



DAS DEUTSCHLANDTICKET

Schon seit Jahren ist Deutschland an der Spitze mit Anstrengungen und Versuche, Klimaschutzgesetze einzuführen und sie dann erfolgreich durchzuführen. In 2019 erreichte die Bundesrepublik mit 43% Erfolg, den Gebrauch der Kohle allmählich abzuschaffen und die Stromerzeugung aus erneuerbaren Quellen durch Wind-und Sonnenkraft zu ersetzen. Das erste nationale Klimagesetz im Jahr 2021 zielte darauf hin, jährlich einzelne Sektoren wie Industrie und Verkehr durch die Reduzierung von Emissionen bis 2045 Treibhausgas neutral zu machen. Das nächste Ziel bis 2030 ist mindestens 65 % und bis 2050 88 % das Treibhausgas zu reduzieren. Aus diesem Grund hat Deutschland gerade am 1. Mai dieses Jahres ein neues Euro-Ticket für den monatlichen Nahverkehr eingeführt: das "Deutschlandticket" (kurz: D-ticket). Die 49-Euro-Monatskarte ist im Rahmen eines digitalen Abonnements online erhältlich. Einwohner und Touristen können seit Mai für 49 Euro bundesweit in den Nah- und Regionalverkehrs Netzen unterwegs sein. Das weit verbreitete 9-Euro-Ticket, der Vorläufer letzten Jahres, gab den Anstoß zu diesem neuen Unternehmen, um sowohl die Emissionen als auch die Lebenshaltungskosten zu senken. Die saarländische Ministerpräsidentin Anke Rehlinger begrüßte die Bahn-Förderung als "einen großen Schritt in der Mobilitätswende - wenn gleichzeitig der ÖPNV (Öffentlicher Personennahverkehr) ausgebaut wird". Von diesem Angebot profitieren am ehesten die vergleichsweise Fernreisenden in Regionalzügen zwischen Städten. Pendler von Aachen nach Köln, beispielsweise, zahlen in der Regel 200 Euro für eine Monatskarte, die jetzt auf etwa ¼ des Monatspreises reduziert ist. Fernreisen mit Bussen und ICE-Zügen sind in diesem



Ticket jedoch nicht enthalten. Wird die Generation "Auto" in Deutschland auf dieses Angebot setzen? Das bleibt abzuwarten. Andere europäische Länder haben verschiedene Anreize für die Nutzung öffentlicher Verkehrsmittel eingeführt: Österreich bietet seinen Pendlern das "Klimaticket" für 1.095 Euro im Jahr mit speziellen Angeboten für Behinderte und Familien. Luxemburg war das erste Land, das 2020 landesweit kostenlose öffentliche Verkehrsmittel für Einwohner und Touristen einführte, Malta hat eine kostenlose Fahrkarte öffentliche Verkehrsmittel mit einer Registrierungsgebühr von E15. Mehrere Städte wie Tallinn (Estland), Dünkirchen (Frankreich) und Wien haben alle spezielle ermäßigte Tarife für Sondertarife, um Reisende zu ermutigen, Busse und Züge zu nutzen. Um die Emissionen zu senken, schlug Deutschland nach dem Krieg Russlands in der Ukraine auch eine Senkung der Kraftstoffsteuer vor, um die Belastung der Auto- und Lkw-Fahrer zu verringern. Mit der Deutschen Wasserkraft Strategie wollen sie dafür sorgen, dass grüner Wasserstoff schnell marktfähig wird, um eine alternative nachhaltige Energiequelle bereitzustellen, die nicht nur im Verkehr, sondern auch in der Stahlindustrie, im Bauwesen sowie im Luftverkehr genutzt werden kann . Deutschland ist auf dem besten Weg, alles zu erreichen, womit seine Bewohner helfen können, um eine sichere Welt für alle zu schaffen. 
THE GERMANY TICKET

For years Germany has been on the forefront with efforts and attempts to introduce climate control rules and then successfully enforce them. In 2019 Germany succeeded with 43% success to produce electricity through renewable sources with wind and solar power, phasing out the use of coal to generate electric power. The first national climate law in 2021 targeted annual individual sectors such as industry and transport to become greenhouse gas neutral by 2045 by cutting emissions at least 65 % by 2030 and to 88% by 2050. With this effort in mind, Germany just launched on May 1, 2023, a new Euro ticket for monthly transport: the" Germany ticket". The 49 Euro monthly ticket is available online as part of a digital subscription, residents and tourists will be able to travel on local and regional public transport networks across the country for 49 euros, which started in May. The vastly popular 9



this new venture to help reduce the emission as well as the cost of living. Saarland state premier Anke Rehlinger welcomed the subsidized rail program as "a major step forward in the mobility revolution-if public transport is expanded at the same time". The most likely group to benefit from this offer will be the comparatively longdistance travelers on regional trains between cities. Commuters from Aachen to Cologne, for example, generally pay €200 for a monthly ticket, and that is now reduced to about 1/4 of the monthly price. However, long-distance travel on buses and on the ICE (Intercity Express) trains are not included in this ticket. Will the 'car' generation go for this offer in Germany? That remains to be seen. Other European countries have introduced various incentives for use of public transportation: Austria offers its commuters the 'Climate Ticket' for €1,095 a year with special deals for disabled and families. Luxembourg was the first country to introduce free public transportation for both residents and tourists nationwide in 2020, Malta has a free ticket for public transport with a €15 registration fee. Several cities like Tallinn (Estonia), Dunkirk (France) and Vienna all have special reduced fares for discount rates to encourage travelers to make use of buses and trains. To cut emissions, Germany also proposed a fuel tax cut in the wake of Russia's war in the Ukraine to ease the burden of car and truck drivers. With the German Hydro Strategy, they want to ensure that green hydrogen becomes marketable swiftly, to provide an alternative sustainable source of power that can be used not only in transport, but also by the steel industry construction, as well as in air traffic. Germany is right on target to do all it and its inhabitants can do, to provide a safe world for all. For your summer travel in Europe, make sure you check out the special reductions on public transportation. Have a good trip!

Robert Koch – Bacteriologist

Robert Heinrich Hermann Koch was born in 1843 in Clausthal, Hanover (now Clausthal-Zellerfeld, Germany). A bright little boy, Koch taught himself to read by age five. He attended the University of Gottingen where he majored in medicine. After serving as a physician in various small towns. Koch volunteered as a field surgeon during the Franco-Prussian War of 1870-71. He next became a surgeon in Wollstein where he built a small laboratory. Influenced by some of his mentors and his own field work, Koch began to study algae and disease-causing organisms. At this time, anthrax was prevalent among the farm animals in Wollstein. By inoculating some mice with infected blood, and other mice with blood from healthy farm animals, Koch proved that anthrax spread through blood. He also discovered that the anthrax bacilli could remain dormant in fields until conditions were right for animal contact. Koch's discovery pleased his colleagues who encouraged him to publish his work. Koch immediately became famous. His meticulous research and detailed photomicrographs gave the scientific community exact methods to isolate pathogenic bacteria. Koch next moved on to tuberculosis, cholera, amebic dysentery, leprosy, bubonic plague, typhus, malaria, and drinking water. Koch was appointed as director of the newly created Institute of Hygiene, then Surgeon General and Director of Infectious Diseases in Berlin. He received many prizes, medals, and honorary awards throughout Europe and in New York. In 1905, Robert Koch was awarded the Nobel Prize for Physiology or Medicine for his investigations and discoveries in relation to tuberculosis. He continued his experimental work in bacteriology and serology until his death in 1910, in Baden-Baden.
