

DIE BERLINER MAUER

Vor sechzig Jahren, am 13. August 1961 wurde die Berliner Mauer errichtet, eine grausame Grenze der kommunistischen Regierung, ohnegleichen in der Geschichte der Welt. Als 1945 der 2. Weltkrieg zu Ende war teilten die Alliierten in den Friedenskonferenzen in Yalta und Potsdam die besiegte Nation in vier "Besatzungszonen." Der östliche Teil wurde der Sowjetunion zugesagt, während die westlichen Teile an die Vereinigten Staaten, England und Frankreich gingen. Die von kommunistischen Landregionen umgebende Stadt West Berlin "steckte," wie Nikita Khrushchev (russischer Premierminister) erwähnte, "wie ein Knochen im sowietischen Hals." Die Russen wollten die westlichen Alliierten aus der Stadt haben. und versuchten mit einer totalen Blockade (1948) die Berliner auszuhungern. Aber die US und ihre Allijerten retteten ganz West Berlin mit der berühmten Berliner Luftbrücke, die die ganze Stadt ein Jahr lang, mit ALLEN Notwendigkeiten versorgten. 1949 sagten die Russen die Blockade ab. Massenimmigrationen aus der Ostzone folgten via West Berlin. In 1961 gingen 8,507 Leute über die Grenze, und am 12. August folgten 2.400 Ostdeutsche nach West Berlin (die größte Zahl ostdeutscher Flüchtlinge an einem Tag). Die Sowjetunion legte am nächsten Tag Stacheldraht den Straßen entlang, dies mit bewaffneten Soldaten. Bald folgten Betonklötze und weitere Sperren, die Ost Berlin von West Berlin trennten. Der Grund laut der Sowjetunion, es sollte ein antifaschistischer Schutzwall sein, der die Ostzone vor dem Westen schützen sollte. Flüchtlinge aus der Ostzone griffen bald zu unglaublichen Methoden über die Grenze zu entkommen. Conrad Schumann, ein ostdeutscher Grenz-Polizist, der den Stacheldraht mit seinem Gewehr bewachen sollte, war der erste, der mit einem unerwarteten Sprung über den Stacheldraht, in die Freiheit von West Berlin sprang. Familien, Freunde und Bekannte waren plötzlich auseinandergerissen. Ungefähr 5.000 Personen entkamen der Ostzone, mit großen Risikos für ihre eigene Sicherheit: ihre Methoden bezogen sich auf waghalsige, mutige und sogar selbstmörderische Versuche. Eine große Zahl der Flüchtlinge, die es über die Grenze schafften, kamen durch einen ausgegrabenen Tunnel in den Westen. 1962 erhielt eine Gruppe junger Flüchtlinge finanzielle Hilfe von NBC und starteten einen Tunnel unter einer Bäckerei im Westen. Circa ein Dutzend Männer gruben elf Meter tief eine kleine, rechteckige Öffnung, gerade groß genug für eine Person kriechend, auf Händen und Knien durchzukommen. Fünf Monate lang schufteten die Jungen, ohne Pause Erde zu entfernen und schliefen in der Bäckerei in verkrusteten, ungewaschenen Körpern. Die Erde transportierten sie in Mehlsäcken ab, um keine Aufmerksamkeit auf sich zu lenken, damit sie einen Tunnel in der Länge eines amerikanischen Fußballfelds graben konnten. Sie endeten auf der anderen Seite in einer alten Toilette hinter einem Wohngebäude wo das Passwort für die Flüchtlinge: "Tokvo" zu finden war. 57 Ostdeutsche krabbelten durch den Tunnel, bis die Grenzstreife alles stoppte. Für jeden, der es aus dem Osten schaffte war es ein Wunder. In den 28 Jahren der Mauer waren 300 Leute durch verschiedene Tunnel in den Westen "gekrochen"! Unerwartet öffneten Ost Deutsche Polizisten die Mauer am 9. November 1989, 28 Jahren nach der Errichtung derselben. Berliner von beiden Seiten jubelten und feierten die neue Freiheit.

THE BERLIN WALL

Sixty years ago, on August 13th, the Berlin Wall was erected; a cruel border of the communist government, unparalleled in the history of the world. When the Second World War ended in 1945, the Allies divided the defeated nation into four "zones of occupation" at the peace conferences in Yalta and Potsdam. The eastern part was promised to the Soviet Union, while the western part went to the United States, England, and France. The city of West Berlin, surrounded by communist territory, "was stuck", said Nikita Khrushchev (Russian Prime Minister) "like a bone in the Soviet throat." The Russians wanted the western allies out of the city and tried to starve the Berliners with a blockade in 1948. But the US and its allies rescued all of West Berlin with the famous Berlin Airlift, which supplied the whole city with ALL necessities for a year. In 1949, the Russians canceled the blockade. Mass migrations from the Eastern Zone followed via West Berlin. In 1961,

around 8,507 went across the divide and on August 12, 1961, 2,400 East Germans came to West Berlin (the largest number of East German refugees in one day). The Soviet Union laid barbed wire on the streets the next day, with armed soldiers, but concrete blocks and other barriers soon followed, separating East Berlin from West Berlin. The Wall, according to the Soviet Union, was to be an anti-fascist protective barrier, protecting the Eastern Zone from the western influence. Refugees from the Eastern Zone soon resorted to incredible methods of escaping across the border. Conrad Schumann, an East German border police officer who was supposed to guard the barbed wire with a rifle, was the first to jump over the barbed wire to the freedom of West Berlin. Families, friends, and acquaintances were suddenly torn apart. Approximately 5,000 people escaped the Eastern Zone at great risk to their own safety and their methods involved daring, courageous, and even suicidal attempts. Many of the refugees who made it across the border came to the west in excavated tunnels. In 1962, a group of young East German refugees received financial help from NBC and started a tunnel under a bakery in the west. About a dozen men dug a small, rectangular opening, 36 feet deep, just big enough for a person to crawl to get through on their hands and knees. For five months the young men slaved, clearing earth without a break and slept in the bakery, in crusty, unwashed bodies. They carried the earth in sacks of flour so as not to attract attention, so that they could dig a tunnel the length of an American football field. They ended up on the other side, in an old outside toilet behind a residential building, where the password for the refugees was: "Tokyo". 57 East Germans crawled through the tunnel, until the border patrol stopped everything. For everyone who made it from the east, it was a miracle. In the 28 years of the Wall, 300 people "crawled" through various tunnels to the west! Quite unexpectedly, East German police opened the wall on November 9, 1989, 28 years after its beginning. Berliners from both sides cheered and celebrated the new freedom.

Oscar F. Mayer – Meat Products

scar Ferdinand Mayer was born in 1859 in Kosingen, Germany where his family had been foresters and ministers for generations. When Oscar was eleven his father died, he left school and went to work for his cousin, John Schroll, a grocer in Munich. In 1873, at age 14, Oscar emigrated with the Schroll family settling in Detroit and then Chicago. In both cities, Oscar



worked for small retail butcher shops. He then worked for Armour & Co., the large meat-packing firm. In the hope of starting his own business, Oscar wrote home to his brother Gottfried, and suggested that he learn the art of sausage-making as an apprentice in Germany. Gottfried followed his older brother's advice before coming to Chicago. Meanwhile, in 1883, Oscar left Armour to open his own meat market in the north Chicago neighborhood that German immigrants called home. Mayer leased the building from the owner whose own meat business was failing. When that owner refused to renew the lease in the hope of reviving his own business, the Mayer brothers borrowed \$10,000 and bought their own building with room for living quarters. The new market became an instant success. The neighbors loved the old-world sausages and traditional meat cuts. Oscar Mayer next returned to Germany, found a wife, and persuaded a third brother to join the business in America. In time, the "Edelweiss" trademark appeared on bacon, linked sausage and lard, the company became part of the federal meat inspection program, and Oscar's son, Oscar G. Mayer, graduated from Harvard and joined the team of seventy employees. Company expansion included automobile deliveries, advertising, window displays, and "Little Oscar" in his Wienermobile. In World War II, Oscar Mayer was a major provider of food for the armed forces. When Oscar F. Mayer died at age 95 in 1955, Oscar Mayer Corporation had annual sales of \$225 million dollars. The Oscar F. Mayer family continued to head the corporation with Oscar G. Mayer, and Oscar G. Mayer, Jr. leading the company until the 1970's. - Barbara Streit
