Ninth Sunday After Pentecost:

Covid-19 Church Reopening (GREEN)

Church is open under Green rules. Special precautions are being taken; entry and exit through main doors only, **side door from the ramp will be locked**, masks will be required, hand sanitizing will be required, gloves will be available, parishioners must sign - in, everyone's temperature will be checked, seating will be spaced apart (families may sit together), veneration of Holy objects will be performed by bowing and making the sign of the cross (no kissing), there will be no grouped choir, **paper bulletins will be available on the Tetrapod for you to pick up**, the collection basket will be placed on the Tetrapod for donations, children under 10 are not to receive Communion, the church hall is closed, no coffee hour after Liturgy, and confessions will be taken by appointment on Saturdays (only one person in church at a time). It is recommended that anyone over the age of 65, or those with underlying medical conditions stay home for their own safety, however, no one will be turned away. The church will be thoroughly disinfected between services.
