# Fourth Sunday of Pascha - The Paralytic

Close to the Sheep's Gate in Jerusalem was a pool called the Sheep's Pool. It had five porches - five sets of pillars supporting a domed roof. Under this roof lay many sick people with various maladies, awaiting the moving of the water. The first person to step in after the troubling of the water was healed immediately of whatever malady he had. It was there that the paralytic of today's Gospel was lying, tormented by his infirmity of thirty-eight years.

When Jesus saw him lying there, knowing he had been in that condition a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be made well?"

The weak man replied, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up. And while I am coming, another steps down before me."

Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed, and walk." And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked.

Now that day was the Sabbath. The Jews therefore ridiculed it was not lawful to do any work on that day, carry any beds, or perform any miracles. The man explained, "He who made me well said to me, 'Take up your bed and walk.' "

When they asked him who this man was who said to him, "Take up your bed and walk," he didn't know, for Jesus had withdrawn into the crowd.

Afterwards Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you have been made well. Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you." The man departed and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had made him well.
