Repeal of Right-to-Work Reverses Progress of Michigan's Economic Competitiveness

Last week, the Michigan Senate passed bills undermining Michigan's ability to successfully transition its economy at the speed of technological change. To compete for future investment with other states and nations, Michigan must create an environment that is attractive for investment. The Senate's action, passed on a straight party-line vote, repeals Michigan's decade-long Right-to-Work policy and reverses Michigan's attractiveness for new jobs and economic growth.

As an organization we have tirelessly advocated for a business-friendly environment and, since December 2021, Michigan's aggressive efforts to draw new transformational investment successfully attracted \$17 billion in new private capital investment that will create 15,500 new jobs. Now, eliminating Right-to-Work will undermine future attraction efforts as companies compare other states and nations to make their investments. We will join 22 other states without Right-to-Work that are also losing the competition to bring in new jobs, technology and talented workers. Our aggressive and successful incentive efforts will be neutralized going forward as Michigan moves down the list of states considered for new investment.

MMA will continue to call on policymakers to communicate clearly to manufacturing investors, both existing manufacturing companies and those outside Michigan, that Michigan is open for business and that we have the right skilled workforce to make their investments successful in the face of global competition. Repealing Right-to-Work moves Michigan in the wrong direction.

GLBMA leads an Industry Led Collaborative with Midland Business Alliance and Saginaw Future

New this year, the training can take place up to one year once the award is announced. This will allow more time to schedule and complete the training. Additional applications are accepted until all monies have been expended.

The GLBMA will lead the ILC in partnership with the Midland Business Alliance and Saginaw Future. We are working on putting our ILC together now and want to share our timeline with you and hope that you can join in our ILC.

Now until March 31 - Survey for class needs (See survey link below.)

April 3 - April 14 - Determine class needs and communicate to companies, write narrative for the ILC and each training.

April 17 to May 5 - Gather commitments and submit application to MI Works Great Lakes Bay Region office

The GLBMA will act as the lead and prepare the bulk of the application for submission. For any training to be approved, at least three companies must sign up and complete the training.

You can receive up to \$2,000 per participant in training funds awarded through this grant. A one-to-one match is required which can include wages, benefits, travel, and production interruption costs. If you are able to host a training at your facility for the ILC, you will be able to include the cost of hosting as part of your match amount.

Each company will need to complete the individual application with the ILC narrative and submit it to the MI Works Great Lakes Bay Regional office contact as directed later in the process.

The GLBMA will work on coordinating the training locations, date, and times for all participating businesses.
