The Election will take place immediately following the General Meeting and continue until 5:30 PM, at which time voting will be closed.

To vote in-person, you will need to show your current membership card from 2022 or 2023.

Absentee Ballots are available to members unable to vote in-person, only under the following conditions, per our bylaws:

- The member is an out-of-state resident
- The member will be out of town or working on election day
- The member is experiencing an extended illness

To request an absentee ballot, contact Martha Kein at kein.nieves@gmail.com or 908-625-7086. Absentee ballots must be mailed to the Club and received no later than Saturday, January 7, 2023. (Please note that there will not be a Drop-Box at the Club. The Drop-Box was a Covid accommodation and won't be continued into 2023.) Absentee ballots are counted and entered into the vote count immediately after the in-person votes are cast.

Absentee Ballot Instructions: (You will need two envelopes, an absentee ballot, your membership card, and a stamp.)

• Complete the absentee ballot, place it in the first envelope, and seal it.

• Take the second envelope, and write your name and membership number in the upper left corner. Insert your current membership card AND the first, sealed envelope that contains your ballot into the second envelope.

• If you would like your membership card mailed back to you (instead of picking it up at the Club), you will need to insert a self-addressed, stamped envelope into the second envelope as well.

• Seal the second envelope, and address it to The Deutscher Club, 787 Featherbed Lane, Clark, NJ 07066.

• Mail the ballot with enough time for it to be received at the Club no later than Saturday, January 7, 2023.

NJ Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program

TRENTON - The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs announced that the application period for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)

is now open for residents across the state for the 2022-2023 heating season. The program helps low- and moderate-income households with their heating bills and provides emergency heating system services and emergency fuel assistance. As a result of increases in federal income limits, families with higher incomes are now able to apply and urged to do so. Residents are also reminded that assistance is available for past-due energy, water, and/or sewer bills and encouraged to apply for assistance to cover these arrears. Eligible households can visit the DCAid portal at www.nj.gov/dca/dcaid to submit an application for assistance. The DCAid portal also checks to see what other benefits the applicant may qualify for. People who do not have access to computers or the internet can call 1-800-510-3102 to be directed to one of the community action agencies partnering with DCA to assist them with starting, completing, and submitting an application online. A list of the community organizations providing such assistance is available at www.nj.gov/dca/divisions/dhcr/offices/ agencydirectorylist.html on the DCA website.

"Heating and energy costs are expected to increase this fall and winter for people across the nation, including New Jersey. This is why it is now more important than ever to apply for help to pay upcoming heating bills and to address past-due utility bills," said Lt. Governor Sheila Y. Oliver, who serves as DCA Commissioner. "LIHEAP is not just for people with lower incomes. Moderate-income families are also eligible for assistance. Reach out if you need assistance. DCA is here to help."

The LIHEAP application period began October 1, 2022 and will end June 30, 2023. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis and assistance is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis so applicants should not wait to apply.



Eine Grünkohl und Pinkel

Hast du schonmal "Kale" gegessen? Na klar doch. Das ist schlicht der amerikanische Name für Grünkohl. Zugegeben, das klingt schon ein bisschen "cooler" als Grünkohl, bei dessen Erwähnung die Enkelkinder immer leicht zusammenzucken. Dieses, besonders in Norddeutschland traditionsreiche Gemüse, zählt in den USA zu den angesagten "Superfoods". Im Norden Deutschlands wird Grünkohl gerne als Kochgemüse zu deftigen Fleischgerichten oder Eintopf serviert." Grünkohl mit Pinkel" ist dort eine Spezialität. Für Laien: Bei Pinkel handelt es sich um geräucherte, kräftig gewürzte Wurst. Der trendige und supergesunde "Kale" aus den USA kommt aber mit ganz anderen Rezepten auf den Teller. In angesagten New York Restaurants kann man Kale Chips, Kale Smoothies, Kale Muffins, aber auch Wraps, Erdbeer-Kale Salat, etc. bestellen. Natürlich kann man all diese neuartigen Variationen auch ganz einfach selbst zubereiten. Dieser "Krause Kohl" wird schon seit dem 16.Jahrhundert verspeist. Weil seine Ernte in die kalten Monate fällt, landete er eben bevorzugt in warmen Eintöpfen. Das hat aber den Nachteil, dass viele gesunde Inhaltsstoffe durch die Dauer-Erhitzung verloren gehen. Und deren Gehalt ist beim Grünkohl außergewöhnlich hoch. Es spricht also nichts dagegen, auch mal den "Kale" in seiner leichten Zubereitung zu versuchen und das 500-jährige Superfood frisch aufleben zu lassen.

Kale and "Pinkel"

Have you ever eaten or heard of "Grünkohl"? Of course, you have. This is simply the German name for "Kale". Admittedly, that sounds a bit "cooler" than Grünkohl, which always makes



grandchildren cringe slightly at the mere mentioning. This vegetable has a rich tradition especially in northern Germany and is one of the most popular "superfoods" in the USA. In northern Germany, Kale is often served as a cooked vegetable with hearty meat dishes or in stew. "Kale with Pinkel" is a specialty there. For laymen: Pinkel is a spicy sausage. The trendy and super-healthy "Kale" from the USA is served using completely different recipes. In the trendy New York restaurants, you can order Kale Chips, Kale Smoothies, Kale Muffins, but also Wraps, Strawberry-Kale Salat, etc. Of course, you can also easily prepare all these new versions yourself. This "Krause Kohl" has been enjoyed since the 16th century. Because its harvest falls in the cold months, it mostly ends up in warm stews. However, this has the disadvantage that many healthy vitamins and minerals are lost through continuous heating. And these are exceptionally high in kale. So, there is nothing wrong with trying "Kale" prepared using these simpler recipes and reviving the 500-year-old superfood.

Heinrich Schliemann — Archaeologist

Heinrich Schliemann was born in 1822 in Neubukow, Mecklenburg-S c h w e r i n , Germany the son of a poor pastor. Unable to continue his education past the age of 14, Schliemann apprenticed to a grocer.

While in the grocer's shop,

Schliemann was able to teach himself Greek, and began to memorize Homer's poems. With a great memory and a traveling spirit, Schliemann decided to emigrate. He became a cabin boy on a ship from Hamburg to Venezuela. After the ship was wrecked off the Dutch coast, Schliemann decided to become an office boy in Amsterdam, and then a bookkeeper for a trading firm. With the addition of the Russian language to his growing language list, he was sent to St. Petersburg in 1846 as an agent. There Schliemann decided to control his destiny and started his own trading business and married Ekaterina Lychin. Schliemann made his fortune as a military contractor during the Crimean War and the California gold rush. He retired from his Russian business at age 36. He was now free to devote his time and money to his passion for Ancient Greek archaeology. Next, he divorced his Russian wife in favor of a Greek schoolgirl and settled in Greece. Always fascinated about ancient Troy, and sparked by the stories of other searches. Schliemann armed with his book of Homer, and little more, met the British archaeologist, Frank Calvert. Calvert was working in the same area that Schliemann believed was the location of Troy. In 1872, after much effort, and several digs, Schliemann dug down deeper and hit a prehistoric city that he believed was part of Troy. In his haste and abandon, Schliemann destroyed layers of ancient ruin. However, his constant communication, self-promotion, and gold riches excited the world about archaeology. Schliemann's discovery of precious gold items moved to many museums over the years. For decades, the last known museum to house the riches was Berlin until the end of WWII when the Russians moved the gold to Moscow. Schliemann died in 1890 and was interred in Athens. His archaeological discoveries and practices, both good and bad, gave Heinrich Schliemann an important part in archaeology for the ages.
