Use <u>evidence</u> or your own words; use substantial evidence

Relevant to the question? Yes or no? Sure? Double-check



State a <u>point</u> about how language is used using terminology

Use a substantial piece of evidence

Explain and analyse the <u>effects</u> created by the writer's methods

Go back into your evidence and discuss language

Agree with the <u>statement's</u> Key Word, giving a reason

Use <u>evidence</u> to show why the statement is valid

Infer. Why would some feel this way? Is there another reason?

Zoom in on the technique. How is It effective?

Extend. Why might we disagree with the statement?



Use <u>interesting vocabulary</u>, including more complex devices

Metaphors, similes and personification will bring your words to life.

Adjectives and adverbs add detail and atmosphere to your work

Describe scenes <u>in general and in</u> detail

Include characters'
emotions

Senses; show, don't tell



What is the authors' <u>view</u>?

Infer: why do they think this way, what are they concerned about?


Include <u>evidence</u>; which method is used to demonstrate the view?

Use 'because' to explain why the effect is created for a reader

### What was the writer's intention?

EXT Explain what the writer was trying to do; what did they want readers to think or feel?

### 5 What is the overall effect?

Find another piece of evidence that reinforces your idea. Explain why.

**EXT** Use key words from the question to focus your response



Respect

Comment on the strengths of a peer; give reasons why

2 Responsibility

Focus on the demands of the question; link back to key words

3 Reflection

Explain how your planning or model answers helped to shape your response

Resourcefulness

Use a dictionary, thesaurus or word bank to improve your vocabulary

**5** Resilience

Develop your ideas with multiple reasons; explain it in detail

6 Risk-taking

Give an alternative idea; give reasons why others might agree



Key words and ideas

What key word or idea from last lesson was most important? Why? Give examples.

2 Make predictions

What does the <u>title</u> or <u>objective</u> suggest about what might happen this lesson? Why?

3 Reflect on your progress

What would you change or do differently from last lesson to help you make progress?

4 Goals and targets

What is your next step in making progress? How will you achieve it?

5 Focus and organisation

What helpful resources are in the right place to support you? Can this improve?

6 Demonstrate the 6Rs

Which R will you demonstrate this lesson? How will you do it?



### Proofread for technical accuracy

EXT Check that you have not made any minor errors; does it make sense?

### 2 Use another language device

Use an IMAGES or PERSUADES device to influence your reader

#### 3 Expand your vocabulary

Use sensory words to help readers visualise or emotive words to make them feel

# Open your sentences dramatically

Use prepositions, present (-ing) or past (-ed) participles or adverbs (-ly) to begin

### 5 Begin and end effectively

EXT Link your ending back to your opening by echoing or contrasting key ideas
