


winter comfort food in the northern German states, the dish includes kale, pinkelwurst, a selection of meats and boiled potatoes.

Die Frankfurter Buchmesse –

Treffpunkt für Buchliebhaber aus aller Welt

Oktober ist der von Bibliophilen in Deutschland und weltweit am meisten erwartete Monat. Sie bereiten sich vor zu reisen, und nein, ihr Ziel ist nicht München, sondern Frankfurt am Main. Mitte Oktober ist Frankfurt fünf Tage der Gastgeber der weltweit größten und wichtigsten Buchmesse, die Frankfurter Buchmesse (FBM). Diese macht Frankfurt zum temporären Zentrum der Buchwelt. Seit 1949 veranstaltet der Börsenverein des Deutschen Buchhandels, eine Organisation mit dem Ziel, die kommerziellen Interessen ihrer Mitglieder zu schützen und die Buchkultur in Deutschland zu fördern, die FBM in ihrer heutigen Form, Allerdings gab es Buchmessen in Frankfurt schon lange vor 1949. Handgeschriebene Bücher wurden auf Frankfurter Messen schon seit dem 12. Jahrhundert gehandelt. Im Jahr 1462, nur wenige Jahre nach der Erfindung des Buchdrucks, wurde eine Messe für gedruckte Bücher in Frankfurt urkundlich erwähnt. Von ihren Anfängen bis ins 17. Jahrhundert war die Buchmesse in Frankfurt die bedeutendste in Europa. Um 1630 übernahm die Leipziger Buchmesse den ersten Platz, nur um ihn nach 1949 wieder an Frankfurt abzugeben. Die FBM 2023 weist erstaunliche Statistiken auf. Der Veranstalter zählte mehr als 200.000 Besucher, darunter 7.000 Pressevertreter, die über die Buchmesse berichteten. Über 100.000 Fachbesucher nutzten die ersten drei Tage, um über 400.000 Messeartikel zu begutachten, die von mehr als 4.000 Ausstellern präsentiert wurden. In den letzten beiden Tagen kamen dann noch zusätzliche 100.000 Buchliebhaber um Bücher kaufen, literarische Lesungen zu besuchen oder ihre Lieblingsautoren zu treffen. Die Bedeutung der FBM geht weit über die Veröffentlichung neuer Bücher oder der Verbreitung von Informationen über die neueste Verlagstechnologie hinaus. Auf der Messe werden Verlagsrechte und Lizenzverträge ausgehandelt, vielversprechende Talente identifiziert und Ideen für neue Proiekte

an Verlage und Multimedia-Unternehmen vorgeschlagen. Die FBM ist nicht nur von grosser wirtschaftlicher Bedeutung für die Verlagsbranche, sondern hat auch einen enormen Einfluss auf Kunst und Kultur. Zahlreiche Ausstellungen, Foren, Vorträge und Workshops erlauben es aufkeimende kulturelle Trends und Themen zu diskutieren und neue Ideen weltweit zu verbreiten. Neben der Rolle als Kulturveranstaltung eignet sich die FBM auch als ideale Bühne für die Verleihung der beiden wichtigsten Preise des Börsenvereins des Deutschen Buchhandels. Zu Beginn der FBM wird der Deutsche Buchpreis an den Autor des besten neuen Romans des Jahres in deutscher Sprache verliehen. Im Jahr 2024 war Martina Hefters Roman "Hey, guten Morgen, wie geht es dir?" der Gewinner des Deutschen Buchpreises. Zum Abschluss der FBM wird der renommierte Internationale Friedenspreis des Börsenvereins des Deutschen Buchhandels an Persönlichkeiten verliehen, die sich durch ihr Wirken in den Bereichen Literatur, Wissenschaft oder Kunst für Frieden und Völkerverständigung eingesetzt haben. Im Jahr 2024 ging dieser Preis an Anne Applebaum, eine US-Journalistin und Historikerin die bereits einen Pulitzer-Preis gewann. Sie wurde für ihre Arbeit zur Analyse autokratischer Systeme in Osteuropa gewürdigt. Ich empfehle es sehr die FBM zu besuchen und die zum Nachdenken anregende Atmosphäre zu erleben und anschließend nach Sachsenhausen zu fahren und ein köstliches Glas "Epplewoi" zu genießen.

The Frankfurter Book Fair – Meeting Point for the World's Bibliophiles


October is the month most anticipated by bibliophiles in Germany and worldwide. They are getting ready for travel, and no, their destination is not in Munich but rather Frankfurt/Main. For 5 days in mid-October, Frankfurt is host of the world's biggest and most important trade show for books, the Frankfurt Book Fair (FBF), making Frankfurt the temporary center of the book universe. Since 1949 the FBF is organized in its current format by the German Publishers

and Booksellers Association, an organization with the goal to protect commercial interests of its members and foster the book culture in Germany. However, book fair events in Frankfurt go back way past 1949. Handwritten books had been traded at Frankfurt's general trade fairs since the 12th century. A trade fair for printed books in Frankfurt had been documented as early as 1462, only a few years after the invention of the printing press. From its beginning up to the 17th century, the book fair in Frankfurt was Europe's most important one. Around 1630, the Leipzig book fair took the number one spot, only to give it back to Frankfurt after 1949. The statistics for the 2023 FBF are astounding. The organizer counted more than 200 thousand visitors, amongst them 7000 press representatives covering the event. Over 100 thousand professional visitors used the first three days to review over 400 thousand items, presented by more than 4000 exhibitors. During the last two days an additional 100 thousand book lovers came to purchase books, attend literary readings or meet their favorite authors. The importance of the FBF goes beyond launching new books or keeping up-to-date with the latest publishing technologies. During the fair publishing rights and licensing deals are negotiated, promising talent is identified and ideas for new projects are proposed to publishing houses and multi-media enterprises. Aside from being of crucial economic importance for the publishing industry, the FBF also has a major impact on arts and culture. Numerous exhibitions, forums, talks and workshops offer an opportunity to discuss emerging cultural trends and topics and disseminate new ideas around the world. In addition to being a cultural event, the FBF is also the ideal stage for the German Publishers and Booksellers Association to hold the award ceremonies for their two most important prizes. At the beginning of the FBF, the German Book Prize is awarded to the author of the year's best new novel written in German. In 2024 Martina Hefter's novel "Hey, Good Morning, How Are You?" was the winner of the German book prize. At the end of the FBF, the prestigious International Peace Price of the German Book Trade is awarded to individuals who promoted peace and international understanding through their work in the fields of literature, science or art. In 2024 this prize was awarded to Anne Applebaum, a US journalist and Pulitzer-prize winning historian for her work on analyzing autocratic systems in eastern Europe. I highly recommend visiting the FBF and experience its thought-provoking atmosphere and afterwards go to Sachsenhausen and experience a delicious glass of "Epplewoi". – Martin Kohler

BRYAN CRANSTON – ACTOR

Bryan Lee Cranston was born in Los Angeles in 1956 to Annalisa Sell and Joseph Cranston. Cranston's father was half Irish, one quarter Austrian Jewish and one quarter German. His mother was the daughter of



German immigrants. Both of Cranston's parents were actors. After struggling in high school, Cranston went to Los Angeles Valley College where he earned an associate degree in police science. Needing an elective to graduate, he took an acting class which inspired him to pursue a career in acting. Cranston began his acting career in local and regional theaters in the San Fernando Valley. To supplement his earnings, he became an ordained minister in the Universal Life Church and performed weddings. He also worked as a security guard, a waiter, a truck loader, and a camera operator for a video dating service. After many years of small parts and advertisements, Cranston was cast in the soap opera Loving, then Raising Miranda, Baywatch, and many other productions. His breakthrough role in 2000 was Hal in Malcolm in the Middle for which he received three Primetime Emmy Award Nominations for his performance. Stardom came in 2008 with Breaking Bad for which Cranston won an Emmy Award for portraying a chemistry teacher with lung cancer who cooks meth to leave his family with enough money after his death. Bryan Cranston has continued to act on television, movies, and Broadway with a legacy of roles earning numerous awards and acclaim to this day. -Barbara Streit
