

#### REISEN IN DEUTSCHLAND AB-SEITS DER AUSGETRETENEN PFADE: GÖRLITZ

Vielleicht denken Sie darüber nach, Deutschland zu besuchen und stöbern gerade nach Reiseangeboten. Sie werden feststellen, dass die meisten Reiseunternehmen Besuche in denselben Städten anbieten: Berlin, München, Frankfurt, Dresden, Heidelberg und einige mehr. Das sind entweder Großstädte, in denen es schwierig ist, alle Sehenswürdigkeiten zu sehen, oder kleinere Städte, die von Touristen überschwemmt werden. Wenn Sie eine Kleinstadt bevorzugen wo Sie mehr Einwohner als Touristen treffen können, und Sie ihre Umgebung lieber zu Fuß auf Kopfsteinpflasterstraßen erkunden wollen, dann wäre ein Besuch in Görlitz vielleicht das Richtige. Leider ist die Anreise aufgrund der Lage als östlichste Stadt Deutschlands etwas unbequem. Wenn Sie jedoch Dresden besuchen und einen oder zwei zusätzliche Tage Zeit haben, die Fahrt von dort nach Görlitz dauert nur eine Stunde mit Auto oder Bahn. Görlitz liegt am linken Ufer der Lausitzer Neiße, die auch die deutsch-polnische Grenze markiert. Wenn Sie schon immer Polen besuchen wollten, dies ist auch Ihre Gelegenheit. Sie müssen lediglich die Altstadtbrücke übergueren, auf der anderen Seite ankommen dann befinden Sie sich in der polnischen Stadt Zgorzelec. Früher waren diese beiden Städte eine Einheit, nach den Ereignissen des Zweiten Weltkriegs wurde jedoch aus den östlichen Vororten von Görlitz die Stadt Zgorzelec. Görlitz gilt als eine der schönsten Städte Deutschlands. Der bemerkenswerte historische Stadtkern entstand im Laufe der Jahrhunderte und besteht aus Gebäuden, die die Baustile Gotik, Renaissance, Barock, Neoklassizismus und Jugendstil repräsentieren. Glücklicherweise ist der Großteil des ursprünglichen Stadtgebiets im Laufe der Jahrhunderte erhalten geblieben und heute ist Görlitz das größte Flächendenkmal Deutschlands mit mehr als 4000 größtenteils restaurierten historischen Stätten. bemerkenswerte Skyline macht Görlitz zu einem beliebten Drehort für Filme. Viele bekannte Filme nutzten Görlitz als Kulisse, unter anderem wurden Filme wie "The Grand Budapest Hotel", "Inglorious Bastards" und "Monuments Men" in Görlitz gedreht. Bei Interesse hält das Tourismusbüro eine Karte mit allen Drehorten bereit. Es gibt so viele Attraktionen, dass ich nur einige nennen möchte, die ich für besonders interessant halte. Ein guter Ausgangspunkt für einen Stadtrundgang ist der Obermarkt, ein großer Platz umgeben von historischen Gebäuden. An den gegenüberliegenden Enden des Obermarkts befinden sich zwei Sehenswürdigkeiten. Eine davon, in der Nähe des Brunnens, ist die Dreifaltigkeitskirche, die ihren Besuchern spektakuläre Innenwandmalereien präsentiert. Der zweite ist der Reichenbacher Turm, ehemals Teil der historischen Stadtbefestigung. Die Belohnung für den Aufstieg auf die Spitze des höchsten Gebäudes von Görlitz ist ein herrlicher Ausblick über die historische Stadt. Auch die Besichtigung der unglaublichen "Sonnenorgel" in der Peterskirche sollten Sie sich nicht entgehen lassen. Noch besser ist es, eines der regelmäßigen Orgelkonzerte in dieser historischen Kirche zu besuchen. Für Buchliebhaber ist Pflicht die Bibliothek der Oberlausitzer Gesellschaft der Wissenschaften zu besuchen. Diese Bibliothek mit ihren mehr als 140.000 Büchern gilt als eine der schönsten Bibliotheken der Welt. Nicht zuletzt, ein Besuch des "Schlesischen Museums" im "Schönhof", dem ältesten Renaissancegebäude in Görlitz, lehrt Wissenswertes über die lokale Kunst und Kultur. Da Worte nicht ausreichen, um Görlitz zu beschreiben, sollten Sie ihren nächsten Besuch in Dresden ausnutzen um Görlitz selbst zu besuchen.

#### GERMAN TOURS OFF THE BEAT-EN PATH: GÖRLITZ

Maybe you are thinking of visiting Germany and are currently browsing tour offerings. You will find most travel companies offer visits to the same set of cities, Berlin, Munich, Frankfurt, Dresden, Heidelberg, and a few more. These are either big cities, making it

inconvenient to see all the attractions or smaller cities that drown in tourists. If you prefer to have a smalltown experience, explore your surroundings walking on cobblestone streets and meet more residents than tourists, then consider visiting Görlitz. Unfortunately, its location as Germany's easternmost city makes travelling there a bit inconvenient. However, should you visit Dresden and have an extra day or two, from there it only will take an hour to Görlitz by car or train. Görlitz is situated on the left bank of the Lusatian-Neisse River, which also demarcates the German-Polish border. If you ever wanted to visit Poland, this is also your chance. All you have to do is cross the Old Town bridge, and once you reach on the other side, you are in the Polish town of Zgorzelec. These two cities used to be one. Following the events of WWII the eastern suburbs of Görlitz became the town of Zgorzelec. Görlitz is considered being one of Germany's most beautiful cities. Its notable historic town center took shape over hundreds of years and is made up of buildings representing Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque, Neoclassicistic and Art-Nouveau architectural styles. Luckily, most of the original layout has been preserved over the centuries and today Görlitz is the largest area monument in Germany with more than 4000 mostly restored historic sites. Its remarkable skyline makes Görlitz a popular location to shoot movies. Many mainstream movies used Goerlitz as backdrop, amongst them films like "The Grand Budapest Hotel", "Inglorious Bastards", and "Monuments Men" were filmed in Görlitz. If you are interested, the tourist office has a map with all the filming locations. There are so many attractions that I will just mention a few that I consider interesting. A good starting point for a city tour is the Upper Market (Obermarkt), a large square surrounded by historic buildings. At the opposing ends of the Upper Market are two attractions worth seeing. One, close to the fountain, is the Holy Trinity Church (Dreifaltigkeitskirche), presenting spectacular interior wall paintings to its visitors. The second is the Reichenbach Tower (Reichenbacher Turm), formerly a part of the historic town fortification. The reward for climbing up to the top of the tallest building in Goerlitz is a magnificent view of the historic city. Also, do not to miss viewing the incredible 'Sun Organ' in the St. Peter's Church. Even better is attending one of the regular organ concerts in this historic church. For book lovers, a visit of the Upper Lusatian Society Library of Sciences is mandatory. This Library with its more than 140,000 books is considered one of the most beautiful libraries on the planet. Last but not least, visiting the "Silesian Museum" housed in "Schönhof," the oldest Renaissance building in Görlitz will teach you about local art and culture. Since words cannot adequately describe Görlitz, go and visit next time you are in Dresden.

#### MAGGIE KUHN – GRAY PANTHER

Margaret "Maggie" Eliza Kuhn was born in 1905 to a German immigrant father and a Dutch American mother in Buffalo, New York. Maggie graduated from Case Western Reserve University's Women's College af-



ter studying sociology and English. While in college, she organized a branch of the League of Women's Voters. Her first job was with the YWCA of Cleveland where she stayed for eleven years. Maggie next went to work as a deacon for the Presbyterian Church USA, and later served on the session, the church's governing body. Her progressive stands with the church led to positions on desegregation, urban housing, the Cold War, and nuclear arms proliferation. In 1961, Kuhn was invited to participate in the White House Conference on Aging. In 1970, Kuhn was forced into mandatory retirement herself at age 65. Kuhn was outraged and formed an ad hoc activist organization for Older Persons. A year later, she founded the political action group, the Gray Panthers who lent their support to improving health care, pension rights, public transportation, voter registration, housing, and legal services for the poor. The Gray Panthers were responsible in 1978 for the Discrimination of Employment Act which raised the retirement age to 70. They helped bring changes to Medicare and investigated nursing homes and fraud against the elderly. Maggie Kuhn was active until her death at age 89. At that time, the Gray Panthers had 70,000 members in 85 chapters across the United States. In 1995, Maggie Kuhn was inducted into the National Women's Hall of Fame.
