To request an absentee ballot, contact Alexandra Beinstein at, abeinstein11@aol. com, or 908-875-8664. Absentee ballots must be mailed to the Club and received no later than **Saturday, January 13, 2024** (Please note that there will not be a Drop-Box at the Club. The Drop-Box was a Covid accommodation and won't be continued into 2024.) Absentee ballots are counted and entered into the vote count immediately after the in-person votes are cast.

Absentee Ballot Instructions: (You will need two envelopes, an absentee ballot, your membership card, and a stamp.)

- 1. Complete the absentee ballot, place it in the first envelope, and seal it.
- 2. Take the second envelope and write your name and membership number in the upper left corner. Insert your current membership card AND the first, sealed envelope that contains your ballot into the second envelope.
- 3. If you would like your membership card mailed back to you (instead of picking it up at the Club), you will need to insert a self-addressed, stamped envelope into the second envelope as well.
- 4. Seal the second envelope, and address it to The Deutscher Club, 787 Featherbed Lane, Clark, NJ 07066.
- 5. Mail the ballot with enough time for it to be received at the Club no later than **Saturday, January 13, 2024.**

repertoire of classic German songs and fun



where. This is a fictionalized account of Werner von Braun's experience in America told from his wife's perspective.

Amazon Description of *The German Wife*: **The New York Times** bestselling author of **The Warsaw Orphan** returns with a gripping novel inspired by the true story of Operation Paperclip: a controversial secret US intelligence program that employed former Nazis after WWII.

Berlin, 1930—When a wave of change sweeps a radical political party to power, Sofie von Meyer Rhodes's academic husband benefits from the ambitions of its newly elected chancellor. Although Sofie and Jürgen do not share the social views growing popular in Hitler's Germany, Jürgen's position with its burgeoning rocket program changes their diminishing fortunes for the better. But as Sofie watches helplessly, her beloved Berlin begins to transform, forcing her to consider what they must sacrifice morally for their young family's security, and what the price for their neutrality will be.

Twenty years later, Jürgen is one of the many German scientists offered pardons for their part in the war, and taken to America to work for its fledgling space program. For Sofie, this is the chance to exorcise the ghosts that have followed her across the ocean and make a fresh start in her adopted country. But her neighbors aren't as welcoming or as understanding as she had hoped. When scandalous rumors about the Rhodes family's affiliation with Hitler's regime spreads, idle gossip turns to bitter rage, and the act of violence that results will tear apart Sofie's community and her family before the truth is finally revealed.






DIE HEILIGEN DREI KÖNIGE

Wer waren die Drei Heiligen Könige, die am 6. Janu-ar ihren eigenen Feiertag im Kalender haben und in drei Bundesländern Deutschlands, sowie in einigen Ländern, wie Russland und Spanien, als ein Familienfest mit Bescherung gefeiert werden, wo nicht an Weihnachten, sondern am 6. Januar die Geschenke verteilt werden? Viele christliche Kirchen, z.B. evangelische, katholische, anglikanische und orthodoxe Gemeinden verehren und feiern diese drei Könige und es steht fest, dass sie beliebte und unverzichtbare Bestandteile in jeder Krippe sind. Anlass für die Feierlichkeiten ist eine Erzählung aus der Bibel, in der die Drei Weisen, auch Sterndeuter aus dem Morgenland genannt, einem Stern mit hell leuchtendem Schweif nach Bethlehem folgten. Dieser führte sie zu einem einfachen Stall, in dem Jesus geboren wurde. Es ist nicht klar, ob sie Könige waren, aber der Geschichte nach, brachten sie große Reichtümer dem neugeborenen Kind. Sie werden Könige genannt, weil sie wohl Fürsten waren oder aus königlichem Geschlecht stammten. Als Anhangspunkt nahm man die drei Gaben , die sie mitbrachten. Erst im 9.Jahrhundert wurden sie mit Namen bekannt: Caspar brachte Myrrhe, Melchior Gold und Balthasar den Weihrauch. In Süddeutschland war es einst Brauch, am Vorabend des Dreikönigstages Haus und Stall mit Weihrauch auszuräuchern. Die Heiligen Drei Könige gelten auch heutzutage noch als Schutzheilige gegen Feuergefahr, deshalb befestigt man an Ställen und Schuppen das Dreikönigs Zeichen und spritzt geweihtes Wasser auf die Balken. Auch werden in vielen Familien die Räume mit Dreikönig geweihtem Wasser besprengt und mit geweihter Kreide an die Türen im Haus und Hof die drei Buchstaben C+M+B mit der Jahreszahl geschrieben. Die Anfangsbuchstaben beziehen sich nach kirchlicher Auslegung aber nicht auf die Könige, sondern sie drücken vielmehr den lateinischen Segensspruch aus: Christus Mansionem Benedicat=Christus segne dieses Haus. Aus den "Heiligen Drei Königen" sind in unserer Zeit die Sternsinger hervorgegangen. Hier schlüpfen Kinder und Jugendliche in orientalische Gewänder und ziehen als "Heilige Drei Könige" von Haus zu Haus. Sie singen, beten und erbitten den Segen für das Haus und dessen


Bewohner. Ein Sternträger begleitet sie und sie sammeln jeweils in einer landesweiten Aktion für karitative Zwecke Geld ein. Die Gebeine der Könige sollen ursprünglich von der heiligen Helena nach Konstantinopel gebracht worden sein. Später waren sie in Mailand untergebracht, schließlich sind sie unter König Barbarossa und dem Erzbischof Reinald von Dassel nach Köln gelangt. Heute kann man Teile der Gebeine im Kölner Dom in einem goldenen Sarg besuchen. (Die Herstellung des Dreikönigsschrein hat über 30 Jahre gedauert). In einigen Teilen Deutschlands, vor allem in Köln, war es seit dem 16. Jahrhundert Tradition, einen Königskuchen zu backen, indem eine Münze oder eine Bohne versteckt war, Der Kuchen wurde unter allen Familienmitgliedern aufgeteilt. Wer die Münze oder Bohne fand, war König und schützte dadurch das Haus gegen Unglück und Geister. Diese Tradition findet man meistens in süddeutschen Ländern.

Beliebt und bekannt ganz besonders unter Bauern und Landbebauern sind Bauernregeln:

- 1. "Heilige Dreikönig sonnig und still, der Winter vor Ostern nicht weichen will."
- 2. "Ist bis Dreikönig kein Winter, so kommt auch kein strenger mehr dahinter."
- 3. "Wie sich das Wetter bis Dreikönig hält, so ist das nächste Jahr bestellt."
- 4. "Dreikönigsabend hell und klar, verspricht ein gutes Erntejahr."

THE THREE KINGS

W ho were the Three Kings, who have their own holiday in the calendar on January 6th, and are celebrated by families exchanging gifts, not only in three of the German federal states but in some countries such as Russia and Spain as well? Many Christian churches, such as Protestant, Catholic, Anglican and Orthodox, venerate and celebrate these three kings and it is clear that they are popular and indispensable parts of every nativity scene. The reason for the celebration is a story from the Bible in which the three wise men, also known as the Magi from the Orient, followed a star with a brightly shining tail to Bethlehem. The star led them to a simple stable where Jesus was born. It is not clear whether they were kings, but



according to history, they brought great riches to the newborn child. They are called kings because they were princes or came from a royal family. The three gifts they brought with them were considered evidence of their wealth. It wasn't until the 9th century that they became known by name: Caspar brought myrrh, Melchior brought gold and Balthasar brought frankincense. In southern Germany it was once customary to sprinkle houses and stables with incense on the eve of Epiphany, which is the church's name for Three Kings Day. Even today, the Three Wise Men are still considered patron saints against the danger of fire. That is why the Epiphany sign is attached to stables and sheds and holy water is sprayed onto the beams. In many families, the rooms are sprinkled with holy water and the three letters C+M+B with the year are written on the doors in the house and courtyard with consecrated chalk. According to church interpretation, the first letters do not refer to the kings, but rather express the Latin blessing: Christus Mansionem Benedicat = Christ bless this house.

In modern times "star singers" have emerged from the Three Kings celebration. Here, children and young people wear oriental costumes and go from house to house as the "Three Kings". They sing, pray and ask for blessings for the house and its residents. A star bearer accompanies them, and they collect money for charitable purposes in a nationwide campaign. The bones of the kings are said to have originally been brought to Constantinople by St. Helena. They were later transferred to Milan (Italy), and finally to Cologne, under King Barbarossa and Archbishop Reinald von Dassel. Today you can visit parts of the remains in a golden coffin in the Cologne Cathedral. (The Epiphany Shrine took over 30 years to build). In some parts of Germany, especially Cologne, it has been a tradition, since the 16th century, to bake a "king cake" by hiding a coin or a bean in it. The cake was then divided among all family members. Whoever found the coin or bean was king and thereby protected the house against misfortune and ghosts. This tradition is mostly found in southern German states.

Farmers' sayings are popular and well-known, especially among farmers and agriculturalists:

- 1, "If Epiphany is sunny and quiet, winter will not leave before Easter."
- 2. "If there is no winter by Epiphany, no severe winter will
- 3. "Whatever the weather brings by Epiphany, will determine next year."
- 4. "Epiphany evening bright and clear, promises a good harvest year."

EMIL JULIUS BRACH - Candy

Emil Julius Brach was born in 1859 in Schoenwald, Germany. When he was seven, his family of eight moved to Burlington, Iowa on the Mississippi River. It was here in the midwestern "German Belt" that Emil's father secured work as a blacksmith. At age twelve, Brach began working for a trunk factory, did janitorial work for room and board, took classes at Burlington Business College, and waited tables at a restaurant. Next, Brach moved to Fairfield, Iowa where he worked in a small restaurant and confectionery store. He was shortly promoted to manager where he developed a friendship with a traveling candy salesman from Chicago. In 1880, Brach moved to Chicago to accept a job at a major candy company, married and saved his money. In 1904 he launched his own company naming it Brach's Palace of Sweets. With stiff competition from the many other local German sweet shops, Brach undercut his rivals and began to thrive. Employing his family, including his two sons, Brach branched out selling his caramels wholesale to major department stores. Soon the wholesale business outstripped the shop and Brach announced a new focus in manufacturing candy. His business exploded. They sold not only to most of Chicago's department stores, but also to discount variety stores and early movie theaters. By 1909, demand was so great that Brach moved his business to a factory where candy production reached 50,000 pounds per week. Always fascinated by technology, Brach continued to look for ways to automate production. He also developed the first laboratory to analyze ingredients to ensure quality and purity. Over the years the company grew as new products were developed such as nougats, candy corn and conversation hearts. Emil Brach died in 1947. The company continued to

thrive under his sons Frank and Edwin. The company was sold in 1966 and has changed ownership several times. Today, Brach's Candy Company is owned by the Ferrara Candy Company but retains the Brach family name on their original products.


