A vote by the DC Membership on this Amendment to the Bylaws will be taken at the monthly meeting on **Wednesday, June 8th, 2022.** 

The following amendments to Article III., Para L; Article V, Paras C and D; and the establishment of Exhibit B – Election Cycles; to the Bylaws of the Deutscher Club of Clark Inc., have been submitted and read as follows (changes are in bold print):

#### Article III

L. <u>Removal</u>. At any meeting of the Executive Board called expressly for the removal of any Trustee or Officer, who may be removed from office with cause, must be by a vote of **sixty-six and two-thirds** (66-2/3rds) percent of the members of the Executive Board. New Trustees or Officers may be filled until the next membership election. Removal from office for cause may include, but not be limited to, failure to observe and obey **House Rules** (EXHIBIT A), neglect of position

**responsibilities as set forth in Sections IV., and V., Para E., t**o acts of theft, embezzlement, fraud, violence or threats of violence, insubordination, or other conduct unbecoming of the position held.

#### Article V

C. <u>Concurrent Service</u>. No Officer may also simultaneously serve as a Trustee or any other office. This does not preclude any Officer or Trustee from performing the responsibilities of another officer position if a vacancy exists for an office but in so doing the individual is not to hold a second position. **All officers shall be elected for a term of two (2) years by the membership at the annual meeting.** An officer, upon the expiration of his term of office, may become eligible for reelection to office or for any other office of the Club.

#### D. Term and Election.

- 1. The President may be elected up to two terms (4) consecutive years, which term can be extended for two (2) additional years by the Members if no suitable candidate can be found. The President, upon the expiration of the term of office, may become eligible for reelection as President after a break in service of two years unless the successor is unable to serve and, in that case, the retired President is eligible to be appointed by the Board to the position of President. All other Officers upon expiration of the term of office may become eligible for reelection.
- 2. To efficiently transition to a two (2) year election term for all Executive Officers, the schedule shall reflect the following.
- (i) Effective as of the January 2023 Annual Membership Elections, all positions of the Executive Board with the exclusion of the President shall be up for election. The 2nd Vice President, Financial Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Membership Secretary shall be elected to serve for a term of two (2) years. Going forward, this shall be referred to as the "Odd Year Election Cycle".
- (ii) Effective as of the January 2024 Annual Membership Meeting Elections, the positions of President, 1st Vice President, Treasurer, and Recording Secretary shall be elected to serve for a term of (2) years. Going forward, this shall be referred to as the "Even Year Election Cycle".
- (iii) Effective as of the January 2025 Annual Membership Meeting Elections, elections will follow Election Cycles (Exhibit B), going forward.
- (iv) The Trustees will remain on their respective three (3) year current cycle.







### Karl and Theo Albrecht – Aldi & Trader Joe's

Karl Albrecht was born in 1920, his brother Theo, born in 1922, and they grew up in Essen, Germany. Their father was a miner and later a bakery assistant. Their mother opened a small grocery shop in 1913 to help support the family. Karl worked in a delicatessen when he was young, Theo apprenticed at his mother's store. Both boys served in the German army during WWII. In 1945, the brothers took over their mother's



store and soon opened another shop nearby. The impoverished conditions following the war helped shape their business model. Low costs and low prices prevailed. The Albrecht stores kept costs low and charged low prices. Only the most popular items were displayed, no perishable items, no name brands, no store advertising, no helping clerks, no bags. Their prices were often 20% lower than competitors. Business flourished, and by 1955, there were more than 100 stores throughout Germany. In 1961, the brothers changed the store name to Aldi, short for Albrecht Discount. The business continued to grow, but not without a large argument over cigarettes. Karl thought cigarettes would promote shoplifting, Theo did not. The company was amicably split. Karl, no cigarettes, had Aldi Sud in the south of Germany. Theo, with cigarettes, had Aldi Nord in the northern part of the country. The stores continued to expand. Aldi Sud came to the US in the Midwest and East in the 1970's. Theo's Aldi Nord bought a small California grocery chain and called it Trader Joe's. The Aldi and Trader Joe's stores have continued to grow across the US. No frills is still the motto at Aldi stores even though they have added fresh vegetables and meats. Today, the Aldi global empire has more than 80 billion dollars in annual revenue. Theo and Karl died in 2010 and 2014 respectively, leaving behind a personal fortune estimated at 39 billion dollars. The family no longer actively control the business. Aldi Nord and Aldi Sud are today managed by family foundations. Barbara Streit

### KAFFEEHÄUSER WIEN – Treffpunkte der Künstler

Andy Warhol war da. Sigmund Freud war da. Klimt, Tony Blair und unzählige Prominenten sowie Gäste aus aller Welt waren auch schon da. Kaffeehäuser sind eine kulinarische Institution in Wien, auch "Wohnzimmer" der Kunst genannt. Das Wiener Kaffeehaus ist dort, wo man ungestört Zeit verbringen kann, ohne dass dir das leere Kaffeegeschirr vor der Nase weggeräumt wird, wo es Zeitungen gibt, die besten der Welt, und wo den Gästen das Gefühl vermittelt wird, die Zeit bleibt stehen. "Gemma auf an Kaffee?" das ist die Aufforderung für ein ungezwungenes Treffen, zu dem man nicht gerne nein sagt. Die Kaffeehaus Tradition geht weit zurück: eine Legende erzählt, dass die Wiener nach der Befreiung von den Türken im Jahre 1683, einige Säcken von seltsamen Bohnen gefunden hatten und dachten es sei Kamelfutter. Wahr oder nicht, das 1. Kaffeehaus stammt aus dem 17. Jahrhundert, als Kaiser Leopold einem Armenier die Hoffreiheit gab, das türkische Getränk Café, Thé und Scherbet zu bereiten; das Kaffeehaus fand schnell großen Beifall bei den Wienern und in 1819 gab es schon 150 Kaffeehäuser. Natürlich gibt es auch solche Geschäfte in verschiedenen europäischen Städten, doch das Flair der Wiener Kaffeehäuser ist "das Wienerische": der spröde Charme der Kellner (oft im Smoking mit Fliege), ein leicht antiquiertes Ambiente und das Kaffeehaus Personal, zu dem auch die (Stamm-)Gäste gehören. Nirgendwo wird Kaffee auf einem silbernen Tablett serviert, immer mit einem Glas Wasser, auf dem ein Löffel liegt mit dem "Gesicht" nach unten. Bei einem Besuch in Wien fällt einem die Wahl schwer, denn es gibt eine Menge der "besten" Kaffeehäuser". Café Landtmann, ideale Lage inmitten vieler Treffpunkte, gilt den Mächtigen des Landes. Im Kellertheater gibt es manchmal Aufführungen. Café Sacher, weltweit bekannt für die oft imitierte Sachertorte, wo der 16-jährige Sohn des Eigentümers die Torte erfand, als Prinz Metternich zu Besuch kam und der Vater eine neue Torte verlangte. Diese wurde dann der Kaiserin Sisi, bzw. Kaiser Franz Joseph gewidmet. Viele Kaffeehäuser haben sich im Innern traditionell wenig verändert: Marmor Tische, gepolsterte Sofas, große Wandspiegel, die das Innere grösser erscheinen lassen und die berühmten Thonet Bugholzsessel, Möbel aus gebogenem Holz, die Ende des 20. Jahrhundert weltweit millionenfach gekauft wurden und die noch in vielen Kaffeehäusern traditionell den Gästen Platz anbieten. Dazu gehören die noch immer in jedem Kaffeehaus vorhandenen lokalen und internationalen Zeitungen an ihren eigenen Bugholz



Zeitungshaltern. Natürlich gibt es auch viele Ausnahmen, wie das amerikanische Starbucks mit neun Filialen die "Coffee to-go" servieren, und auch andere wie Kaffeeküche, mit Wiens bestem und schönstem Kaffee zum Gehen (und auch Sitzen). Das berühmteste Café der Stadt ist zweifelsfrei das Hawelka. Früher war es ein wichtiges Künstlercafé, wovon heute noch die Bilder an den Wänden zeugen, dass manche Künstler ihre Zeche teilweise mit Kunst bezahlten. Viele Kaffeehäuser wie Café Sperl, Café Jelenik und andere bieten außer dem Wiener Flair den Gästen Spezialitäten wie Schanigärten für die heißen Sommertage, Spieltische für Schach, Bridge, Canasta usw., auch Billardtische, eine Kegelbahn und Jazz-Jam-Sessions. Wichtig ist natürlich was der Kunde bestellt. Für Neubesucher ist die Getränkekarte der Kaffees lang und oft mysteriös: Wiener Melange (wie Cappuccino), Kleiner oder Großer Brauner (einfach oder doppelten Espresso), Verlängerter, auch Americano (Mokka), Kapuziner (Mokka mit Schlagobers) und die Liste geht weiter und dazu kommt dann noch die Tortenkarte und oft die Speisekarte. Ein Wiener Besuch muss unbedingt ein oder zwei Kaffeehäuser miteinschließen. Guten Appetit!

### **VIENNA COFFEE HOUSES – Meeting Places of the Artists**

Andy Warhol was there. Sigmund Freud was there. Klimt, Tony Blair as well as countless celebrities and guests from all over the world have also been there. Coffee houses are a culinary institution in Vienna, also called the "living room of the arts." The Viennese coffee house is where you can spend time undisturbed, without the empty coffee set being cleared away in front of you, where there are newspapers, the best in the world, and where guests have the feeling that time has stood still. "Are you up for a coffee?" is the invitation to a casual meeting that you don't like to say no to. The coffeehouse tradition goes way back: a legend tells that after the liberation from the Turks in 1683,

the Viennese found some sacks of strange beans and thought it was camel feed. True or not, the 1st coffee house dates back to the 17th century when Emperor Leopold gave an Armenian soldier court permission to prepare the Turkish drink: café, thé and sherbet; the coffee house quickly found great applause among the Viennese and in 1819 there were already 150 coffee houses. Of course, there are also shops like this in various European cities, but the flair of the Viennese coffee houses is "Viennese;" the demure charm of the waiters (often in a dinner jacket with bowtie), a slightly antiquated ambiance, and the coffee house staff, which includes the (regular) guests. Nowhere is coffee served on a silver platter, always with a glass of water on which a spoon rests "face" down. When visiting Vienna, it is difficult to choose, as there are a multitude of the "best" coffee houses! Café Landtmann, ideal location in the midst of many meeting places, is dedicated to the powerful elite of the country. Sometimes theater performances take place in the basement. Café Sacher, known worldwide for the oftenimitated Sacher cake, which the owner's 16-year-old son invented, when Prince Metternich came to visit, and the father asked for a new cake. This was then dedicated to Empress Sisi and Emperor Franz Joseph. Many coffee houses have traditionally changed little on the inside: marble tables, upholstered sofas, large wall mirrors that make the interior appear larger and the famous Thonet bentwood armchairs, German furniture made of bent wood, which were sold by the millions around the world at the end of the 20th century. They are still in use today where many coffee houses traditionally offer this furniture. This includes the bentwood newspaper holders for their local and international newspapers still present in every coffee house. Of course, there are also many exceptions, such as the American Starbucks with nine branches that serve "coffee to go", and others such as Kaffeeküche, with Vienna's best and most beautiful coffee to go (and to sit down). The most famous café in the city is undoubtedly the Hawelka. It used to be an important artists' café, and the pictures on the walls still bear witness to the fact that some artists partially paid their bills with art. In addition to the Viennese flair, many coffee houses such as Café Sperl, Café Jelenik and others offer their guests specialties such as garden cafés for hot summer days, chess, bridge, canasta, and billiard tables as well as a bowling alley, readings and jazz-jam sessions. Of course, what the customer orders is most important. For new visitors, the coffee menu is long and often mysterious: Wiener Melange (similar to cappuccino), small or large Brown (single or double espresso), Extended Coffee also Americano (mocha), Kapuziner (double mocha with whipped cream) and the list goes on and on, and then there is the amazing cake menu and additionally a food menu. A visit to Vienna must include a coffee house or two. Enjoy it all! Barbara Oberding
