The Story of Levi Strauss

Levi Strauss, the inventor of blue jeans, was born in Buttenheim, Bavaria in 1829. Upon the death of his father in 1847, Levi joined his two brothers already in New York City at their wholesale dry goods business and learned the trade. Hearing the news of the California Gold Rush, Strauss boarded a ship in 1853 for the long journey around South America to San Francisco. In California, he opened a dry goods store to sell merchandise to miners. He called his store Levi Strauss & Company and sold bedding, combs, purses, handkerchiefs and bolts of fabric

delivered from his brothers in NYC. The business thrived, and Strauss became well known. In 1872, Jacob Davis, a tailor in Nevada, sent Levi a letter telling him about a better way to make a pair of pants of duck and denim with copper rivets to reinforce pockets. Since Davis could not make the pants

fast enough, he asked Strauss if he could help. Together Strauss and Davis began making the new pants and patented the rivet process. The new pants were made of canvas which was dyed blue to hide stains. Strauss named these pants "waist



high overalls". Later, they became known as "Levi's" or "blue jeans". The new pants cost 22 cents each. Levi Strauss went on to become a charter member of the San Francisco Board of Trade, director of the Nevada Bank, the Liverpool, London, and Globe Insurance Company,

and the San Francisco Gas and Electric Company. Levi Strauss died in 1902, having never married, he left the business to his four nephews and charities. Several pairs of the early jeans can be viewed in the Smithsonian today.

NATUR-UND KULTUR WELTERBESTÄTTEN IN DEUTSCHLAND

Was ist WELTERBE? Die UNESCO (Organisation der Vereinigten Nationen für Erziehung, Wissenschaft und Kultur) vergibt jährlich den Titel "Welterbe" an Denkmäler, Gebäude oder Landschaften, die große kulturelle Bedeutung haben und auch gut erhalten sind. Nur die besten Zeugnisse der architektonischen- und künstlerischen Meisterwerke, so wie Kulturlandschaften, Parks und andere Beispiele gesellschaftlicher und technologischer Entwicklungen der Menschheitsund Naturgeschichte können zum UNESCO Welterbe ernannt, werden. Die Welterbestätten werden regelmäßig von der UNESCO (organisiert 1945) geprüft für Zustand des Welterbes, und auch außergewöhnliches Interesse und Leistung, was zur Förderung internationaler Zusammenarbeit zwischen Völkern beiträgt. Neben dem Kulturerbe gibt es auch Dokumentenerbe (Bücher, Filme), und seit 2006 das immaterielle Kulturerbe (Bräuche und Handwerk). Manche von Deutschlands 42 Welterbestätten sind weltberühmt, andere sind nicht so bekannt. Alle Stätten des Welterbes haben eines gemeinsam: sie sind Beispiele der kulturellen Entwicklung Deutschlands, was schon zweitausend Jahre Geschichte auf dem Buckel hat. 790 wurde der älteste Dom von Aachen gebaut, wo Karl der Große im Jahre 800 zum Kaiser des Hl. Römischen Reiches gekrönt wurde und Kaiser Barbarossa später den riesigen, imposanten Kronleuchter des Doms stiftete. Auch weltweit bekannt ist der Kölner



Dom, größte, gotische Kirche in Nord Europa, die 1164 begonnen wurde. Aber durch Feuer, Kriege und Missbrauch während der französischen Revolution, die die Kirche als Stall und Heulager gebrauchte, wurde der Dom erst 1880 fertig. Ein goldener Schrein enthält die Gebeine der Hl. Drei Könige, die 1164 von Milan nach Köln geschickt wurden. Eine Neuzeit Ausgrabung entdeckte unter dem Dom Funde von zwei Menschen die schon Jahrzehnte vor dem Bau des Domes lebten. Wissenschaftler beschäftigen sich jetzt mit den Ergebnissen moderner Technik, die zeigte, dass es sich um eine Frau und ein Kind handelt, die aber nicht verwandt sind, aber wahrscheinlich vergiftet wurden. Eine echte Kriminalgeschichte vom Dom! Trier, Deutschlands älteste Stadt, wurde vor etwa 2000 Jahren von den Römern gegründet. Die Porta Nigra, das Stadttor, entstand ca. 180 n.Chr., das Amphitheater und eine Therme sind heute Welterbe. Auch der Limes, der die Grenze zwischen dem römischen Imperium und Germanien war, trägt den Titel von UNESCO. Der Limes war im 1.-3. Jahrhundert die Grenze zwischen dem römischen Reich und den Germanischen Stämmen. Die Länge, 550 km, streckte sich von der Nordsee bis nach Regensburg an der Donau und diese Grenze hatte 60 Festungen und 900 Wachtürme. Die Zeche Zollverein war von 1851 bis 1986 ein Bergwerk. die größte Zeche der Welt, ist aber heute ein

Industriedenkmal und ein Tourismusmagnet mit Schwimmbad und Restaurant. Sie befindet sich in der Stadt Essen, im Ruhrgebiet, was durch den Bergbau und die Stahlindustrie geprägt wurde. Sogar eine Fabrik gehört zu den auserlesenen Welterben: in Alfeld, in Niedersachsen, ist das Fagus Werk (1922), ein frühes Beispiel moderner Architektur von Walter Gropius (1883-1969). Die Fabrik produzierte Schuhleisten. Auch die Pfahlbauten im Umland der Alpen, besonders in Uhldingen am Bodensee wurden in die UNESCO Liste aufgenommen. Die Pfahlbauten stammen aus der Stein-und Bronzezeit und durch getreue Arbeit des Pfahlbauten Museums, sind sie heute noch als rekonstruierte Zeugen der Vergangenheit zu besichtigen.

Die Schweiz hat dreizehn Welterbestätten, drei sind Natur-und acht sind Kulturerbe. Österreich hat neun Stätten, alle sind unter Kultur Welterbestätten. Natürlich gibt es noch viel mehr über all diese Welterbestätten und jedes hat seine eigene Attraktion und besonderen Platz in der menschlichen Geschichte.

NATURE AND CULTURE WORLD HERITAGE SITES IN GERMANY

What is WORLD HERITAGE? UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) awards annually the title "World Heritage" to monuments, buildings or landscapes, which have great cultural meaning and are well preserved. Only the best examples of architectural-and artistic masterpieces, cultural landscapes, parks and other examples of social and technological developments of human-and natural history, can be named to the UNESCO World

Heritage. The Heritage Sites are regularly tested by the UNESCO (started 1945) for condition of the site and also extraordinary interest and achievement, which promotes international co-operation among nations. Besides the Cultural Heritage, there are also Documents-(books, films) and since 2006 the immaterial Culture Heritage (customs and crafts).

Many of Germany's 42 World Heritage Sites are world famous, others are not so well known. All Sites have one thing in common: they are examples of the cultural development of Germany, which goes back 2000 years. In 790 the oldest cathedral in Aachen (Aix-de-la Chapelle), was built, where Charlemagne was crowned as

Emperor of the Holy Roman Empire in the year of 800, and Emperor Barbarossa (red beard) donated the giant, impressive chandelier to the Cathedral. Also known worldwide is the Cologne Cathedral, largest, gothic church in North Europe, which was started on 1164. Through fire, wars and

abuse during the French Revolution, which used the church as a stall and storage for hay, the cathedral was not finished until 1880. In the church a gold shrine contains the remains of the Three Kings, which were shipped in 1164 to Cologne from Milan. A modern time excavation under the Cathedral discovered finds of two persons, who lived decades before the building of the Cathedral. Scientists are now working with results of modern technology, which shows that they are dealing with a woman and a child, who are not related, but apparently have been poisoned. A real detective story in the Cathedral!

Trier, Germany's oldest city, was founded by the Romans, about 2000 years ago. The Porta Nigra, the city gate, (ca. 180 C.E.), the amphitheater and a thermal bath are now World Heritage Sites. The Limes, the border between the Roman Empire and German Tribes, also received the title from UNESCO. Its length, 353 miles, stretched from the North Sea to Regensburg on the Danube, and the border had 60 fortresses and 900 watch towers. The Mine Zollverein

was a mine from 1851-1986, the largest hard coal mine in the world, but today it is an Industrial Monument and a tourist magnet with pool and restaurant. It is located in Essen, in the Ruhr area, which is known for its mining and steel industry. Even a factory belongs to the selected World Sites: In Alfeld, in Lower Saxony, is the Fagus Factory (1922), an early example of modern architecture by Walter Gropius (1883-1969). The factory produced shoe lasts. Also, the Pile Dwellings in the surrounding area of the Alps, especially in Uhldingen on Lake Constance, were taken up into the list of the UNESCO. The Pile Dwellings date back to the Stone-and Bronze Era and can be viewed even today as reconstructed witnesses of the past, due to the faithful work of the Pfahlbauten Museum. Switzerland has thirteen World Heritage Sites, three are Nature- and eight are Culture Heritages. Austria has nine Sites; all are Culture Heritage. Of course, there is much more about these World Heritage Sites and each has its own attraction and its special place in our human history.


