U.S. Air Force Academy (USA-FA) Cadet, Veron-Cunningham, ica daughter of members Eileen and Bill Cunningham has entered her senior year at the academy and is formally recognized as a firstclass cadet. In this



photo she proudly displays her USAFA class ring - a big event marking the countdown to graduation.

Due to the Pandemic this year, the regular

schedule of events was delayed a bit, from the following explanation of the tradition.

Ring Dance - This formal ball is exclusively for second-degree (junior) cadets. It is held during Graduation Week, before the second-class cadets become first-class cadets, and is where they receive their class rings and unveil the class crest. The rings are traditionally placed in a glass of champagne and are caught in the teeth following a toast. Air Force Academy rings are unique because they are made with white gold, instead of the yellow gold used at other service academies. Designed by each class, one side of the ring bears the Academy crest, while the other side bears the class crest, which always includes elements from the Class of 1959's crest: the class number, the class year, the Polaris star and the eagle. 

CONTINUOUS SANITATION: Staff uses onetime use collection sets and wipe down all surfaces.

MASKS REQUIRED:Donors and staff are required to wear face coverings.

STOLPERSTEINE

m Jahre 1992 initiierte der Bildhauer, Gunter Demnig, ein einmaliges Kunstprojekt, das die Opfer des Nationalsozialismus würdigen sollte. Der Künstler schuf Messingplatten, 10cm x 10cm, die in Strassenpflaster befestig wurden. In diese Gedenktafeln graviert er knappe Lebensdaten von Opfern der NS Zeit. Diese Steine, die Demnig selbst verlegt, erinnern an ermordete Sinti, Roma, Juden, Behinderte, Geistliche, LGBTQ+ und andere. Eingelassen werden diese Stolpersteine in Bürgersteigen vor den ehemaligen Wohnorten, wo die Opfer ihre letzten frohen Tagen verbrachten. Um die Inschrift der Merkmalsteine lesen zu können, muss der Fussgänger innehalten und sich bücken. Demnigs Ziel ist "die Namen der Opfer zurück an die Orte ihres Lebens zu bringen." Wenn man im deutschen Wörterbuch, dem Duden, Stolpersteine nachschaut, findet man, unter anderem, die Erklärung: "ein im Strassenpflaster eingefügter Gedenkstein für die Opfer des Nationalsozialismus." Das einmalige Kunstprojekt wurde so gut und schnell in Deutschland angenommen, dass der Gebrauch der Stolpersteine nicht nur in Deutschland, sondern auch in Österreich, in der Schweiz und in 25 europäischen Ländern verbreitet ist. Seit 2019 sind 75.000 Stolpersteine in mehr als 1.200 europoäischen Städten vom Künstler selbst eingefügt worden. Der Anlass für den ersten Stein war der 50. Jahrestag des Befehls von Heinrich Himmler (Reichsführer der Schutzstaffel-SS) zur Deportation der "Zigeuner". Diesen Stein legte er 1992 vor das Kölner Rathaus. Für Unterstützung hat Demnig ein Team von Künstlern um sich, sowie Schulgruppen, Verwandte und Archive. Bei der Recherche von Daten und Angaben zum Schicksal der Opfer helfen meist Geschichtsvereine. Ein Stolperstein kostet 120 Euro pro Stein und durch Spenden und Patenschaften wird das Kunstprojekt finanziert. Gunter Demnig ist jetzt 71. Mit dem Anfang des Corona-Virus musste der Künstler seine Arbeit an der Verlegung der Steine einhalten, aber seit Juni dieses Jahres ist er wieder auf Reisen (um mehr Stolpersteine zu legen). Die Nachfrage für Stolpersteine ist gross und hat eine Wartezeit. Dieses Kunstwerk ist das grösste, weltweit dezentrale Denkmal. Demnig hofft, dass besonders die Jugendlichen, mehr über ihre Nachbarschaften lernen, sodass diese Grausamkeiten nie wiederholt werden. Beispiel eines echten Stolpersteins:

STUMBLING STONES

In 1992 the sculptor, Gunter Demnig, initiated a unique project to pay tribute to victims of National Socialism. The artist created brass plates, 10 centimeters by 10 centimeters, which were added into the cobble stones of the sidewalk. He

engraves short snippets on the lives of victims of the National Socialism into the memorial plates. These stones, which Demnig himself places, are reminiscent of the murdered Sinti and Roma (also known as gypsies), Jews, Handicapped, clergymen LGBTQ+ and others. These Stumbling stones (metaphorically stumbling blocks) are inserted in the sidewalks in front of the former living quarters, where the victims spent their last happy days. In order to read the inscription of the memorial stones, the pedestrian must stop and bend down. Demnig's aim is: "to bring the names of the victims back to the places where they lived."

If you look up "Stolpersteine" in the Duden, the German Dictionary, one finds among others this explanation: a memorial stone put into the sidewalk surface for the victims of Nazi times. The unique art project was so well and quickly accepted in Germany, that the use of the stumbling stones spread, not only in Germany, but also in Austria, in Switzerland and in 25 European countries. Since 2019, 75,000 stumbling stones have been placed by the artist himself in more than 1,200 European cities. The impetus for the placement of the first stone, was the 50th anniversary of Heinrich Himmler's command (Commander of the Protection Squadron-SS) (1942) to deport the "gypsies". He





placed this stone in 1992 in front of the Cologne Town Hall. For this project, Demnig has a supporting team of artists, as well as school groups, relatives (of the victims) and archives. The research into the fate of the victims, dates and information is done to large part, by historic organizations. The Stolperstein costs 120 euros per stone and the art project is financed with donations and sponsorships. Gunter Demniq is now 71. With the start of the Coronavirus the artist had to curtail his work, but since June of this year he is on the move again. The request for these stones is huge and there is a waiting list. This art project is the largest, worldwide decentralized memorial. Demnig hopes, that especially the young generation will learn more about their neighborhood, so that these cruelties will never be repeated. Here is an example of a genuine Stolperstein



Carl von Linde - Refrigeration

arl von Linde was born in Berndorf, Germany in 1842, to Friedrich, a Lutheran minister, and his wife Franziska Linde. Linde studied literature and culture, but soon became very interested in machine construction, science, and engineering. After attending Eidgenossische Polytechnikum in Zurich, Linde received practical training in workshop and drafting studies. His first employment was with several locomotive manufacturers. Linde then went on to become a professor of theoretical engineering at the Technische Hochschule in Munich where he established the first German engineering laboratory. In 1870, he began to study refrigeration,

and developed the first reliable compressed-ammonia refrigerator. Linde's refrigerators generated great interest not only for making ice, but to the breweries for making beer. Linde left teaching to start commercial production, and by 1891 twelve hundred refrigerators had been ordered. Carl von Linde went on to set up large scale production of liquid air, which could separate liquid oxygen. The process became essential to welders, hospital breathing machines, cryosurgery, liquid chlorine, helium, and rocket fuel. The International Linde Company is still in business today with sales of \$28 billion in 2019.
