Commemoration of the Holy Fathers of
The Seventh Ecumenical Council - 787 AD:

The seventh Ecumenical Council, the second Council of Nicaea, was the last recognized by the Orthodox Church.

It ended almost fifty years of iconoclast persecution and established the veneration of the holy icons as basic to the belief and spirituality of Christ's Church.

It was not simply the veneration of the holy images that the fathers defended, but the reality of the Incarnation of the Son of God. It closed the era of the great dogmatic disputes which enabled the Church to describe the bounds of the holy Orthodox Faith.

Nominalization: Making a Noun or a Verb?

The dynamic of naming processes, making nouns out of verbs, in essence "thing-ifying" actions is called "nominalization" and it is now more evident than ever in the world. In the book "God is a Verb", Rabbi David Cooper makes the argument that the divine supernatural existence called "God", is best thought of not as a thing but rather as a process. The rabbi suggests that rather than thinking about what is referred to as God as being some kind of "person" who lives in clouds, it might be more accurate to contemplate it as a movement or action, flowing through everything in the cosmos, from the smallest subatomic quanta to the largest galaxies.
