STEAM Ahead - 2025 Program Updates

What an exciting time it has been in the world of STEAM Ahead! With your support in sharing the program with your colleagues and networks, we are proud to say that we had hit record high numbers for the program. We appreciate your help in spreading the word about the program to those who it can help the most – students and Michigan's growing businesses. Since Summer 2023, STEAM Ahead has approved 1600+ interns with 279 companies of all sizes (70% are small-sized businesses) in 100+ locations across the state. While the program has always operated as first-come, first-serve, the burst of applications has presented a unique set of challenges in administering the program that we've never had before.

Looking forward, to be able to support as many businesses as possible – particularly small-to-medium size businesses - within Michigan as we can with this program, we will be instituting a cap on the number of interns an employer can submit to us for each semester and a total cap of approvals for the semester. Per usual, the number of awards approved will depend on fund availability (and whether the intern/internships qualify) – the same will be true of the total semester cap. Ahead of each semester, we will announce the total cap as early as possible to ensure participating and interested employers are able to plan accordingly for upcoming and future semesters.

GOOD NEWS: This update does not mean that we cannot accommodate new companies from participating in the program, in fact, we hope this will allow us to share this opportunity with more companies in future semesters. Companies can review the program's Employer Handbook and then submit a one-time Company application and Certification Form if they are interested in joining the program: https://forms.office.com/g/XnZRxSMa9W. Navigating Michigan's Minimum Wage Law and Earned Sick Time Act

On February 21, Governor Whitmer signed House Bill 4002 (HB 4002), amending the Earned Sick Time Act (ESTA), and Senate Bill 8, amending Michigan's Improved Workforce Opportunity Wage Act (IWOWA). For businesses and organizations, this ruling still necessitates substantial adjustments in payroll, budgeting, and human resources policies to comply with the new standards. Michigan Introduces New R&D Tax Credit

In a significant move to bolster Michigan's innovation landscape, Governor Gretchen Whitmer signed into law a series of bipartisan bills on January 13, 2025, introducing the Michigan Innovation Fund and a Research and Development (R&D) Tax Credit. The most widely applicable of these bills are House Bills 5100 (Public Act 186 of 2024) and 5101 (Public Act 187 of 2024), re-establishing a Michigan R&D tax credit. This initiative is designed to foster innovation, stimulate job growth, help leverage Michigan universities, and reinforce Michigan's position as a leader in technological advancement.

R&D Tax Credits: A New Incentive for Innovation

The newly introduced R&D tax credits are set to take effect for tax years beginning on or after January 1, 2025. These credits are structured to provide substantial financial incentives for corporate and flow through businesses engaging in research and development activities within the state. Earned Sick Time Act Fix Signed into Law

On Friday, 2/21/25, legislation was signed into law to address many of the most challenging issues of the Earned Sick Time Act (ESTA). Public Act 2 of 2025 makes a number of beneficial amendments to the earned sick time mandate and establishes a different requirement for small businesses.

Corporate Income Tax Increase Punishes Small Business

MMA is sounding an alarm over legislation introduced in the Michigan House of Representatives which would increase business taxes by over 41 percent. House Bill 4144 (Representative Alabas Farhat, D-Dearborn) would increase the Corporate Income Tax from 6 percent to 8.5 percent, which would increase business taxes by an estimated \$850 million.

The bill aligns with calls made by Governor Gretchen Whitmer during her seventh State of the State address. She suggested that any new funding solution would require a mix of budget cuts and revenue increases and pointed to the business community as a potential source of additional revenue.
