Backsplash Care Guide

Congrats on your recent Backsplash installation, below are some care guide topics to follow in order to maintain the integrity of your new backsplash.

Maintaining a Tile Backsplash

- In a bucket, mix white vinegar and hot water in a one to one ratio, then using a soft cloth, wipe the tile down with this mixture.
- Try to get in between tiles to the grout as much as possible. If there are tough stains that are left behind, make a paste with baking soda and water.
- Use a small soft brush to scrub the stains. It is completely safe to use the small soft brush to get inside any indentations in the tile or to scrub in between the tiles on the grout. Rinse the tile completely with clean water and a soft cloth. Use a clean microfiber cloth to dry the tile to avoid water spots.

Maintaining a Stone Backsplash

- Wipe down the stone with a soft, damp cloth.
- Using a mixture of 4 cups of water with 5 drops of liquid dish soap, wipe down the stone liberally.
- Make sure to scrub any strains and soils. Rinse the stone with warm water and polish with a dry, clean cloth. This will restore the shine and luster to your stone backsplash.
- Seal every 12 to 18 months

Maintaining a Glass Backsplash

- In a bucket, mix White Vinegar and Hot Water in a one to one ratio, wipe down the glass with a soft cloth and rinse well.
- You can use a clean cloth and glass cleaner to shine the backsplash. For tough soils, you can use a small soft brush to spot treat any areas.
- It is important to clean your backsplash regularly to avoid mold and mildew build up. Also, consider using a grout a sealer to enhance the life of the grout. Take a small soft brush and clean crevices with appropriate solution on a regular basis.
