EGGENBERG PALAST

Graz ist klein, aber fein. Die Hauptstadt der Steiermark (Österreich) ist nicht nur Kulturhauptstadt, sondern auch Platz einer UNESCO Weltkulturerbestätte. Diese Stätten bekommen ihren Ehrentitel für außergewöhnlichen, universellen Wert für eine Kultur-oder Naturstätte. Gar nicht weit außerhalb von Graz steht ein prächtiger Palast, das Eggenberg Schloss, aus dem 17. Jahrhundert, das weit mehr als eine schöne Fassade bietet. In 1625 wurde Prinz Hans Ulrich von Eggenberg Gouverneur von der Steiermark und beauftragte den wichtigsten Hofarchitekt der Zeit, seine neue Residenz zu entwerfen. Obwohl der 30jährige Krieg in ganz Europa wütete, (von Eggenberg hatte viel Geld) wurde das Schloss zu einer Vereinigung verschiedener architektonischer Stile von der Gotik bis zur zeitgenössischen Zeit gebaut, denn der Wunsch des Regents war eine harmonische Struktur zu schaffen. Einige Jahre später, 1685, erweiterte Hans Ulrichs Enkel, Prinz Johann Seyfried, das Schloss mit dem Planeten Saal und so wurde der Palast zu einer architektonischen Allegorie der Welt. Das Schloss hat 24 Prunksäle mit 52 Türen, in denen die ursprünglichen Möbel und Artefakte des 17. und 18. Jahrhundert in wunderbarem Zustand aus dem Barock erhalten sind. Die Säle haben 60 Fenster, aber das ganze Schloss hat 365 Fenster, mit 31 Zimmer auf jedem Stockwerk und vier Ecktürme. Alles zeugt für die Anspielung an Zeit: ein Jahr, ein Monat, die Wochen, Tage, Stunden und Minuten und Jahreszeiten. Der Maler Hans Adam Weissenkircher widmete die Decken im Planetensaal den sieben Himmelskörpern, die damals im Gregorianischen Kalender genannt waren: Sonne, Mond, Planeten und Sterne; den Tagen der Woche rechnete er den Römischen Göttern und verschiedenen Metallen zu und schließlich schloss er die Mitglieder der Eggenberg Familie den Zahen bei. Im Ganzen hat das Schloss 500 herrliche Deckengemälde, die heute noch in höchst außergewöhnlichem Zustand erhalten sind. An den Wänden findet man die zwölf Tierkreiszeichen, die das Spiel der astronomischen Zahlen vervollständigen. In der Alten Galerie sind 600 Jahre der europäischen Geschichte in einem Gesamtkunstwerk

vom Mittelalter bis zum Ende des Barocks ausgestellt, unter denen auch die großen Werke der niederländischen Meistern des 17. Jahrhunderts sind. Eine besondere Attraktion sind die Gärten, umgrenzt von einem weitläufigen Landschaftspark aus der Zeit der Romantik, mit einem wertvollen Baumbestand und Rosengarten, die zu den kostbarsten Garten Denkmälern des Landes zählen. Prächtige Pfauen stolzieren im Schlossgarten unter den Besuchern umher. Die Eggenberg Familie starb 1717 mit dem letzten männlichen Erbe aus, der mit 13 Jahren an Blinddarmentzündung starb. Das Schloss ist heute ein Teil des Universalmuseums "Joanneum" und beherbergt neben den Prunkräumen, dem Planetensaal und der Alten Galerie auch das Münzkabinett und das Archäologiemuseum. Wenn in Österreich, wäre ein Besuch nach Graz und dem Eggenberg Palast sehr zu empfehlen.

EGGENBERG PALACE

Graz is small but beautiful. The capital of Styria (Austria) is not only the cultural capital, but also a UNESCO World Heritage Site. These sites receive their honorary title for exceptional, universal value as a cultural or natural site. Not far outside Graz stands a magnificent palace, the Eggenberg Castle, from the 17th century, which offers much more than a beautiful facade. In 1625, Prince Hans Ulrich von Eggenberg became governor of Styria and commissioned the most important court architect of the time to design his new residence. Although the Thirty Years' War raged throughout Europe (von Eggenberg had a lot of money), the castle was built as a union of different architectural styles from Gothic to contemporary style, because the regent's wish was to create a harmonious structure. A few years later, in 1685, Hans Ulrich's grandson, Prince Johann Seyfried, extended the palace with the Planet Hall, and so the palace became an architectural allegory of the world. The palace has 24 state rooms with 52 doors, in which the original furniture and artifacts of the 17th and 18th centuries are preserved in wonderful condition



from the Baroque period. The rooms have 60 windows, but the whole castle has 365 windows, with 31 rooms on each floor and four corner towers. All numbers testifying to the allusion of time: a year, a month, the weeks, days, hours, minutes and seasons. The painter Hans Adam Weissenkircher dedicated the ceilings in the Planet Hall to the seven celestial bodies known at that time in the Gregorian calendar: the sun, moon, planets and stars; the days of the week he attributed to the Roman gods and various metals and finally he included the members of the Eggenberg family in the number scheme. In total, the castle has 500 magnificent ceiling paintings, which are still preserved in a highly exceptional condition today. On the walls you can find the twelve signs of the zodiac, which complete the play on astronomical numbers. In the "Alte Galerie," there are 600 years of European history exhibited in a total work of art from the Middle Ages to the end of the Baroque period, including the great works of the Dutch masters of the 17th and 18th century. Special attractions include the gardens surrounded by a spacious countryside park from the Romantic period, with a valuable selection of trees as well as a rose garden, which counts among the most precious garden monuments in the country. Additionally, magnificent peacocks stroll among the visitors in the castle garden. The Eggenberg family died out in 1717 with the last male heir, who succumbed to appendicitis at the age of 13. The castle is now part of the Universalmuseum Joanneum and, in addition to the state rooms and the Old Gallery, houses the coin cabinet and the archaeology museum. When in Austria, a visit to Graz and the Eggenberg Palace is definitely recommended. — Barbara Oberdina

HENRY JOHN HEINZ — MANUFACTURER

Henry John Heinz was born in Birmingham, Pennsylvania in 1844 to Henry Heinz and Anna Schmidt, both German immigrants who moved to America in 1840. The family settled in Sharpsburg, PA



where Henry's father was a brickmaker and his mother spent much of her time gardening. By age 8, Henry was selling surplus produce from the family garden. At age 16, he had several employees working in his hotbeds and delivering the produce to Pittsburgh grocers. His first company, formed in 1869 with two other men, prepared and sold sauerkraut, horseradish, vinegar, and pickles. This business failed during the economic Panic of 1875. A year later, with a brother, John Heinz and a cousin, Frederick Heinz, he founded another company. In 1888, with the business thriving, Heinz bought out his family members, and reorganized the business as H.J. Heinz Company. He used only the best produce and advertised attractively designed products. Heinz "57 varieties" is thought to be two lucky numbers suggested by Henry John and his wife. He also was responsible for the first electric sign, a 40-foot-long green pickle with 1200 electric light bulbs at the site of today's Flatiron building in NYC. Heinz lobbied in favor of the Pure Food and Drug Act in 1906. Heinz became a worldwide company with more than 20 food processing plants, seed farms and container facilities by 1909. His factories were known for their cleanliness, safety, and support for employees. Henry John was married to Sarah Young and had five children. He died of pneumonia in 1919 at age 74. The H.J. Heinz Company had family leadership with Henry John's descendants until 1969. In 2015, Heinz merged with Kraft foods to form the Kraft Heinz Foods Company, a world-wide conglomerate. -Barbara Streit
