Currently, all officers on the Board have confirmed that they will be running for re-election except for Michael Alexy, 2nd Vice President and Michael Saake, Financial Secretary. According to the recent amendments to the By Laws, Section V. D. 2. states, to efficiently transition to a two (2) year election term for all Executive Officer, (i) Effective as of the January 2023 Annual Membership Elections, all positions of the Executive Board with the exclusion of the President shall be up for election. The 2nd Vice President, Financial Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Membership Secretary shall be elected to serve for a term of two (2) years. Going forward, this shall be referred to as the "Odd Year Election Cycle". (ii) Effective as of the January 2024 Annual Membership Meeting Elections, the positions of President, 1st Vice President, Treasurer, and Recording Secretary shall be elected to serve for a term of (2) years. Going forward, this shall be referred to as the "Even Year Election Cycle". The Trustee positions open for re-election are: one currently held by Suzanna Polhamus (3-yr term); one currently held by Annette Glorius (3-yr term).

Prior to the Elections, the Nominating Committee will present the slate of candidates at the December Monthly Membership Meeting (**Wednesday, December 14th**). No additional nominations will be accepted from the floor at that time.

Additional details to the election process will be provided in next month's bulletin.

Historical Significance

The fall of the Berlin Wall on the 9th of November in 1989, which marked the end of the Cold War, had paved the way for German reunification



barely a year later. The Unification Treaty that was signed on the 20th of September in 1990 and declares the **3rd of October** the national holiday, sealed the end of the division of Germany. (www.berlin.de)



German-American Day is a United States holiday which celebrated German American heritage. It is observed every year on **October 6th.**

The date of October 6th was chosen because on this day in 1683 thirteen German Mennonite and Quaker families from the town of Krefeld landed in Philadelphia and founded the borough of Germantown that was absorbed into Philadelphia in 1854. Germantown was the first German settlement in North America.

German-American Day was first celebrated in the 19th century. Its celebrations were discontinued during the First World War Continued on page 6

WEISSE STÖRCHE

Storch, Storch bester, bring mir 'ne kleine Schwester Storch, Storch guter, bring mir `nen kleinen Bruder

So lautet die Bitte eines Kindes (aus den dreißiger Jahren), mit der Hoffnung, dass der Storch ihm ein Schwesterlein oder Brüderlein bringt. Der Glaube, dass Störche mit volkstümlichen Geschichten, Legenden und Aberglauben verbunden ist, ist uralt, besonders, dass der Storch das Baby liefert. In Äsops Fabeln (6.Jahrhundert) und in Hans Christian Andersons "Die Tochter des Sumpfkönigs" erscheinen Störche als Symbole für Fruchtbarkeit und Harmonie in der Familie. Weisse Störche brüten im Westen Europas und Asian, aber viele machen ihr sommerliches Heim in Deutschland, besonders im Norden. Germanische Völker glaubten, dass diese Vögel menschliche Seelen haben und dass ein Nest auf dem Haus es vor Feuer schützen würde. In Wirklichkeit sind die Zeiten der Winter- und Sonnenwenden der Grund für die Beliebtheit dieser Vögel, weil längere Tage im Frühling die Störche zurückbringen und in den kälteren Tagen im Herbst ihre Nester leer bleiben. Bis Anfang des 19. Jahrhunderts wussten Europäer nicht, wohin die Störche zogen, als sie aus dem Norden fortflogen. Zufälligerweise schoss ein Jäger in 1822 einen weissen Storch in Mecklenburg ab, der mit einem außergewöhnlichen 80cm langen afrikanischem Pfeil in der Brust abstürzte. Nach einiger Forschung und mehreren verwundeten Störchen mit ähnlichen Pfeilen wurde es klar, dass diese Störche zur Überwinterung nach Afrika flogen. Sie wurden mit dem Namen Pfeilstorch bekannt und bis ietzt sind mehr als 25 Pfeilstörche dokumentiert.

Diese Störche werden für Sport und Essen abgeschossen, haben aber keine Angst vor Menschen und ihre Nester sind sehr willkommen auf den Kirchtürmern, Hausdächern und Telefon pfählen und Kaminen. Es sind große Flugvögel, ca. 100-115 cm groß, mit lanaen dünnen, roten Beinen; die Flügel sind weiss und die Schwanzfedern sind schwarz: sie schnattern mit ihren langen roten Schnäbeln und die Spannweite der Flügel messen ca. 155 -183 cm. Das Land um die Elbe ist eine der meistbesuchten Gegend der Störche, die auch als Storchenstrasse im Reiseführer genannt wird. Von März bis September ist ihr Schnattern ein wohl bekannter Laut, besonders im nördlichen Wadden See National Park (UNESCO Park), wo im diesjährigen September 300 geplante Ereignisse stattfanden, mit denen die Störche ihre letzten Tage im Norden verbringen. Seit der Klimaveränderung mit wärmeren Wintern, fliegen viele Störche nicht mehr den langen Weg nach Afrika, sondern überwintern in dem etwas



wärmeren Spanien. Als ich vor einigen Jahren durch Spanien reiste, blieb ich ein paar Tage in Alcala, was als die Stadt der Störche bekannt ist, (Alcalá es la ciudad de las sigúeñas), denn fast jeder Turm und jede Gebäudespitze hatte ein Storchnest mit drei oder vier Störchen vorzuzeigen, wo die Störche aus dem Norden den Winter verbringen und auf den Frühling warten. Für Naturliebhaber ist es ein guter Grund eine Reise nach Norddeutschland zwischen März und September zu planen. (S.Hudgins)

WHITE STORKS

Stork, Stork, dear Mister, bring me a 'lil sister. Stork, Stork, no other. Bring me a 'lil brother (free translation)

That is the request of a child (from the 30's) with the hope, that the stork would bring him a little sister or brother. The belief that storks are connected to folkloric stories, legends and superstitions is from ancient times, especially that a stork delivers a baby. Already in Aesop's fables in the 6th century and in Hans Christian Anderson's "The daughter of the swamp king" storks appear as symbols of fertility and family harmony. White storks breed in western Europe and Asia, but many make their summer home in Germany, particularly in the north. Germanic peoples believed that these birds have human souls and that a nest on the house would protect them from fire. In fact, the times of winter and solstices are the reason for the popularity of these birds, because longer days in spring bring the storks back and the colder days in autumn leave their nests empty. Until the early 19th century, Europeans did not know where the storks were going as they flew away from the north. Coincidentally, in 1822 in Mecklenburg, a hunter shot down a white stork that landed with an extraordinary 34.5" African arrow in its chest. After some research and several wounded storks with similar arrows, it became clear that these storks were flying to Africa for the Winter. They came to be known by the name of arrow storks and more than 25 arrow storks have been documented to date.

These storks are shot for sport and food but are not afraid of humans and their nests are most welcome on church steeples, house roofs and telephone poles and chimneys. They are large flying birds, about 40-45" tall, with long, thin, red legs; the wings are white and

the tail feathers are black; they chatter with their long red beaks and the span of the wings measures about 61-72". The area around the Elbe is one of the most visited regions for storks, which is also referred to as the Stork Road in travel guides. From March to September, their chattering is a well-known sound, particularly in northern Wadden Lake National Park (UNESCO Park), which hosted 300 planned events this September to mark the storks' final days in the north. Since the climate changed to warmer winters, many storks no longer fly the long way to Africa, but spend the winter in the somewhat warmer southern Europe. While traveling through Spain a few years ago, I stayed a several days in Alcala, known as the city of storks (Alcalá es la ciudad de las sigúeñas), because almost every tower and spire had a stork's nest with three or four storks in it. There these storks from the north spend the winter and wait for spring to return north. For nature lovers, this is a good reason to plan a trip to northern Germany between March and September. Emile Berliner – Inventor of Records

Emile Berliner was born in Hanover, Germany in 1851. As one of thirteen children in his family, he finished school at age fourteen and soon began doing odd jobs to help support his family. At nineteen, Berliner moved to America, first



to Washington, D.C., and later to New York City where he took classes in physics at the Cooper Union Institute. In 1877, the year after Alexander Graham Bell invented the telephone, Berliner discovered that a loose metal contact could act like a transmitter, or microphone, and greatly improve the telephone receiver. He sold his idea to the Bell Telephone Company and was offered a job in research. After working on many Bell Telephone improvements, Berliner decided to go out on his own in 1884. Within two years, his interests switched from the telephone to mechanical recording and the reproduction of sound. He patented his first gramophone in 1887 which used a flat phonograph disc (record) and a stylus that moved horizontally. This new method produced more of the original sounds and was a significant improvement over Edison's cylinders. Berliner also invented a method for mass producing records and established Berliner Gramophone Company. Later Berliner would go on to design an early helicopter and an acoustic sound tile. Emile Berliner died of a heart attack at age 78 in 1929. His Berliner Gramophone companies would become PolyGram Records, BMI, and EMI. Barbara Streit
