

## THE LIFE AND TIMES OF A TRUSTED COMPANION - XANN

For many DC regulars, Xann was a familiar visitor to the Club with his handler and DC member, Phillip Fruh. Phillip provided the following epitaph on the recent passing of Xann –

It is with great sadness that I have to report that my companion and best friend, Xann, has walked over the rainbow bridge. He was born on May 13th, 2013.



He passed, peaceably, at home, on Aug 5th, 2025, at the age of 12 years, surrounded by family. He brought comfort to us until the very end. He died of a malignant melanoma.

Xann, a black Labrador retriever, was born in Morristown NJ to the Seeing Eye. After his initial training by puppy raisers, and later by Seeing Eye staff, he was entrusted to me on Feb 20th, 2016. His training went well, except for his overly friendly nature. His nickname, assigned by his trainers, was "The Mayor of Morristown" for his habit of trying to meet and greet everyone he met. Nevertheless, he passed the training regimen and was assigned to me!

Once I brought him home, we began to settle into life together. I brought him everywhere with me. He always kept me out of trouble as I have very poor peripheral vision. Of course, when I could, I brought him to the DC for Friday night dinners, Biergartens, and picnics. He even loved the taste of beer. On at least one occasion, he snuck a slurp of the beer I was drinking when I wasn't looking. Oh, Xann, we'll always miss you.

Thanks to the DC and club members who always welcomed Xann. He loved it!




#### RHEINISCHER SÄNGERBUND

#### Hamburg – Eine Stadt wird zum Schwamm

**/**iele haben den Eindruck, dass extreme Wetterereignisse wie Starkregen heute häufiger auftreten als früher. Leider ist dieser Eindruck richtig. Klimaforscher hatten vorausgesagt, dass extreme Tagesniederschläge infolge der globalen Erwärmung häufiger auftreten werden. Tatsächlich zeigen gesammelte Wetterdaten, dass Starkregenereignisse – in der Regel 2,5 cm oder mehr pro Stunde – in den letzten 35 Jahren zugenommen haben. Diese Regenmengen können in dicht besiedelten Gebieten, in denen ein Großteil der bestehenden Infrastruktur die Oberfläche versiegelt und das Versickern des Regenwassers verhindert, große Probleme verursachen und in der Folge das Risiko von Sturzfluten und Überschwemmungen erhöhen, wie sie kürzlich in New Jersey und New York zu beobachten waren. Diese veränderten Wettermuster haben auch das Hochwasserrisiko in den Ballungsräumen Deutschlands erhöht. Mehrere deutsche Großstädte ergreifen derzeit neue Maßnahmen, um die großen Wassermengen zu bewältigen, die durch extreme Regenfälle entstehen. Eine dieser Städte ist Hamburg, Deutschlands zweitgrößte Stadt. Hamburg liegt an der Elbe, die die Stadt mit der Nordsee verbindet. Hamburg war schon immer dem Risiko schwerer Überschwemmungen durch über die Ufer tretende Flüsse oder Sturmfluten ausgesetzt. Diesen Risiken wurde durch den Bau von Deichen, Dämmen und anderen Schutzstrukturen begegnet. Die Stadt ist jedoch weiterhin anfällig für Sturzfluten und Überschwemmungen durch Starkregen. Derzeit wird das Regenwasser über ein speziell konzipiertes Entwässerungssystem und Rückhaltebecken kontrolliert. konventionelle Wassermanagementsystem

ist jedoch großen Wassermengen schnell überlastet und kann Überschwemmungen verursachen. Der Ausbau bestehenden Entwässerungssystems zur Bewältigung größerer



Wassermengen ist ein langwieriger und kostspieliger Prozess. Daher beschloss die Hamburger Wasserbehörde, Hamburg in eine Schwammstadt umzuwandeln. Diese neue, aber bewährte Methode basiert auf der natürlichen Wasserbewirtschaftung: Regenwasser sickert in den Boden, wird dort zurückgehalten und dann wie aus einem Schwamm nach und nach wieder abgegeben. Die Schwammmethode kann das bestehende Entwässerungssystem unterstützen, aber nicht ersetzen. Um Hamburg in eine Schwammstadt zu verwandeln, müssen mehrere Dinge geändert werden. Erstens: Um die Wassermenge zu erhöhen, die in den Boden sickern kann, werden Beton- und Asphaltbeläge von Parkplätzen, Schulhöfen, Gehwegen usw. durch wasserdurchlässige Materialien ersetzt. Bei Neubauprojekten müssen nach Möglichkeit wasserdurchlässige Oberflächenbeläge verwendet werden. Darüber hinaus werden an geeigneten Stellen Zisternen errichtet, um Regenwasser für die spätere Nutzung zu sammeln. Zweitens: Innerhalb des Stadtgebiets werden neue Grünflächen angelegt und herkömmliche Dächer zu Gründächern umgebaut, um die Wasserspeicherkapazität zu erhöhen. Drittens: Regenwasser wird durch Wasserkontrollkanäle, beispielsweise im Boden verlegte Rinnen, von versiegelten Flächen in natürliche oder neu angelegte Feuchtgebiete abgeleitet. Diese Maßnahmen mindern das Hochwasserrisiko, tragen zur Wiederherstellung des Grundwasserspiegels bei und tragen zur natürlichen Wasserreinigung bei. Diese Veränderungen senken auch die Temperatur in Städten während Hitzewellen. Das Risiko künftiger Überschwemmungen zu verringern ist möglich, aber Veränderungen müssen jetzt erfolgen..

#### Hamburg – A City Turns into a Sponge

Many have the impression that extreme weather events, like extreme rainfall, occur now more frequently than in the past. Unfortunately, this impression is correct. Climate Scientists had predicted extreme single-day rainfall events will happen more frequently as a consequence of global warming. Indeed, collected weather data show that severe rain events, in general one inch of rain or more per hour, have increased over the past 35 years. This amount of rain can cause major problems in densely populated areas where a large



portion of the existing infrastructure seals the surface and prevents rainwater from seeping into the ground and as a consequence increases the risk of flash floods and flooding as seen in New Jersey and New York recently. These changes in weather patterns have also increased the risk of floods in the urban areas in Germany. Several large German cities are now implementing new measures for managing the large volumes of water generated by extreme rain events. One of these cities is Hamburg, Germany's second largest city, and is located on the Elbe River, which connects the city to the North Sea. Hamburg has always been at risk of serious flooding from rivers stepping over the banks or storm surges. These risks have been addressed by building levees, dikes and other protective structures. However, the city is still vulnerable to flash floods and flooding caused by heavy rain. Currently, rainwater is managed by a specifically designed drainage system and retention reservoirs. This conventional water management system is easily overwhelmed by large volumes of water causing flooding as a consequence. Expanding the existing drainage system to handle larger volumes of water is a lengthy and costly process. Therefore, Hamburg's water authority decided to transform Hamburg into a Sponge City. This new but proven method is based on the natural method of water management; rainwater seeps into the soil, is retained there and then released bit by bit like from a sponge. The sponge method makes it possible to support but not to replace the current drainage system. To transform Hamburg into a Sponge City several things have to be changed. First, to increase the amount of water that can seep into the soil, concrete and asphalt pavements of parking lots, school yards, sidewalks etc. are replaced with water permeable materials. New construction projects are required to use water permeable surface coverings when possible. In addition, cisterns are built at appropriate sites to collect rainwater for later use. Second, new green spaces are created within the city limits and regular roofs are converted to green roofs to increase the water storage capabilities. Third, rainwater is transported through water control channels, think of gutters in the ground, away from sealed areas to natural or newly constructed wetlands. These measures mitigate the risk of flooding, help to restore ground water levels and to clean water naturally. These changes also lower the temperature in cities during heatwaves. Reducing the risk of future floodings is possible, but changes have to happen now.. - Martin Kohler

WILLIAM M. KRATT SR. — PITCHPIPE AND HARMONICA

William M. Kratt was born in 1892 in Trossingen, Germany. As a young child he apprenticed at the Hohner Harmonica Company. Kratt watched, learned and began to have ideas for changes to the harmonica, a

mouth organ, also known as a French harp or Blues harp. In 1910, Kratt emigrated to America and worked in his aunt's diner in Edison, NJ as a dishwasher. He soon found a job working with Thomas Edison in Menlo Park. There he rose to the position of foreman. Kratt next found employment in a New Brunswick factory that made strings for guitars and violins. In 1918, he returned to Trossingen to start his own harmonica factory, The National Harmonica Company. Hohner, his former employer, didn't want competition, so Kratt was bought out. With the money from Hohner, Kratt returned to America in 1925 and founded Wm. Kratt Company on Johnson Place in Union, NJ. Here Kratt invented the first pitchpipe with a C-to-C white note scale. He then developed the chromatic 13-note pipe that is still

manufactured today. Millions of pitchpipes were produced and could be



found tuning singers and musicians from kindergarteners to professionals. Kratt went on to invent his own style of harmonicas which were produced as a defense contract for servicemen during WWII to boost morale. The company made plastic harmonicas after the war but focused mainly on pitchpipe which are still in production today. William Kratt died in 1983. His family kept the factory until it was sold in 2001. The Kratt brothers, Martin and Chris of PBS Tv's Wild Kratts and other television series are grandsons of William M. Kratt Sr. — Barbara Streit
