

INTRODUCTION



"Georgian Infusion" features more than two dozen storylines that provide a diverse glimpse into the rich cultural heritage of Georgia. The exhibition will display authentic artifacts and craftsmanship from the early centuries and Middle Ages till the XX century, and showcase costumes, photographs, paintings, and sketches that capture the essence of historical Georgian art de vivre and its artistic interpretations.

A distinct exhibition section will unveil the ABC of Georgian costume across the ages, displaying authentic garments, accessories, and textiles. The objective is not to delve into each element's detailed evolution, symbolism, and cultural significance. Instead, viewers are encouraged to develop their visual understanding and cultivate the ability to distinguish and recognize presented images in entirely different contexts.

PURPOSES







Khevsur costume, Beginning of XX century












Patron club is an online-platform to support and patron the upcoming exhibition by funding loans and making impact on the exhibition progress.


A special web-page created, where progress of loans funding is visible. A person can either fund a whole piece or its part.
