ertoire of classic German songs and fun Bierhalle "Lieder". We perform with both piano and accordion accompaniment. All





HAUSPFLANZEN

Pflanzen in unseren Wohnräumen und am Arbeitsplatz haben viele positive Wirkungen auf den Menschen! Die Wissenschaft kommt da zu erstaunlichen und ganz vielseitigen Ergebnissen. Allein der Anblick von grünen Pflanzen, und sei es auch nur der Blick aus dem Fenster auf den Garten, verringert nachweislich Stress: Es senkt den Blutdruck sowie deine Muskelspannung - so kannst du dich schneller erholen und neue Kraft und frischen Mut schöpfen. Angestellte und Schüler, die in Räumen mit Pflanzen arbeiten, zeigen sich in Untersuchungen aufmerksamer arbeitsfreudiger. und Vor allem waren sie auch seltener krank Vergleichspersonen kahlen. pflanzenlosen Räumen. Topfpflanzen erhöhen zudem noch die Luftfeuchtigkeit und helfen dadurch Heizkosten zu sparen, denn feuchte Luft erscheint uns wärmer als trockene, auch wenn beide in Wahrheit die gleiche Temperatur aufweisen. Ab 40% Luftfeuchtigkeit sink der Staub aus der Luft wassergesättigt zu Boden - und das ist eine Wohltat für Allergiker. Außerdem gehen dann Erkältungskrankheiten und Beschwerden durch gereizte Schleimhäute deutlich zurück. Allerdings erhöhen nur Zimmerpflanzen, die viel Wasser verdunsten, die Luftfeuchtigkeit nennenswertem Maße, z.B. Zyperngras oder die Zimmerlinde. Große Gewächse schlucken zusätzlich Schall und sorgen für angenehme Akustik im Raum. Darüber hinaus bauen die Bodenlebewesen in der Topferde einige Luftschadstoffe ab.





HOUSE PLANTS

Plants in our living spaces and at work have many positive effects on humans! Science comes to astonishing and very versatile results. Just the sight of green plants, even if only the view from the window on the garden, has been proven to reduce stress: It lowers blood pressure and your muscle tension – so you can recover faster and regain strength and fresh courage. Employees and students who work with plants in rooms are more attentive and eager to work in studies. Above all, they were also less likely to get sick than those in stark, plantless rooms. Potted plants also increase humidity and thus help to save


heating costs, because moist air feels warmer to us than dry air, even if both actually have the same temperature. At 40% humidity, the dust saturated with water sinks to the ground - and this is a blessing for allergy sufferers. In addition, colds and ailments caused by irritated mucous membranes are significantly reduced. However, only houseplants that evaporate a lot of water increase the humidity to a significant extent, e.g., Cyprus grass or the linden tree. Large plants absorb additional sound and ensure pleasant acoustics in the room. In addition, the organisms in the potting soil break down several types of air pollutants. Inge Helling

Paul Gottlieb Nipkow – Father of Television

Paul Gottlieb Nipkow was born in Lauenburg, Pomerania (now Lebork, Poland) in 1860. While attending school in Neustadt, West Prussia (now Wejherowo, Poland), Nipkow studied telephony and the transmission of moving pictures. After graduation he continued his studies in Berlin focusing on electro physics and physiological optics. Over the Christmas holiday in 1883-84, while still a student, Nipkow invented a device to use a rotating spiralperforated disk to divide a picture into a mosaic of points and lines. The other feature of his device was a selenium photocell to analyze the light intensities and send the results. Nipkow was granted a German patent in 1885 for his electric telescope for 30 marks, a fee lent to him by his future wife. The Nipkow disk patent was held for 15 years. Nipkow lost interest in further development of his electric telescope while he worked as a designer in the Berlin-Buchloh Institute, and the patent lapsed. By the 1930's total electronic picture scanning had been invented based on Nipkow's disk design. In 1935, the world's first public television station started in Berlin and was named Fernsehsender Paul Nipkow. Nipkow became honorary president of the Television Council of the Imperial Broadcasting chamber and was honored with a state funeral upon his death in 1940. Many people credit Paul Gottlieb Nipkow as the Father of Television.
