### BLOOD DRIVE



Roswitha and I would like to thank everybody that donated to the Deutscher Club's recent Blood Drive on **Saturday March 22nd.** The New York New Jersey Blood Center (NYBC) did a fantastic job servicing our donors. The average time for a donor was 45 minutes for processing and donating. Afterwards, many donors met other donors for coffee, donuts or a light German brunch provided by the Deutscher Club. Donors had plenty of time to sit, relax and enjoy the fellowship.

Blood supplies are in huge demand. Donating blood is a lifesaving gift for others. Corporate blood drives have not returned to their collection rates since COVID. Many offices remain at reduced levels; severely affecting the supply in one of the most densely populated areas of the country.

It takes 250 blood donations every day to meet the needs of all the patients in the hospitals serviced by the New York New Jersey Blood Services. One out of every three people will need blood at some time in their life. You never know when you or someone you love will be the one.

If you are over 75 years, the NYBC requires a doctor's note to donate. Plan now to call or visit your doctor.

# Deutsche Ecke

#### Die Deutsche Märchenstraße – 50 Jahre Wunder

Cicherlich Sicherlich haben die meisten Mitglieder des Deutschen Clubs von den Märchen der Brüder Grimm gehört. Viele erinnern sich vielleicht an bestimmte Märchen die ihnen als Kind vorgelesen wurden oder die sie selbst ihren Kindern vorgelesen haben. Selbst jene die noch nie von den Brüder Grimm gehört haben, kennen einige ihrer bekanntesten Märchen. Disnev hat unter anderem für Zeichentrickfilme wie Cinderella, Snow White und Sleeping Beauty die Grimm Märchen Aschenputtel, Schneewittchen und Dornröschen als Vorlage benutzt. Um interessierten Menschen die Brüder Grimm und ihre Märchen näher zu bringen wurde vor 50 Jahren der Verband "Deutsche Märchenstrasse", gegründet. Das Ziel war durch eine 600 km lange Reiseroute über 60 Gemeinden zu verbinden. Diese Gemeinden sind von besonderer Bedeutung für das Leben und Wirken der Brüder Grimm oder für ihre Märchen, Sagen und Legenden. Beginnend in Hanau am Main, dem Geburtsort der Brüder Grimm führt die Strasse bis zur Hansestadt Bremen, dem Schauplatz des Grimm Märchens "Die Bremer Stadtmusikanten". Für Naturfreunde gibt es entlang der Strecke 8 Natur- und Geoparks, so kann die eindrucksvolle Vielfalt der Landschaften zwischen Hanau und Bremen durch Wanderungen erkundet werden. Für Liebhaber von Geschichte und Geschichten gibt es zahlreiche historische Städte, Museen und Veranstaltungen welche das Leben der Brüder Grimm und ihrer Märchen eindrucksvoll zum Leben bringen. In Hanau, dem Beginn der Märchenstrasse befindet sich im sehenswerten Schloss Philippsruhe ein Geschichtsmuseum das einen Teil seiner Ausstellung dem Leben der Brüder Grimm widmet. Ausserdem finden in Hanau von Mai bis Juli die Märchenfestspiele statt. Auf einer Freilichtbühne werden auserwählte Grimm Märchen als Schauspiel vorgeführt. Weiter geht es nach Steinau an der Strasse, ein kleiner Ort in

dem die Brüder Grimm einen Teil ihrer Jugend verbrachten. Im ehemaligen Haus der Familie Grimm wurde ein Museum eingerichtet das Kindern und Erwachsenen das Vermächtnis der Brüder Grimm auf eine sinnliche Art und Weise nahebringt. In Marburg, eine historische Universitätsstadt, absolvierten die Brüder Grimm ihr Studium. Während dieser Zeit wurde ihr Interesse für historischen Erzählungen geweckt. Zur Erinnerung wurde ein "Grimm dich Pfad" (anstatt Trim Dich Pfad) eingerichtet. Dieser führt durch die engen Gassen der Marburger Altstadt und alle die den Pfad begehen müssen mithelfen die zahlreichen versteckten Figuren aus den Grimm Märchen zu entdecken. Kassel ist vielleicht die wichtigste Stadt für das Werk der Brüder Grimm. Nach ihrem Studium fanden beide Brüder Arbeit an der Bibliothek des Hessischen Kurfürsten. Ihre Tätigkeit dort erlaubte es ihnen mündlich überlieferte Märchen und Legenden zu sammeln und niederzuschreiben. In der Kasseler Grimmwelt, dem wohl umfangreichste Museum zum Werk der Brüder Grimm kann man die Handgeschriebenen Originale ihrer beiden Märchenbücher besichtigen. Nicht vergessen sollte man den Bergpark Willhelmshöhe zu besuchen, er ist ein UNESCO Weltkultur Erbe. Hofgeismar ist ein weiterer bemerkenswerter Ort. Das dortige Schloss Sababurg gilt als Inspiration für das Dornröschen Schloss. Im August wird dort im Schlosspark eine grosse Feier zum Anlass des 50-jährigen Jubiläums der Märchenstrasse stattfinden. ### The German Fairy Tale Route – 50 Years of Wonder

Most members of the German Club have certainly heard of the Brothers Grimm fairy tales. Many may remember certain fairy tales that were read to them as children, or that they themselves read to their children. Even those who have never heard of the Brothers Grimm know some of




their most well-known fairy tales. Disney used the Grimm fairy tales Aschenputtel, Schneewittchen, and Dornröschen as the basis for animated films such as Cinderella, Snow White, and Sleeping Beauty. The "German Fairy Tale Route" association was founded 50 years ago to introduce the Brothers Grimm and their fairy tales via 60 communities along a 600-kilometer route. These communities are of particular importance to the lives and work of the Brothers Grimm or to their fairy tales, myths, and legends. Starting in Hanau am Main, the birthplace of the Brothers Grimm, the road leads to the Hanseatic city of Bremen, the setting of the Grimm fairy tale "The Bremen Town Musicians". For nature lovers, there are eight nature and geoparks along the route, to hike and explore the impressive landscapes between Hanau and Bremen. For history and storytelling enthusiasts, there are numerous historic towns, museums, and events that vividly bring the lives of the Brothers Grimm and their fairy tales to life. In Hanau, at the start of the Fairy Tale Route, the impressive Philippsruhe Palace houses a history museum with a section dedicated to the lives of the Brothers Grimm. The Fairy Tale Festival also takes place in Hanau from May to July. Selected Grimm fairy tales are presented as a play on an open-air stage. We continue to Steinau an der Strasse, a small town where the Brothers Grimm spent part of their youth. A museum is housed in the former Grimm family home, bringing the legacy of the Brothers Grimm to life for children and adults with a sensory experience. The Brothers Grimm completed their studies in Marburg, a historic university town. A "Grimm You Trail" (instead of Trim-Dich-Pfad (fitness trail)) leads through the narrow streets of Marburg's old town, and all those who follow it must help find the numerous hidden characters from the Grimm fairy tales. Kassel is perhaps the most important city for the work of the Brothers Grimm. After completing their studies, both brothers found work at the library of the Hessian Prince Elector. Their work there allowed them to collect and record orally recited fairy tales and legends. In the Kassel Grimmwelt, arguably the most comprehensive museum dedicated to the work of the Brothers Grimm, you can view the handwritten originals of their two fairy tale books. Don't forget to visit the Bergpark (Mountainpark) Wilhelmshöhe, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Sababurg Castle in Hofgeismar is considered the inspiration for the Sleeping Beauty's castle. In August, a grand celebration will be held on the castle grounds to mark the 50th anniversary of the Fairy Tale Route. # KURT MASUR – CONDUCTOR

Kurt Masur was born in Brieg, Germany (now Brzeg, Poland) in 1927. His father, an electrical engineer, helped Kurt with his




electrician's apprenticeship. From age 10-16 he also took piano lessons. In 1944, Masur was drafted into the paratroopers and was fortunate to survive. After the war, he studied conducting, composition and piano at the University of Music and Theatre in Leipzig. He continued his musical path by conducting in regional East German opera houses. He joined the Dresden Philharmonic, then worked in Mecklenburg, Berlin, and Leipzig. In 1991, Masur became the music director of the New York Philharmonic to rave reviews. In 2001, in the aftermath of the September 11th terror attack in NYC, he directed the Philharmonic in a performance of Brahm's Ein Deutsches Requiem. After his time in New York,

Masur then became conductor of the London Philharmonic Orchestra and the Orchestre National de France. He also held the position of an Honorary Guest Conductor of the Israel Philharmonic Orchestra. Masur received the National Prize from East Germany which he supported throughout 1989, until the arrest of a street musician in Leipzig. Masur was active in negotiating confrontations

with security forces and protestors, which led to the fall of the Berlin Wall. Honors and awards continued from the French, Polish, and German countries up until his death in 2015 from Parkinson's Disease. In 2018, which would have been his 91st birthday, Google featured him in a Google Doodle in the United States, Germany, Belarus, Iceland, and Japan.


