#### Yeo & Yeo Technology Shares Microsoft Upates

Starting January 2025, Microsoft will begin automatically switching users of classic Outlook to the new version. This change will primarily impact Microsoft 365 Business Standard and Premium users, with updates for Enterprise users planned for April 2026.

Key points to note:

- The switch will occur gradually over several months, beginning in January 2025.
- Users will receive in-app notifications before the automatic switch.
- IT Admins can opt out of the automatic switch if not ready for the transition. Instructions for opting out are available <u>here</u>.
- After the switch, users can still toggle back to classic Outlook if needed, but they
  might automatically be switched to the new Outlook again with a future rollout.
  Instructions to toggle back are available <u>here</u>.
- Microsoft will support existing installations of classic Outlook through perpetual licenses until at least 2029.

We recommend familiarizing yourself with the new Outlook features, including the new interface and productivity tools, and preparing your team for this transition. #### Grant Funding available for Small Business Works Protection

Small businesses in Michigan with 250 employees or fewer can now apply for a Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA) matching grant up to \$5,000 to purchase equipment and associated training needed to improve the safety and health of their employees.

The MIOSHA Workplace Improvement to Safety and Health (MIWISH) grant program offers a dollar-for-dollar match, up to \$5,000, for qualifying employers to purchase safety and health-related equipment.

#### Need to know - Updates for 2025

#### R&D Tax Credit Signed into Law

MMA driven legislation to establish a state-based Research & Development (R&D) Tax Credit was signed into law this week by Governor Gretchen Whitmer (along with MMA's Mike Johnston, pictured far left, and John Walsh, far right, with the Governor and Lt. Governor Garlin Gilchrist II). Innovation is the key to growth for manufacturing, the state's largest and most critical sector and MMA has fought for decades to achieve this credit, which increases our competitiveness and will attract new jobs and investment opportunities to Michigan.

#### Earned Sick

The House Select Committee on Protecting Michigan Employees and Small Businesses unanimously approved House Bill 4002 (Representative Jay DeBoyer, R-Clay), to make critical changes to the Earned Sick Time Act (ESTA) which is set to subject Michigan employers to the most costly, onerous, and litigious paid leave mandate in the nation on 2/21/25.

<u>Urge your legislators to support House Bill 4002 and to move this bill before</u> <u>it's too late.</u>
