### Cross Elevation

Feast Day of the Elevation of the Cross, coming so close to church New Years, reminds us the cross' central role to our lives as Christians throughout the year.

We admire the persistence of St. Helen, mother of Emperor Constantine, who despite her age traveled through the holy land, establishing churches in places that had special meaning in the life of Christ, one of the most important of these being the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, erected in Golgotha, outside the city walls of Jerusalem. There Helen had workers excavate beneath the old temple of Venus to uncover the tomb of the lord. Not far from it were three crosses, along with a board with the inscription ordered by Pilate, with four nails on it.

In order to discern the cross of the savior from that of the two thieves who were crucified with him, the Bishop of Jerusalem Macarius alternately touched the crosses to a corpse. When the cross of the lord touched the dead one, he came to life. Having beheld the raising of the dead man unanimously convinced everyone that the life-giving cross was found.

The icon of the feast shows the church, standing in the midst of the city of Jerusalem. The cross is central to the icon, with St. Helen and Emperor Constantine standing on either side, both with crowns. Saint Macarius is shown elevating the cross for believers to venerate. These figures are joined by a group that includes bishops, priests, monastics, and people who live in the city. The epistle (I Corinthians - 1:18) for Cross Elevation day states, "For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God." The Kontakion for that day proclaims, "As you were voluntarily raised upon the cross for our sake, grant mercy to those who are called by your name, O Christ God. Make all Orthodox Christians glad by your power, granting them victories over their adversaries, by bestowing on them the invincible trophy, your weapon of peace."
