The Holy Apostle Luke:

The Holy Disciple and Evangelist Luke was a native of Syrian Antioch, a disciple from amongst the Seventy, a companion of the holy Apostle Paul, and physician enlightened in the Greek medicinal arts.

Hearing about Christ, Luke arrived in Palestine, where he accepted the preaching of salvation from the Lord himself. He was sent by the Lord with the Disciples of the Seventy for the first preaching about the Kingdom of Heaven.

After the resurrection the Lord, Jesus Christ appeared to Saints Luke and Cleopas on the road to Emmaus. After that he joined the missionary journey of the Apostle Paul, continuing in loyalty to him, even after all his co-workers left him. Tradition ascribes Luke to writing the first icons of the Mother of God, and those of the Apostles Peter and Paul. In Rome, in the years 62-63 AD, Saint Luke wrote his own gospel, under the guidance of Apostle Paul, and also his book on the Acts of the Apostles. The Acts speak about the works and effects of the apostles after the Ascension of the Savior, of the distancing of Christianity from Judaism, and its independent dispersion into the world, up unto the Second Coming of Christ.
