### **FOR YOUR SAFETY**

With the reopening come some restrictions and procedures. They are as follows:



Food and beverage establishments must:

- Limit the number of patrons in indoor areas to 25 percent of the food or beverage establishment's indoor capacity, excluding the food or beverage establishment's employees;
- Limit seating to a maximum of eight (8) customers per table (unless they are from a family from the same household) and arrange seating to achieve a minimum distance of six feet (6 ft) between parties;
- Require customers to only consume food or beverages while seated;
- Require patrons to wear face coverings while inside the indoor premises of the food or beverage establishment, except when eating or drinking at their table;
- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that customers be seated in order to place orders;
- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that wait staff bring food or beverages to seated customers
- Keep doors and windows open where possible and utilize fans to improve ventilation.
- Members sign in when entering the dining/ bar area in order for tracking if necessary.

At this time there will be no seating at the bar. When there is no waitress on duty you may order a drink from the bartenders.





# Die Neue Orgel -**Herzstück Europas**

bwohl österreichische Soldaten die weiße Flagge in Wien hissten und der 2. Weltkrieg vorbei schien, zündeten Plünderer einige Läden im Zentrum der Stadt an: Feuerfunken landeten auf dem Dach mit den glasierten, weltbekannten Ziegeln des während des Krieges unversehrt gebliebenen Wiener Stephansdoms. Wasser zum Löschen war nicht vorhanden und das Feuer konnte sich auf dem Dach ausbreiten. Dieses brach ein und das Feuer zerstörte den Dachstuhl, den Glockenturm und das Mittelschiff mit der Orgel des Doms, dem Wahrzeichen Wiens. Noch im selben Jahr, 1945, begann der Wiederaufbau der 1960 abgeschlossen wurde, später mit Restaurierungsarbeiten fortgesetzt wurde. In diesem Jahr wurde auch die neue, von der Firma Kauffmann erbaute Orgel eingeweiht, die zwar schöne Klänge hatte, aber von Anfang an die Kathedrale nicht voll ausfüllte und daher in den 1990er Jahren, auch aufgrund verschiedener technischer Probleme. stillgelegt wurde. In den letzten beiden Jahrzehnten wurde daher der Dom mit einer kleineren Orgel vom Mittelschiff aus bespielt. 2017 wurde dann mit dem Bau einer neuen Riesenorgel begonnen, mit dem die bekannte österreichische Orgelbaufirma Rieger aus Vorarlberg beauftragt wurde. Die Kosten für Umbau und Instandsetzungen beliefen sich auf ca. 3 Millionen Euro. Bei den Renovierungsarbeiten wurde darauf geachtet, dass möglichst viele der historischen Pfeifen wiederverwendet werden. Einige tausend Pfeifen wurden dafür abgebaut und von Wien nach Vorarlberg transportiert. Die unbrauchbaren Pfeifen wurden entweder eingeschmolzen oder konnten

von Orgel Liebhabern erstanden werden; ca. 5000 Pfeifen mussten neu gebaut werden. Die längste Pfeife der Orgel ist etwas über 12 m hoch, die schwerste Pfeife wiegt 650 kg. Vom Spieltisch der neuen Orgel aus können nun beide Orgeln des Doms gespielt werden, die zusammen über 5 Manuale und 185 Register verfügen. Nach dreijähriger Bauarbeit war die Einweihung der Orgel für Ostersonntag, den 12. April 2020 auf den Tag genau 75 Jahre nach dem Brand des Stephansdoms und der Zerstörung der alten Orgel - geplant. Diese konnte dann jedoch wegen COVID-19 erst am 4. Oktober 2020 stattfinden, gefolgt von einer Reihe von Konzerten mit einigen der weltbesten Organisten, die die enorme Klangvielfalt der neuen Orgel mit ihrem Können großartig unter Beweis stellten. Für Musikliebhaber ist die Vielfalt der fantastischen Klangmöglichkeiten mit den leisesten, zartesten und auch den stärksten und mächtigsten Klängen ein wahrer Ohrenschmaus in dem bedeutendsten, gotischen Wahrzeichen Österreichs. Wer nicht bis zur nächsten Wien-Reise warten möchte, kann sich die neue Orgel schon mal auf einer CD anhören, doch ist ein Besuch eins Konzerts im Stephansdom in jedem Fall zu empfehlen. lthough Austrian soldiers hoisted the white flag in Vienna and the Second World War seemed to be over, looters set fire to some shops in the city center: sparks of fire landed on the roof with the glazed, world-famous tiles of St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna, which remained intact during the war. Water to extinguish the flames did not exist and the fire was able to spread on the roof. The roof collapsed and the fire destroyed the roof structure, the bell tower, and the central nave with the organ of the cathedral, Vienna's landmark. The reconstruction began that same year, 1945, and was completed in 1960. Afterwards the restoration process started. In the same year the new organ, built by the Kauffmann company was inaugurated. Although It had a nice sound, it was not strong enough to completely fill the acoustics of the cathedral and was plagued with various technical problems from the beginning, so the organ was shut down. Over the last two decades a smaller organ was played from the central nave. In 2017 the construction of a new giant organ began, for which the well-known Austrian organ building company Rieger from Vorarlberg was commissioned. The costs for reconstruction and renovation amounted to approximately \$ 3,623,850. During the renovation work, care was taken to



ensure that as many of the historic pipes as possible were reused. Several thousand pipes were dismantled for this purpose and transported from Vienna to Vorarlberg. The unusable pipes were either melted down or could be bought by organ lovers; approximately 5000 pipes had to be rebuilt. The longest pipe of the organ is a little over 39 feet high, the heaviest pipe weighs 1,430 pounds. Both organs of the cathedral can now be played from the console of the new organ; altogether they have 5 manuals and 185 stops. After three years of construction, the inauguration of the organ was originally planned for Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020 - exactly 75 years to the day after the fire of St. Stephen's Cathedral and the destruction of the old organ. However, due to COVID-19, this could only take place on October 4, 2020, followed by a series of concerts with some of the world's best organists, who demonstrated the enormous variety of sounds of the new organ with their skills. For music lovers, the variety of fantastic sound possibilities with the softest, gentlest, and also the strongest and most powerful sounds is a real feast for the ears in Austria's most important Gothic landmark. If you don't want to wait until your next trip to Vienna, you can listen to the new organ on a CD, but a visit for a concert in St. Stephen's Cathedral is definitely recommended.

# **Emanuel Leutze - "Washington Crossing the Delaware"**

Branuel Leutze was born in Schawäbisch-Gmünd, Württemberg in 1816. His parents emigrated and settled in Fredericksburg, Virginia when Emanuel was a young boy. Life as a silversmith for his father was a struggle in the new country, and failing health led to his early death in 1831. Leutze was a poor student, but showed early talent in art. He was hired as a portrait artist for \$5.00 a painting. Using this money, Leutze returned to Germany, entered Duesseldorf's Art Academy, and perfected his painting craft. The Academy was

known for excellence in draftsmanship, dramatic composition, and the occasional bolt of lightning.
Leutze used his time in Duesseldorf to create several patriotic paintings of what he considered to his homeland, America. Among his many paintings were, "The

Settlement of Maryland", "Columbus", "Nathanial Hawthorne", and the first "Washington Crossing the Delaware". News of Leutze's achievements traveled back to America. He returned to the United States in 1859 with gold medals of accomplishment, a title given by the King of Prussia, and a commission to decorate the House of Representatives in Washington, DC. For the commission, Leutze traveled West into

unexplored areas and Indian territory, which resulted in realistic landscapes with portraits of settlements on the borders of civilized land. Leutze died at age 52 of heat stroke while working in Washington in the summer of 1868. By far, Leutze's most famous accomplishment was his painting of "Washington Crossing the Delaware". The first painting of Washington burned in a studio fire in Germany. It was restored only to suffer damage during World War II in a bombing raid. Fortunately, Leutze made a second copy of "Washington Crossing the Delaware" which today hangs in the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. The iconic Emanuel Leutze painting of George Washington embodies patriotic pride in the hero of the Revolutionary War, and the first President of the
