

THE FALL BOOK CLUB MEETING

The book for October (details to follow) is a Pulitzer Prize winning novel written in German by Herta Müller: "The Hunger Angel" (translated by Philip Boehm). The German title is "Atemschaukel."

Das Ruhrgebiet oder Kohlenpott

s liegt im deutschen Staat Nord-◀ Rhein Westfalen und ist mit rund 5.1 ✓ Millionen Einwohnern und einer Fläche von 4.438.69 Quadratkilometern der größte Ballungsraum Deutschland. Das Ruhrgebiet als Ballungsraum, ist in dieser Form erst um die 150 Jahre alt. Die natürliche Grundlage der Entwicklung des Ruhrgebiets ab dem 19. Jahrhundert sind seine Steinkohlevorkommen und die damit zusammenhängende Montanindustrie mit Eisen, Stahl, Dampfmaschinen und Eisenbahnen. Es erhielt seinen Namen von dem Fluss Ruhr, der am südlichen Rand des Ruhrgebiets seinen Lauf nimmt. Der Fluss ist 235 km lang und entspringt im Osten auf der Nordseite des Winterbergs im Sauerland auf einer Höhe von 724 Metern. Er fließt erst nach Norden und dann nach Westen. Kurz nach dem Ort Neheim biegt er in südwestlicher Richtung und überquert die Südgrenze Steinkohlenbergbaugebiets einem gewundenen Kurs, der an Witten, Steele, Kettwig und Mülheim vorbeiführt und dann bei Ruhrort in den Rhein mündet. Die Ruhr ist von Witten flussabwärts durch eine Reihe von Schleusen schiffbar. Das Ruhrgebiet, auch Kohlenpott bei Einheimischen genannt, ist ein wichtiges Industrieund Bergbaugebiet. Dazu gehören die Industriestädte Essen, Düsseldorf und

Dortmund. Das Ruhr-Kohlerevier ist eines der größten der Welt, und obwohl die Produktion im 21. Jahrhundert stark eingeschränkt wurde, hält es den Großteil der nachgewiesenen bituminösen Kohlereserven Deutschlands. bedeutende industrielle Entwicklung der Region begann unter den Familien Krupp und Thyssen im 19. Jahrhundert. Aber auch SIEMENS, AEG und die MANNESMANN DEMAG waren hier zu Hause. Es war die "Schatzkammer" der Deutschen Industrie. Im 21. Jahrhundert war die traditionelle Schwerindustrie der Region weitgehend der diversifizierten Chemischen und Elektronikfertigung gewichen. Am 21. Dezember 2018 wurde auf der Schachtanlage Haniel in Bottrop die letzte Steinkohle gefördert. Damit ging eine Ära von über 200 Jahren Industriegeschichte in Deutschland zu Ende; und der Kohlenpott als solcher.

The Ruhr Area or Kohlenpott

It is located in the German State Nord-Rhine Westphalia and is the largest metropolitan area in Germany with a population of around 5.1 million and an area of 4,438.69 square kilometers. The Ruhr area as a metropolitan area in this form is only about 150 years old. The natural basis for the development of the Ruhr area from the 19th century onwards are its coal deposits and the associated coal industry with iron, steel,

steam engines and railways. It got its name from the river Ruhr which flows on the southern edge of the Ruhr area. The river is 146 Ml. long and its source is in the east on the north side of the Winterberg in the Sauerland region at an altitude of 2375 feet. It flows first to the north and then to the west. Shortly after the city of Neheim, it bends in a southwesterly direction and crosses the southern border of the coal mining area in a winding course that passes Witten, Steele, Kettwig and Mülheim and then flows into the Rhine near Ruhrort. The Ruhr is navigable from Witten downstream through a series of locks. The Ruhr area, also called Kohlenpott among locals, is an important industrial and mining area. These include the industrial cities of Essen, Düsseldorf and Dortmund. The Ruhr coalfields are one of the largest in the world, and although production was severely restricted in the 21st century, it holds most of Germany's proven bituminous coal reserves. The important industrial development of the region began under the Krupp and Thyssen families in the 19th century. But SIEMENS, AEG and MANNESMANN DEMAG were also at home here. It was the "Treasure Chamber" of German industry. In the 21st century, the region's traditional heavy industry had largely given way to diversified chemical and electronics manufacturing. On December 21st, 2018, the last coal was mined at the Haniel mine in Bottrop. Thus, came the end of an era of more than 200 years of industrial history in Germany; and the Kohlenpott as such.



Richard Hellmann – Mayonnaise

ichard Hellmann was born in Vetschau, Germany in 1876. After completing school at age 14, he became an apprentice at a local food market for four years. Hellmann then moved on to work in Spreewald, Halle, Hamburg, and Bremerhaven before applying for a sales position with Cross & Blackwell in London. From London, Hellmann next took a position in San Francisco, but decided to stay in NYC instead. An acquaintance from Cross & Blackwell offered him a job at Francis H. Leggett for \$9.00

a week, and he accepted the offer. Soon Hellmann was able to marry and buy a small grocery store. Business prospered when he started selling mayonnaise in bulk to restaurants made from his wife's recipe. Hellmann and his wife decided to return to Germany, so the store was sold. In 1912, Hellmann started to miss NYC, he came back to the US, and was



able to buy back his old store. This time Hellmann decided to sell his mayonnaise in clear glass jars and offered it to other delicatessens and grocery stores. He placed a label with blue ribbons on the front and offered the screw-top jars in 3 ½ oz. and 8 ½ oz. sizes. The following year he offered delivery and hired salesmen. Next followed a trademark,

expansion to Chicago and Southern states. International sales began in 1961. Hellmann's has been sold several times, finally being acquired by Unilever in 2000. Today Hellman's Blue-Ribbon Mayonnaise is sold in 75 countries. Richard Hellmann died in Greenwich, Connecticut in 1971 at the age of 94.
