

The Bus departs the Club at 10:30 AM and returns to the Club at 7:00 PM



THE GERMAN-AMERICAN STEUBEN PARADE IN NEW **YORK CITY**

Saturday, September 17th, 2022



This year we celebrate the 65th German-American Steuben Parade in New York City. Established in 1957 with the first Steuben Parade held in Yorkville (known as Germantown), it celebrated German, Austrian, and Swiss-American heritage and culture and has grown into the largest event of its kind in the United States. Today, the parade continues to march up 5th Avenue to 86th Street, led by cadets representing the German Language Club of the West Point Military Academy, founded by General von Steuben himself. The three-hour parade is filled with German groups wearing their traditional costumes, spectacular floats, marching bands, dancers, clubs, and organizations from across the United States, Germany, Switzerland, Austria, and Canada. Die Heinzelmännchen von Köln

Hier ist ein wichtiges Stück deutsches Kulturgut. Die Geschichte von den Heinzelmännchen wurde zunächst von Ernst Weyden, ein Kölner Schriftsteller, als Prosaerzählung im Jahre 1826 veröffentlich. Der Dichter und Maler August Kopisch hat danach 1836 eine Gedichtfassung geschrieben, die bis in der heutigen Zeit bekannt ist. Das Buch ist immer noch im Handel, z B. bei AMAZON und seine fast zweihundert Jahrfeier (2026) wird bestimmt mit Pomp und Festlichkeiten begangen. Die Heinzelmännchen werden in diesem Werk als Hausgeister beschrieben. Es sind Zwerge, Wichteln und ähnliche Fabelwesen. Sie kommen in der Nacht, wenn alle Menschen schlafen. um deren Arbeit zu verrichten. Und bevor es Morgen wurde, waren sie verschwunden. Sie waren beim Bäcker, beim Schneider, beim Küfer und Metzger und beim Zimmermann. In dem Gedicht geht es weiter mit des Schneiders Frau. Sie war sehr neugierig und wollte unbedingt wissen wer da nun all die Arbeit verrichtete.

Sie streute Erbsen auf die Treppe, um diese Helfer in der Nacht zum Fall zu bringen. Dieser Versuch verfehlte sein Ziel und führte letztlich zum Ende dieser guten Zeiten. Die Heinzelmännchen verließen Köln und, laut Erzählungen sollen auch die guten Zeiten für die Stadt Köln verschwunden sein. Hier ist die erst und letzte Strophe des Gedichtes:

Wie war zu Köln es doch vordem mit Heinzelmännchen so beguem! Denn, war man faul ... man legte sich hin auf die Bank und pflegte sich: Da kamen bei Nacht, ehe man's gedacht, die Männlein und schwärmten

und klappten und lärmten, und rupften und zupften, und hüpften und trabten und putzten und schabten...und eh ein Faulpelz noch erwacht, ...

War all sein Tagewerk... bereits gemacht! 0 weh! nun sind sie alle fort und keines ist mehr hier am Ort

Man kann nicht mehr wie sonsten ruhn, man muss nun alles selber tun.

Ein jeder muss fein selbst fleißig sein, und kratzen und schaben und rennen und



traben und schniegeln und biegeln, und klopfen und hacken und kochen und backen. Ach, dass es noch wie damals wär! Doch kommt die schöne Zeit nicht wieder her!

The Elves of Cologne

Here is an important piece of German Cultural Heritage. The story of the Heinzelmännchen (elves) was first published by Ernst Weyden, a Cologne writer, as a prose narrative in 1826. The poet and painter August Kopisch then wrote a poem in 1836, which is still known today. The book is still on sale, (e.g., on AMA-ZON) and its almost two hundredth anniversary celebration (2026) will certainly be celebrated with pomp and festivities. The Heinzelmännchen are described in this work as house spirits. They come at night when all people are asleep, to do their work, and would disappear before morning came. They visited the baker, the tailor, the cooper, the butcher and the carpenter. The poem continues with the tailor's wife. She was very curious and wanted to know who was doing all the work. She sprinkled peas on the stairs to bring these helpers down at night. This attempt missed its target and ultimately led to the end of these good times. The Heinzelmännchen left Cologne and according to stories, the good times for the city of Cologne also disappeared. Here is the first and last stanza of the poem:

How was it so comfortable in Cologne with Heinzelmännchen before! Because, if you were lazy ... you lay down on the bench and took care of yourself:

At night, before you thought, the little men came and raved.

and worked and noisy, and plucked and plucked, and hopped and

trotted and cleaned and scraped... and when a lazy person awakens, ...

Was all his daily work... already done! Inge Helling



Albert Einstein – Physicist

Albert Einstein was born in Ulm, Wurttemberg, Germany in 1879. Six weeks after Albert's birth, the family moved to Munich, later Italy, and Switzerland. Einstein graduated from the Swiss Polytechnic School in Zurich where he trained to become a teacher of



mathematics and physics. Unable to find a teaching position, Einstein worked as a technical assistant in the Swiss Patent Office while completing his doctorate degree. While at the patent office, Einstein did some of his best work. He explained Brownian motion (the zigzag motion of microscopic particles in suspension), theory of light (television was a practical invention of this theory), theory of relativity (showing time and motion being relative to the observer), and the energy-mass relationship formula (E=mc2). In 1914, Einstein returned to Germany as Director of the Kaiser Wilhelm Institute and as a professor at the University of Berlin. After his home was seized in 1933, he renounced his German citizenship and emigrated to Princeton, NJ to join the mathematics faculty at Princeton University. Greatly distressed by the approaching war in Europe, Einstein sent President Roosevelt a letter attaching a memorandum from Leo Szilard another recent emigrant, warning him about Germany's progress on the atomic bomb. The warning was heeded, and the US began the Manhattan Project to develop our own nuclear weapon. After the war, Einstein became a leading figure in the World Government Movement and was offered the Presidency of Israel. He declined. Many honors and awards were given to Einstein throughout his life, including the 1921 Nobel Prize for physics. Albert Einstein was married twice and had three children. He died in Princeton in 1955. As he requested, his remains were cremated and scattered along the Delaware River.
