### 591 Jahre und immer noch Stark – Die Magie des Dresdner Striezelmarkts

Wenn Sie jemals davon geträumt haben, in ein echtes Winterwunderland einzutreten, sind Deutschlands Weihnachtsmärkte das perfekte Ziel, Jedes Jahr in der Adventszeit entstehen festliche Märkte in ganz Europa und darüber hinaus – denken Sie an New York, Bethlehem (PA), Wien, Prag und sogar im DC in Clark. Doch wenn Sie das ultimative Erlebnis suchen, reisen Sie nach Deutschland, dem Land mit fast 3.000 Weihnachtsmärkten, mehr als irgendwo sonst auf der Welt. Doch unter ihnen sticht einer besonders hervor: der Dresdner Striezelmarkt, eine Weihnachtstradition, die bis ins Jahr 1434 zurückreicht. In der Stadt, die oft als "Elbflorenz" bezeichnet wird, ist dies nicht nur ein Markt – es ist ein Stück lebendige Geschichte. Der Striezelmarkt begann als eintägiger Fleischmarkt am Tag vor Heiligabend, damit die Einwohner von Dresden ihren Festtagsbraten kaufen konnten. Um 1500 erhielt der Markt seinen Namen, als örtliche Bäcker begannen, einen besonderen Weihnachtskuchen namens "Striezel" zu verkaufen. Heute ist dieser Kuchen weltweit als Dresdner Stollen bekannt – ein reichhaltiges Früchtebrot voller in Rum getränkter Rosinen, Mandeln und kandierter Zitrusschalen. Aus bescheidenen Anfängen hat sich der Striezelmarkt zu einer vierwöchigen Feier entwickelt, die mehr als zwei Millionen Besucher anzieht und über 200 Händler die alles von traditionellem Kunsthandwerk bis zu kulinarischen Köstlichkeiten anbieten. Besucher können lokale Spezialitäten wie Pulsnitzer Pfeffernüsse, würzige Lebkuchen aus einer nahegelegenen Stadt, und Kräppelchen, kleine Gebäckstücke ähnlich wie Krapfen, probieren. Und nicht zu vergessen, Pflaumentoffel, kleine Figuren aus Backpflaumen die als Dekoration dienen, aber nach Weihnachten essbar sind. Um sich aufzuwärmen, können Erwachsene eine Tasse Striezel-

### 591 Years and Still Going Strong – The Magic of the Dresden Striezelmarkt

ver dreamed of stepping into a real-life winter wonderland? Germany's Christmas markets are the perfect destination. Annually, during Advent season, festive markets pop up across Europe and beyond—think New York, Bethlehem (PA), Vienna, Prague, and even the DC in Clark. For the ultimate experience, head to Germany, the country that hosts nearly 3,000 Christmas markets, more than anywhere else in the world. Among these, one market stands out above the rest: the Dresden Striezelmarkt, a holiday tradition that dates back to 1434. Located in the city often called Florence on the Elbe, this isn't just a market, it's a piece of living history. The Striezelmarkt began as a oneday meat market held the day before Christmas Eve, giving locals a chance to buy their holiday roast. Around 1500, the market earned its name when local bakers started selling a special Christmas cake called Striezel. Today, it's known worldwide as Dresden Stollen, a rich fruit loaf packed with rum-soaked raisins, almonds, and candied citrus peel. From its humble beginnings, the Striezelmarkt has grown into a four-week celebration, attracting over two million visitors and featuring over 200 vendors offering everything from traditional crafts to culinary delights. Visitors can indulge in local specialties such as Pulsnitzer Pfeffernüsse, spiced gingerbread cookies from a nearby town, and Kräppelchen, bite-sized pastries similar to doughnuts and

don't miss the Pflaumentoffel, little figurines made from prunes, a decoration edible after Christmas. To keep warm, adults can enjoy a cup of Striezel Mulled Wine, sweet and aromatic, the ideal companion for chilly nights. Thousands of lights illuminate the Altmarkt Square, creating a festive glow. Stalls overflow with handcrafted treasures from the Ore Mountains, including wooden Christmas pyramids, schwibbogen (arched candleholders), nutcrackers, and incense smokers. Two iconic features dominate the scene: the world's largest schwibbogen at the entrance to the Striezelmarkt and the world's tallest Christmas pyramid, a centerpiece that towers over the square. Beyond shopping and eating, the Striezelmarkt offers plenty of entertainment. Children can enjoy traditional rides and marvel at a giant Advent calendar that doubles as a stage for daily puppet shows. Choir performances and live music fill the air with festive sounds, while craftsmen demonstrate their woodworking skills and bakers prepare Stollen right before your eyes. One of the most spectacular traditions is the "Berg parade", a procession featuring 500 participants dressed in traditional miners' uniforms. The Dresden Striezelmarkt is more than a Christmas market it's a celebration of history, craftsmanship, and holiday spirit. – Martin Kohler

DWIGHT D. EISENHOWER – US PRESIDENT

Dwight David "Ike" Eisenhower was born on October 14, 1890, in Dennison, Texas, and was raised in Abilene, Kansas. His German ancestry dates to 1741



when Hans Eisenhauer and his family emigrated from Karlsbrunn, Germany to Landcaster, PA. Eisenhower was the third of seven sons born to David and Ida. He developed a deep sense of connection to the outdoors and learned about hunting, fishing, cooking, and card playing. In high school he excelled in sports and became interested in military history. Upon graduation, Eisenhower went to West Point which did not require tuition that his family could not provide, even though his deeply religious mother was disappointed. After West Point, Eisenhower was stationed in Texas where he met Mamie Geneva Doud, whom he married in 1916. Following the attack on Pearl Harbor, Eisenhower was called to Washington to work on war plans. He commanded the Allied Forces landing in North Africa in 1942, and in 1944, D-Day, he was the supreme commander of the troops that invaded France. After WWII ended, Eisenhower became president of Columbia University, took over NATO forces, and in 1952 was convinced by Republicans to run for president of the US, an election that he won to become the 34th president of the United States. Some of Eisenhower's accomplishments as president include orchestrating an armistice between North and South Korea, creating the interstate highway system, insured a peaceful integration at Little Rock High School, and decelerated the arms race with the Soviet Union. Honors

for President Eisenhower include the Eisenhower dollar (1971-1978), tribute albums issued by ABC and MGM, the Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial on the Nation Mall, and dozens of awards and decorations from foreign countries. Dwight D. Eisenhower died in Washington, DC on March 28, 1969. —Barbara Streit
