crispy exterior and a soft inside. Potato pancakes can be served sweet or savory. Most often, they are served with applesauce or other fruit compote and / or dusted with icing sugar, but also served hearty with a yogurtherb sauce or with meat as part of a meal.

Fanny Mendelssohn – Felix's Sister

Fanny Mendelssohn was born in Hamburg, Germany in 1805. Fanny and her younger brother Felix both learned to play the piano from the same teachers as children. Fanny was so accomplished as a pianist that by age 13, she could play all twenty-four preludes from Bach's The Well-Tempered Clavier by heart. The following year, both Fanny and Felix received instruction in musical composition. They both excelled. However, as Felix was encouraged to pursue music as a vocation, Fanny was reminded by her father and others, that for her music could only be an "ornament." As a woman, she had the duties of house and family. Felix did arrange with Fanny for several of her songs to be published under his name, including Italien, a favorite of Queen Victoria. Fanny continued to play and compose. She gave

Sunday concerts alongside her brother in the family's Berlin home. Fanny married Wilhelm Hensel in 1829 and had a child. At age 42, Fanny had a stroke and died. Six months later, Felix also died of a stroke. In her lifetime, Fanny Mendelssohn wrote over five hundred musical compositions, six compositions were published under Felix's name. Since the 1990's, new facts have been discovered about Fanny's compositions, and the support and guidance that she gave to her brother's music. Analysis of documents in 2010 corrected errors about Fanny's authorship on compositions. In 2018, The Fanny and Felix Mendelssohn Museum opened in Hamburg. On November 14, 2021, Google dedicated a doodle to Fanny Mendelssohn Hensel on her 216th birthday.
