### **Firefighter Swearing-in**



### **FOR YOUR SAFETY**

With the reopening comes some restrictions and procedures. They are as follows: Food and beverage establishments must:



 Limit the number of patrons in indoor areas to 25 percent of the food or beverage establishment's indoor capacity, excluding the food or beverage establishment's employees;

- Limit seating to a maximum of eight (8) customers per table (unless they are from a family from the same household) and arrange seating to achieve a minimum distance of six feet (6 ft) between parties;
- Require customers to only consume food or beverages while seated;
- Require patrons to wear face coverings while inside the indoor premises of the food or beverage establishment, except when eating or drinking at their table;
- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that customers be seated in order to place orders;
- For food or beverage establishments with table service, require that wait staff bring food or beverages to seated customers
- Keep doors and windows open where possible and utilize fans to improve ventilation.
- Members sign in when entering the dining/ bar area in order for tracking if necessary.
- An ATM will be located outside for your convenience.

At this time there will be no seating at the bar. When there is no waitress on duty you may order a drink from the bartenders. Please then return to your seat. Please keep the wait line for drinks to no more than three people at a time.

We will not require reservations at this time unless we see a high trend in numbers for dining nights.

Please be mindful of your fellow members. In the case there are members waiting to enter the dining/bar area for dinner or drinks please keep in mind the amount of time that you have spent in the clubhouse in order to let everyone enjoy the clubhouse.

At this time, there are no restrictions on the number of guests that you bring into the clubhouse. When signing them in, please have them add their phone number in case tracking is necessary.

# A NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD ON MEMBERSHIP CARDS

The Deutscher Club Executive Board kindly asks that all of our members make an effort to have their



membership cards on them at all times when visiting the club for member or public events.

If asked by an employee or staff member to show your membership card, we request that you politely do so. This is not meant as a slight toward you personally, we are a large club with a rotating staff and Board, and not everyone always know each other.

It is very important for members to have their membership card on their person as it is required by law and keeps us in compliance with the New Jersey Alcoholic Beverage Commission. Not doing so risks penalties for our club and possible loss of our liquor license.

## **Deutsche Ecke**



### **DIE SCHNEEKUGEL**

"Wenn man eine Reise tut, kann man was erleben", ist ein bekanntes deutsches Sprichwort, und wenn jemand im Familienoder Freundeskreis auf Urlaub geht, oder sonst ein Reise macht, ist ein "Mitbringsel" eine oft erwartete Tradition und Freude. In vielen Heimen besteht so ein Mitbringsel aus einer Glaskugel, in der es etwas zu sehen gibt; wenn man diese Kugel schüttelt, sieht es aus, als ob es schneit. Die Original Wiener Schneekugelmanufaktur produziert seit mehr als hundert Jahren die "Original Wiener Schneekugeln". Sie bestehen aus einem mit Wasser gefüllten Behälter aus Glas oder Kunststoff, in dem kleine Partikel sind, die beim Schütteln aufwirbeln und wie Schnee niederfallen. Die Kugeln enthalten kleine Figuren oder Miniatur Landschaften die als Erinnerungen dienen. Der ursprüngliche Vorläufer erschien auf der Pariser Weltausstellung 1878, eine mit Wasser gefüllte Glaskugel mit dem Motiv: ein Mann mit aufgespanntem Regenschirm. Ende des 19. Jahrhunderts erfand der Chirurgieinstrumente Mechaniker, Erwin Perzy, die "Schneekugel mit Schnee-Effekt" neu, und patentierte sie. Er wollte auf Wunsch von Chirurgen eine sehr helle Lichtquelle entwickeln. Er stellte einen wassergefüllten Glaskolben vor brennenden Kerzen, und damit sich der Schein noch verstärkte, gab er Glasspäne dazu. Die Späne erinnerten ihn an Schnee und so entstand die Schneekugel. Als sein erster Versuch, baute er ein winziges, schneebedecktes Modell von der Basilika von Mariazell, indem er Griess als rieselnden Schnee benutzte. Noch heute existiert die Großproduktion der Schneekugeln in Wien (120 Jahre alt), die von seinem Enkel geführt wird. Um zu zeigen, dass die Schneekugel Produktion auch humorvolle Ideen hervorbringt, gibt es heute, in Zeiten der Corona Krise, auch Schneekugeln mit Klopapier. Moderne Methoden erlaubten Massenproduktion, die die Schneekugeln mit vielerlei thematischen Innenansichten beliebt machten und sehr schnell als beliebtes Reisemitbringsel gesucht werden. Heute werden die Kugeln oft mit Polystyrol gefüllt, dass dann wie Schnee



aussieht. Als Hauptthema findet man die Kugeln in Filmen und Büchern, wie Citizen Kane von Orson Wells und Die Arena von Stephen King. Auch Computerspiele und musikalische Spieldosen. Obwohl es ähnliche Produkte in vielen Ländern gibt, sind die Original Wiener Schneekugeln die bevorzugte Sammelobjekte. Wenn Sie sich in ihrem Heim umschauen, entdecken Sie vielleicht eine längst vergessene Erinnerung auf dem Regal.

### THE SNOWGLOBE

"When you go on a trip, you can experience something", is a well-known German proverb, and when someone goes on vacation with family or friends or makes a special trip, a" souvenir" is an often expected tradition and joy. In many homes, a souvenir consists of a glass ball in which there is something to see; when you shake this ball, it looks like it's snowing. The Original Wiener Schneekugelmanufaktur has been producing the "Original Wiener Schneekugel" for more than a hundred years. It consists of a glass or plastic container filled with water in which small particles swirl up when shaken and look like snow. The spheres contain small figures or miniature landscapes that evoke memories. The original forerunner appeared at the Paris World Exhibition in 1878, a glass ball filled with water with the motif of a man with an open umbrella. At the end of the 19th century, the surgical instrument mechanic, Erwin Perzy, reinvented the "snow globe with

snow effect" and patented it. At the request of surgeons, he wanted to develop a very bright light source. He placed a glass flask filled with water in front of burning candles and added glass shavings to make the glow even stronger. The shavings reminded him of snow and that's how the snow globe was made. As his first attempt, he built a tiny, snow-covered model of the Mariazell Basilica, using semolina as falling snow. Large-scale production of snow globes still exists today in Vienna (120 years later), which is run by Perzy's grandson. In order to show that the snow globe production also has a sense of humor, during this time of the Corona crisis, they produced snow globes with a roll of toilet paper inside. Modern methods allowed mass production, which made the snow globes with a variety of thematic interior views popular and are very much sought after as a popular souvenir. The snow globe often appears as the main motif in books: The Arena, by Stephen King, in films: Citizen Kane, by Orson Wells; as well as in computer games. If you take a look around your home, you might even discover a longforgotten memory on the shelf.

### Marga Faulstich – Eyeglass Lenses

'arga Faulstich was born in Weimar, Germany in 1915. In 1922, Marga's family moved to Jena where she completed her education. Faulstich then began her training as a glass chemist at Schott AG, a manufacturer of optical and specialty glass used for eyeglasses, microscopes, telescopes, and other medical equipment. While continuing to work at Schott, Faulstich worked on the development of thin glass films. This new process made it possible to create glass with anti-reflective coating that shields x-rays and UV light. After World War II, the glass plant moved to the outskirts of Mainz-Neustadt in 1952. Having lost her fiancé in the war, Marga focused on her work at Schott and became a pioneer in the field of optical glasses. She registered over 40 patents in her name that still form the basis of making sunglasses, anti-reflective lenses, and glass facades used in high rise building construction. In 1973, Faulstich received the IR 100 Award from the American Industrial Research Council for inventing the SF64 lightweight lens used in many glass products today. Marga Faulstich was the first woman executive at Schott AG and retired after 44 years of company service. She died in Mainz in 1998. A Google doodle honored Marga Faulstich on June 16, 2018 on her 103rd birthday.
