### The Venerable Anthony the Great (251 - 356):

Our venerable and God-bearing Father Saint Anthony the Great was born into a wealthy, pious family in upper Egypt around 251 AD. When St. Anthony was about twenty years old he lost his parents, with a younger sister left in his care. Then he heard the Gospel Mt. 19-21, which stated, "If you would be perfect go sell what you possess and give it to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven, and come follow Me." So, St. Anthony sold the property he inherited, distributed the money to the poor, put his sister in a convent, and left for the desert to begin his ascetical life in a hut, working with his hands to obtain a livelihood and also alms for the poor.

During this period of his life St. Anthony endured terrible temptations. Troubled with thoughts of his former life, doubts about his chosen path, concern for his sister, and carnal feelings, he mediated on Christ to thwart these leanings, and tried a stricter way of life. He partook of food only after sunset, and spent all night praying until dawn. Soon he slept only every third day. He eventually sought even greater solitude, moving farther away from the village, into a graveyard.

St. Anthony spent twenty years in complete isolation and constant struggle with the demons, before achieving calm. On occasion he left the desert for Alexandria, to minister to those martyred in prison, and to defend the Orthodox faith against the Arian heresies. He converted multitudes of pagans to Christ, wrote twenty sermons and seven letters on the monastic virtues. He was spoken of everywhere, and was admired by everyone, and finally died peacefully in the year 356 at age 105, and was buried in the desert by his disciples. His story, written by St. Athanasius of Alexandria, was the first biography of a saint who was not a martyr.
